Introduction

- Justice N.K. Jain



They inspired me to write :- I have no words to express my sincere gratitude to the adviser M.L. Dhonkariya of Samachar Vichar Sansthan and associates Dr. Chandrika Prasad, Kamal Raj Singhvi (Retired District Judges), J.K. Singhi, Sr. Advocate, Jinesh Jain and Gaurav Jain, Advocates and Ravindra Baj who have decided to publish the glimpses of my life along with some intimate photographs. I am aware of the fact that one should not live in past i.e.on old days memories nor he should dream too much beyond his capabilities for future. One should always live in present. He should always discharge his duties with all sincerity. But I have been asked to narrate the real and true facts of my early life. Therefore I am narrating some facts & names of distinguished and eminent personalities as per my memory, whose qualities I appreciated, admired and cherished for one reason or the other and I have learnt a lot from them in my life.

Before I narrate, I may humbly say that for over last one decade my cousins Mitrasen and Dr.T.P. Jain had been insisting upon to write autobiography for various reasons since, I have worked in different streams. I have vast experience in different spheres of life. I am well aware of the ground realities including anecdotes of my life, but I was reluctant initially as I found there was nothing special. Of course, I have been fully satisfied with my work and journey of life.

Last year, Mr. M.L. Dhonkariya inspired me to publish a souvenir in memory of my father, late Justice J.P. Jain in his centenary year, which was blessed by Aacharya Vidhyanand ji Muniraj and containing forward and good wishes by Justice M.N. Venkatachaliach (Former Chief Justice of India, Padam Vibhushan Awardee) Justice Dalbir Bhandari (Judge International Court of Justice & recipient of Padam Bhushan), Justice T.S. Thakur (Former Chief Justice of India) and galaxy of celebrities from bar and bench, including family members who also penned down their thoughts about him. I also express my sincere gratitude to the eminent persons who released this souvenir on 26.11.2017. I along with my family is grateful for the contribution of all these excellent personalities.

We have also published a book "Remembrance" to pay tribute to my beloved wife Smt. Aruna Jain, who passed away on 11.1.2017. Distinguished Judges, Lokayuktas of Karnataka and Rajasthan and other renowned personalities, friends and family members contributed their reminiscences about her. This book was released by Acharya Shri Vidyanand Ji Muniraj and Acharya Shri Shrutsagar Ji Muni in New Delhi on 1.5.2018.

In the above background & perspective as per persuasion of Shri M.L.Dhonkariya of Samachar Vichar Sansthan and its Associates, I feel honoured by their suggestion and agreed with their proposal. For this reason, the book containing various events of my life is being published.

School Life in Alwar :- I was born in a Jain family of Smt. Pushpa Jain and Shri J. P. Jain, Advocate on the auspicious day of Diwali in year 1942 at Beech ka Mohalla, Alwar. Jain Dharm is known for Sanyam, Tyag, Aprigrah, Satya-Ahinsa for Atma Chintan & Kalyan and for learning good things from others. Being Jain, I inherited all the above mentioned qualities, genetically in my life.

I may quite honestly mention, that all along my life I have been a keen learner and I owe a great debt of gratitude to all from my home. I have learnt something or the other which has become a precious possession in my memory. My learning instinct has helped me to learn a lot about the games. I have treated my life as a game which has helped me a lot to get success in my life. I have been fortunate to meet those persons, whom I always liked and admired.

I studied in Happy School upto 4th class. I have childhood memories of my teacher Chunni Lal Ji and Sangeet Teacher Gyarsi Lal Ji and Classmate Palawat, Kanti Babu, Gyan, Prakash Jain and few others. It was in my discipline and habit to visit Digamber Jain Shri Neminath temple, in Bech Ka Mohalla and on shifting to Hope Circus to play at Burj and also have darshan of Lord Shiva. We shifted to Jaipur on establishment of Rajasthan High Court Bench at Jaipur in the year 1949-50.

In my childhood I used to hear stories from my grand mother. She continued her story until I responded "Hu or Ha" but used to sleep while hearing the story, this annoyed her a lot but on my answering she continued her story. My mother encouraged me to read child literature Chanda Mama, Sarita and other books containing patriotic stories of Veer Balak-Balika published by Geeta Press.

Schooling in Jaipur at Mahaveer School :- Initially we lived in the house of Khemchand Ji Jain at Haldiyan ka rasta. He also settled here from Alwar. His brother Nainanand ji who was a former Magistrate of Rajgarh was living in adjacent house “Shanti Sadan”. We had good tuning with their children as we were of the same age group. Prakash Bhai, Bhaiyan Ji (Later Retd. D.G), Amma Ji to whom we addressed as Tai Ji was very helpful and affectionate to all of us.

I joined Mahaveer School, situated at Tholio ka Mandir in 5th Class, which was at walking distance from my house. Many other boys of our neighborhood were also studying in the same school. We used to play Sitoliya, Mardhadhi, Kabaddi, Stebu and so on through the ball to save in circle with our neighbours Gyan Jhanjhari, Surendra Papdiwal, Amit, Inder Jain, Jawahar and Krishna of Multan Jain’s origin were also living in neighbourhood. Jinendra Sethi used to impart us religious knowledge and spiritual preachings. Among my teachers TejkarANJI Dandiya Sahib was our Head Master.

We used to walk to the school situated in C-Scheme, Jaipur and my class mates were Indramohan, Ramesh Gangwal, Nirmal Godika, Nirmal Shah, Ashok Sarin, Virendra Kasliwal, Sunil Katariya, Vinit, Dhoop Chand, Prem Kala, Surendra Patni, Bhagchand Mushraf, Bhagchand Bindayka, Rajendra Sethi, Ambey, Kailash Dandiya, Bijju Kasliwal, Madhusudan, Nirmal Dugar, Vinay, Surendra Vyas, Nathuji, Roopji, Taj Karan Sogani, Ashok Baid, Mohan Baj, Aaditya Sharma, Naresh Gupta, Mahesh Sharma, Hem Ji, Amar chand Godha Ashok Bardar and Surendra, Madan Mohan, Lakshmi Narayan Mathur etc. The construction of new building was in progress. We also shifted to a new rented house at 5, New Colony, Near Panch Batti, Jaipur in 1952 and stayed there up to 1957-58 when Jaipur Bench was abolished. We were lucky to have good friends and neighbours as some of them were students of Mahaveer School viz, Kailash Chabbra, Naren Bakshi, Narendra Mathur, Chandra Prakash, Davendra, Rajendra Sharma, Brijesh Mathur, Arun, Sobhag Mathur, Chandra Dutt Paliwal, P. Dayal, Ratan-Narayan, Rajendra & Surendra Saboo, Niraj and Narendra Kaushik, N.S. Sisodia, B.L. Sharma etc. We had very good relations and played Cricket and Badminton.

Neighbours :- In the house no. 4, New colony, Shri Laxmi Narayan Ji Sharma, Ram Singhji of Alwar, Hari Ram Saboo, Brij Sunder Sharma

and Devda Sahib, Mayaram and other neighbours V.P.Tyagi, Amar Singh Chaturvedi, Tikaram Paliwal, Tejwani and Aanand Kachhava etc. were residing. They encouraged us to play some game. Even my neighbours at various places taught me a lot in their respective way which exercised a great influence on me all along in my life. This helped me to play Badminton regularly with my friend Brijesh Mathur. In this house youth hostel of Rajasthan was also running. Some tourist became interested and joined us. Maharani Laxmi Kumari Chudawat was the President and Mrs. Ambika Rao wife of Chief Secretary joined and used to visit here. She was also fond of playing Badminton, she watched us playing and appreciated our game.

Scholars :- During my studies I had an opportunity to see eminent scholars like Master Moti Lal Ji Sanghi, Grand father-in-law of Shri Naina Nand Ji and also had an opportunity to hear Pt. Chain Sukh Das Ji at Tholiyo Ka Mandir. I also had great chance to hear Vidhyanand Ji Muniraj (July 1997) and Kaushal Bahan Ji. I used to go to hear them regularly at Jaipur and was very much influenced with their 'Pravachan'. Later on, I heard Gyan Chand Ji Biltiwala and Milap Chand Ji Shastri in Rajasthan Jain Sabha function at Ramleela Maidan, Jaipur. I have also heard Sh. Bhramcharya Luhadiya Ji, Kailash Chand ji, Ramesh Chand Jain, Ashok Baid Ji at Gappu Ji's Mandir at Gokhale Marg, Jaipur. Their discourses were very nice.

I also appreciate Dr. Prem Chand Rawka, who as an editor published "Mahaveer Smarika" of Rajasthan Jain Sabha. My articles three were published regarding Human Rights in Jainism in this Smarika. Initially I only emphasized the words "Jiyo and Jeene Do", "Ahinsa Parmo Dharm" and "Do Your Own Duty". As I became the Chairman of State Human Right Commission I came across the whole Human Rights as per law but it was an Honour as these basic principles were already available in "Jain Darshan." In other book there is concept of Santhara/Samadhimaran though it has always been the topic of debate but as per research and as the settled past practice, It is the only way to achieve salvation provided one is able to detached himself from worldly pleasure. The other book is on Ahinsa pertaining to Non-violence and Human Rights in Indian Culture with reference to Jainism. My emphasis is that Ahinsa is available in all the religions and cultures and is a

Universal Law. These books were also published in Jain Tirth Vandana, Bombay, Jain Gazette Lucknow and so many other Magazines daily news papers and were distributed to many persons and are available also on website “justicenagendrakjain.com”.

Teachers :- I may state that during the period 1952-56, I had an opportunity to participate in games and sports. I was an all rounder and played games viz. Cricket, Football, Table-Tennis, Tennis and specially Badminton. Our Head Master Sh.Tej Karan Ji Dandiya along with teachers R.D. Gupta, G.B. Mathur, Harish Gupta, Prem Ratan, Prem Singh Solanki also used to play with students in the school’s Entrance Hall. There were good teachers like Ratan Lal Ji, Raghuveerji Saral, Aanandi Lal Ji (Tailor Master), Damodar Lal Ji (Drawing), Ghisi Lal Ji (P.T.I) and P.C. Chhabra.

In school, there were a lot of good players of every game, for example in Football Anand Vyas, Moolchand, Magan Singh and others, in Kabaddi- Narendra Sethi, Balkishan, in Cricket, Vinod Pareek, Mishra, Amit Roy, B.L. Sharma, Vinod Mittal, in Table Tennis, Rajkumar Sethi, Pramod, in other co-curricular activities like music and dance Gopal, Harak Chand Tholiya, Poonam, their performance was commendable. In results Swaroop Mathur and Prabha got first position for boys and girls respectively in 10th class in 1955-56.

I recall that I had the good fortune of my being established as a National Badminton Player since my childhood, when I was a student of class IX. My passion and devotion to the game continued incessantly throughout my life in the college and university life.

Mahaveer School organized a 7 days camp in school campus named ‘Mahaveer Nagar’, between 13th to 20th October in 1954. All the students had to participate in the camp in order to understand practical working of about 51 different types of works like banking transactions, telephone communication, post office works, police proceedings, court matters and other works necessary in day to day life. This camp was very helpful and it blessed me with dynamism and versatility in my personality.

I also participated in “Pyarelal Pratiyogita” in Pinweight section, held in 1956-57 where Dandiya Sahib was my teacher-in charge. Sh.Jasdev Singh was the Commentator in Pratiyogita, Later on because of his soft, melodious, and Magical voice and also his capability to change

his tone according to the game and situation. He was awardee of Padam Bhushan and other Olympic Awards for his other contributions in the field we are proud of him.

I also remember that President Nikolai Bulganin and Secretary Khrushchev of USSR visited Jaipur on 8th December 1955. The students of our school along with students of different schools were asked to welcome him by showing welcome flags at Airport in which I also participated. During second round of pick up and drop of the students, we lost our beloved and respected teacher Sh.Ratan Lal Ji Chhabra on 8.12.1955 as he was sitting on the top of the bus along with the students. He suddenly fell down from the bus by striking with a welcome banner and left us forever, on the spot. This incident taught me that there is no certainty in life.

In the school, we students constructed a Platform (चबूतरा) and a cycle stand by Voluntary Shramdan (श्रमदान) and other important activity undertaken were to know about agriculture and plantation. For this work a group of four students was allotted with seedbed measuring 10 x 8 feet area. We sowed and watered the same from tube well and got the produce of some vegetables like Peas, Coriander, Cabbage, Bitter gourd, Karela, Beans, Carrot, Raddish etc. which we used to bring home and enjoy with our family members, by this we used to know the ground realities and understand the hard work done by Anna Data (Kisan Bhai). We could learn that through team work big goals can be achieved easily.

In School, we played inter-school Badminton tournaments and won. We used to take our refreshment after the match at Choudhary Hotel M.I. Road, Sushil Jain was incharge.

In Ashok Club we used to play in the morning. In between game we decided that winner would provide refreshment after the game of the day. We used to go for refreshment opposite to S.M.S. Hospital and generally Nirmal Shah being the winner had the privilege to provide refreshment every time. This developed feeling in us that everyone feels happy by sharing his happiness.

When we were staying at 5, New Colony, I used to go to Jai Club, at 3:30 pm to play tennis one/two set with Govind Bapna, Anil Vaish, Vijay Mathur and Umesh Swami and also with him as a partner in doubles against Purohit brothers. Afterwards regular members like Dr. S.N.

Kakkar, K.N. Kakkar, Dr. Gopi Nath, my father J.P. Jain & Harish Chandra Swami, I. M. Shah used to play. Thereafter I used to play table tennis with Heera Lal Gehlot, S.N. Dixit and others and then used to go for swimming. We young boys and girls, Dayanidhi Kasliwal and Family, Ashok Totuka and family, Narendra Kaushik and family and many others were imparted coaching and training from Bafati Baba. We used to return home by 6:00 P.M. It helped me to build stamina.

College Life and Badminton :- After matriculation, I Joined Maharaja College, Rajasthan College and Rajasthan University and thereafter did my LLB from Jodhpur University. In the year 1958, we shifted to our own incomplete house at R-3, Tilak Marg, C-Scheme, Jaipur.

I am happy to point out the fact that during tournaments while visiting different places between 1957-60 players like Ms. Shanta Balani, Pratibha Shalini and Usha Sen helped me in preparing my Chemistry notes, English essays and communication skill to face the military examination. My Aunty Dr. B. Joseph, brother S.P. Jain also guided and helped me to overcome my hesitation & made me confident in my communication skill to some extent.

In 1954, Morarji Desai was the President of Badminton Association of India and thereafter Her-Highness Maharani Gayatri Devi became the President of Badminton Association of India in 1955-57. H.H. Sawai Man Singh Ji became Chief Patron and Maharani Gayatri Devi was patron of Rajasthan Badminton Association. G.C. Chatterjee, Vice Chancellor was President and Sh. Jai Narayan Vyas Vice President, thereafter Prof. M.V. Mathur, Maharaja Jhalawar, Munna Lal Goyal were President respectively and G.L. Mehta, K.K. Khanna and G.K. Sharma, L.C. Gupta were the Secretaries between 1954 to 1970 respectively. It was an honour to play with top and royal family players without any complex which helped me to know the ground realities of life.

We played Badminton regularly at Ashok Club. There Mrs. Leela Khanna, Mrs. B. Hooja, Mrs. Mukharji, Kurani Bisau also used to play. Sometimes His-Highness and Her-Highness used to come to play and watch Badminton at Ashok Club.

I had an opportunity to play with Her-Highness Maharani Gayatri Devi for more than three months and also to play with girls of Maharani College with the permission of Principal Madam Savitri Bhartiya and Madam Shah as in-charge of games for some time. Madam Luther,

Principal of MGD School and the teacher Pushpaji, Kamleshji and games teacher Ms. Benjamin permitted me to play with girls in school for some time but thereafter they were called at Ashok Club for coaching, with the help of Master Sarajul Huq, a good player and teacher of Muslim School, his shots were very forceful and it is due to him I improved my defence to a great extent.

In Jaipur Nationals Maharani Gayatri Devi with partner Dhongade India no.3 of Bombay played in mixed doubles against Raj Bhargava and Pramila Bhargava of Rajasthan in 1955, at Ashok Club, Raj and Pramila Bhargava won the match.

We Players with Kamal Khanna, Dinesh Ji and others visited Her-Highness to invite her for prize distribution. At that time players were introduced to her and one Ms. Tiwari introduced L.C. Gupta saying that he is the best clown of our college. He was very happy that he was introduced nicely where other players had given their self introduction. Later on Dinesh ji told him, "Have you followed the meaning of it that you are a joker of the College." Then he was upset and became very angry with Ms. Tiwari.

At that time, Badminton was a popular game only in some districts of Rajasthan namely Jaipur, Ajmer, Jodhpur, Udaipur, Kota, Jhalawar, Jhunjhunu, Sikar and Tonk. The schedule of all the tournaments was decided by Rajasthan Badminton Association and the tournaments were fixed district wise separately.

During school time, I played with Senior players like Doctor V.K. Bhargava, Sunita Sen. I also participated in Badminton Championship and was top seeded in Junior-Nationals at Jaipur in 1955 with R.N. Watel, L.S. Kothari, Dinesh Swami in seniors and Krishna Swaroop in ladies. Thereafter, I represented Rajasthan State and played in Nationals in respective states at different places namely Jaipur, Delhi, Hyderabad, Guwahati, Jamshedpur, Trivendrum, Amritsar, Bangalore, Gorakhpur, Bombay, again Jaipur, Amritsar and other places for 14 years till 1968. I played in Veteran doubles with B.L.Sharma in 1977-78 after a gap of about 9-10 years. N.T.Rama Rao, Chief Minister of Andhra Pradesh by throwing Javelin inaugurated the National Games and sports meet. National games including National Badminton were held at Hyderabad with other games and sports. Later on my colleague B.L.Sharma played for India in Veteran and got Silver medal in team event and Bronze medal

in individual game at Denmark. We felt proud for this achievement and honour. Players from different district used to stay in my house during the period 1958 to 1962 and Sudhakar used to put his vehicle in my house to take and drop to players at Ashok Club, Rajmandir.

During this period we Badminton players from Jaipur, I. M. Shah, Dinesh Swami, L. S. Kothari, L. C. Gupta, R. P. Sharma, Brijesh and myself with Kamal Khanna and G. K. Sharma visited Ajmer 2-3 times to play matches. I must mention two incidents one is when we stayed at Sartaj Hotel and played in Railway Club with Raj Bhargava, D. B. Choudhary, Jugal, Bishan Tandon, Baijal, Kula, B.C. Bhargava, Kalyan Singh, Sadrick and ladies players were Pramila Bhargava, Arnee Mehta, Ms. Michal, Usha, Jyoti Sen and others. We had our dinner at Kelly restaurant in the night when the flour was finished and the cook had to go to market to bring flour and prepare Roti again and again. We also visited one picture hall to see movie "Naya Daur" the song "Jiyo Chamiya Jiyo" was going on, my brother L.C. Gupta also started singing the song loudly in hall. These are unforgettable moments of my life.

Mount-Abu Camps :- I also attended the 1st Badminton Coach Camp at Mount Abu in summer-vacations of 1956. This camp was organized by Rajasthan State Sports Council every year and I participated in this camp till 1961 and got the training from National Coach Manoj Guha and one foreign coach Liong of Malasiya who was 7 times world champion in doubles. This camp for different games and sports lasted for 21 days. Players of different games like hockey, table tennis, lawn tennis, cricket, Athletics participated in camp and top Indian coaches of different games were available to train and they taught the techniques to the players. These camps were organized every year in summer holidays, later on at Mount Abu/ Jaipur, I had an occasion to see and interact with officials Bhaya ji and Ramesh Chand Paliwal two top sports persons of Alwar, Kota and some top players from out of Rajasthan. Nice Catering was provided by Prabhudas Ram Chandar Tejwani of Prabhudas & Company of Ajmer. By this time I was clear in my mind that self discipline, constant hard work and regular practice will help to improve our game and skill and I was satisfied with my initial dream to be known as a sports person.

In Mount Abu coaching camp on Saturday/ Sunday there was a programme of camp fire, all trainees had to participate. I remember

Devendra Singh used to mono-act on three programmes of radio namely for Health, Ayurvedic and Pakshastra. Due to disturbance in frequency there was overlapping in instruction which created fun but he acted and performed very nicely and effectively. Later on the programme was repeated by Amitabh Bachchan in Film Collie.

In Mount Abu Coaching Camp, we had an opportunity to see and play Hockey with Wizard Major Dhyan Chand as head coach, National Players R.S. Gentle and Peeru, coach for girls and boys. Every Saturday/Sunday lady hockey team used to play with the team of other games, when Badminton team played thrice and Dhyan Chandji was goal keeper but I could not hit the ball into goal even once and every time I slipped while hitting the ball. The Wizard Dhyan Chandji called me and commented why you fell down in D area and he told me that I should be slow here and wait for a while and then hit the ball with determination and concentration. This advice of a great champion helped me all the time in my life, not only in the game of Badminton but through out my life.

A National Hockey Player, R.S.Gentle secured goal and India got the Gold Medal in Melbourne Olympic in 1956, he was also a Badminton player. G.K.Sharma was our Secretary, who used to lose in practice two-three times and there was a bet between the two that who loses the match will give Ice Cream treat at Nakki Lake to all the players. The match date was fixed. On that day I also requested my player friends who were playing hockey, as they always laughed at us that we are playing girls game, it is not a game, we should play football or hockey. All came in Badminton Court to see the match, it was a surprise for them that G.K.Sharma beat him 21-9 and Gentle was running throughout in the game. I told Swarupji, Mahesh and others that your Aka could not stand before Gajji Bhaiya. While we could beat Gajji Bhaiya below 10 points. Thereafter they never remarked sarcastically and were able to understand the game which required tremendous stamina and fitness. One should know that each and every game has its own importance.

Apart from above camp, the players who were supposed to participate in Asian games, as I have already narrated Milkha Singh, Makkhan Singh and others were to represent for Asian games in four hundred meters and for this they were running and practicing for 7 km as

per schedule. Everybody has some good qualities we have to find them out and follow them to reach the top, one should do sacrifice have determination and work hard.

Every year we attended the camp at Mount Abu and visited Brahma Kumari Centre and Indian Police Academy, where newly recruited IPS were imparted initial training prior to their further training at Hyderabad. H.K.Hooja was the Head and Commander with Assistant Commander Davenport. We learned so much from both.

I also had an occasion to meet and interact with some Governors namely Gurumukh Nihal Singh, Sampurnanad Ji, Hukam Singh, Bali Ram Bhagat, Vasant Dada Patil, Omprakash Mehra and Chief Ministers of Rajasthan, Jai Narain Vyas, M.L.Sukhadia, Haridev Joshi, Barkatullah Khan, Heeralal, Devpura, Shiv Charan Mathur, Ashok Gehlot and Vasundhara Raje in various functions and learnt a lot from their qualities.

Memorial Matches and Instances :- I have played a good number of matches and enjoyed every moment of the thrilling contest in my life. Some memorable good matches are remembered till date. In 1958 at Jodhpur, doubles match between Raj Bhargava and D.B. Choudhary vs. L.C. Gupta and my self. We won that match (ii) Maharaja's College, Jaipur Badminton team played against Jaipur medical college team consisting of Arun Bordia, Chand Jain, Suresh Bhargava at Ajmer, we won the match (iii) We had played another good match at Raj Rishi College Alwar with P.C. Kala as partner in another year and won.

That apart I always remember and cherish the memories of matches played in inter-university tournament at Meerut in a match of Rajasthan with Punjab team consisting of Suresh and Mahesh Sagar against V. K. Vaid and myself we won but lost the tie. In Jaipur another match between Suresh & Narendra Goyal of Allahabad University versus V.K.Vaid and my self for Rajasthan University team, we lost. Another Inter State match between Delhi team consisting of Anil Sodhi and Arun against V.K.Vaid and myself was played at Shimla. We won the match though lost the tie. Other doubles match with V.K. Vaid and myself against Akram Beg of Pakistan and his partner S. S. Bedi of Rajasthan was played at Jaipur. We won the match. Another match was played by us against Narendra Sayal

and P. P.S. Chawla at Jaipur Ashok Club, and we won the match. One more contesting match of three games between R.N. Watel and Suresh Goyal versus Arun of Delhi and myself was played at Delhi Nationals and we lost.

I am narrating one more incident as per advice of some senior player when I was playing with a player named P.P. Singhal of Delhi. He taught me tactic that while handing over or passing the shuttle to him near net, I should murmur something so that he will feel that I was abusing him. Because of his short temperament he will lose his concentration and he will hit the shuttle with anger either at net or outside the court otherwise I can't cope with his stamina and speed in the game. I followed the instruction and the result was in my favour. I learnt that one should be calm even when provoked by somebody.

I may also mention that in Guwahati Nationals our L.C. Gupta got walkover against T.N. Seth in first round as he had not reported in time. Next day a call came from Chief Referee, If L.C. Gupta agrees we can have that match now. I along with other team member requested and persuaded him to play otherwise next match he could not win and public had come to see final match between Nandu Natekar and T.N. Seth. On our request L.C.Gupta agreed to play and we appreciated him. Ultimately final match was played between Nandu Natekar and T.N. Seth and Nandu Natekar won the match and became National Champion again.

I remember, one doubles match between G.S.Hemady and Manoj Ghua versus Vikram Bhatt and Dhongadey in the year 1955 Nationals at Jaipur, when G.S Hemady used to call rightly out on a shot by other side. I had noticed that every time his judgement was right and there was hardly any player who had this type of accurate judgement in those days. While playing I also tried to get this type of perfection in judgement. I also remembered a well fought and contesting match between Prakash Padukone and Sugiarto, in which Prakash had lost in contesting three games at Hyderabad.

All England Champion Rudy Harteno had to play match against Nog-Bonb in the evening, but when we visited Khasa Kothi the place of their stay, we saw that Rudy was doing skipping on the roof of the hotel. We saw and counted about Four hundred in number and he continued skipping before we met him. It was a great surprise to us, as to how he was

doing too much exercise while he had to play match against equal grade player in the evening.

I had an opportunity to play with Indian top players like Nandu Natekar, T.N.Seth, P.S Chawala and I played also with C.D.Deveras, P.P.S.Chawla, Deepu and Roman Ghosh, A.L Deewan, S.R.Chadda, Narendra Sayal,Suresh Goyal, Naren Goyal, M.G.Sharma, Jagdish Lal, P.P Singhal,Suresh Goyal,Dinesh Khanna, Satish Bhatia and Ashok Siddha, Masaldan and many others.In ladies,I have played with Meena Shah,National Champion,Prem Parashar and seen many others Sushila Kapadia, Jasbeer and Satyendra Kaur,Apte Sisters, Ami Ghiya, Aparna and Rajasthan top ladies players namely Tiwari Sisters, Krishna and Sarla Swaroop, Pratibhaji, Kusum Jain, Sarla Bafna and sisters Usha Sen, Jyoti,Indira Padmanabham,Manju Bhatnagar, Arnee Mehta, Pramila Bhargava,Kuky Vicky,Bilmoria, Grace Shore and Khumbhata and many others. C.L. Madan and Manoj Ghua were coaching us at that time. My single matches were with Deepu Ghosh at Bombay, C.D.Devras at Guwahati, M.J. Sharma at Delhi, Jagdish Lal at Jaipur and Nog-Bog-bee at Jaipur respectively, I lost these memorable matches. However, I got an opportunity to learn more and to improve my short comings.

I had an opportunity to see and witness Thomus and Uber-Cup matches at Jaipur and also played with some of the best players of that time and witnessed world's top players like Arlencops, Frankkoberro, Rudi Hartano Nog-Bonb-Bee, Akram Beg and others who played Badminton in Rajmandir Cinema Hall at Jaipur and at Ashok Club.While playing with them it gave me an opportunity to understand their culture and way of living, it helped me in my foreign visits.

Brijesh and I went to Bombay to witness world class players Earlen Cops, Frank Kobrao and others with a recommendation letter of G.K. Sharma. Gose Mohammad was Secretary, we requested him to kindly give us passes to witness the matches. He gently told us "we don't give free passes to anyone, we can provide you concessional tickets, because the gate money has to go abroad as per agreement. We arranged the tickets and witnessed the match.

At that time the learning point for us was that Bombay association didn't oblige anybody by giving free passes. But if they had to give passes to VIPs the association would purchase concession tickets from its officers and give tickets in the form of passes. We appreciated their system and

procedure. When we came to Jaipur, we tried to implement the same through our secretary Sh. G. K. Sharma sahib, while organizing Top class or International Badminton tournament at Rajmandir/Ashok club. But this concept/system failed in Jaipur. We found and noticed that everybody wants free passes otherwise concerned persons may create obstacles in conducting the matches by not providing electricity, water etc. One can understand the difference in their thinking in comparison to metro and to our city.

I may give two instances - In Maharaja's College I was playing against senior players I.M. Shah to whom I lost in semifinal, My father J.P. Jain was also watching match sitting by the side of my teacher T.C. Jain. Without knowing T.C. Jain told my Father that Nagendra is a very good player and if promoted properly by his father, he can play for Indian Team. Later my teacher told this to me and he felt sorry when he came to know that he was talking to my father. On the other hand my father never disclosed it. However at later stage my father put his hand on my shoulder which inspired me and said, "You must win," that gave me sufficient energy and courage to fight for each point till the end of the game.

In Maharaja's College, Ajmer girls had come to play for State Championship, when we were going to drop them in Hostel, some students commented on one of the girls, and then I advised her to ignore him. One Arni Mehta rebuked the boys and asked them to mind their own business and boldly asked the boys what had happened and what they wanted. Then boys said, "nothing, nothing" and they trembled. The incident like this made me think how difficult for female players to establish themselves in our society. We have to take steps appropriately to promote them.

I appreciate the players of Kota Badminton Association members like Khalil Ahmad, V.P. Sharma, R. Maheshwari, Kamal Gupta, Nirmal Haldiya, S.P.S. Anand, Kuldeep Singh and the others under the Presidentship of the Association S.S. Mishra. They had invited singer Jagjeet Singh and Chitra on their own, free of cost, to entertain the players, who had come to participate in State Badmintonship at Kota.

I attended the marriage of Sheela Ji, daughter of Sh. Haribhau Ji Upadhyaya at Ajmer in the year 1962, who used to play Badminton with us. Though Sukhadiji inaugurated Mount Abu camp earlier and I was introduced to the then Chief Minister Sh. Mohan Lal Sukhadia Ji. On

interaction I was surprised to note that he enquired about games activities in particularly Badminton for about 20 minutes. I was impressed about his foresightedness and his concern towards the game, which made me a great fan of him.

In every tournament in those days Her-Highness used to host two dinners and one dinner was given by Association/Sport Council and what we have noticed is that foreign players take limited dinner in comparison to our players. It gives a message that one should be careful about his diet and keep control while taking food on such occasions. In this way food may not be wasted.

I may narrate the punctuality of Principal K.L.Verma during my student life, when we went to play, I used to see him almost with same steps at the same place and at the same time while walking, “punctuality and timing is to be seen and learnt.”

Here I may mention that I always kept in my mind saying of Saint Vivekanda I quote:

“Arise, Awake Stop Not
Till the Goal is Reached.”

I also always remember the words of ‘Robert Frost,’ which always inspired Pandit Jawahar Lal Nehru.

“The Woods are lovely, dark and deep
But I have promises to keep
And Miles to go before I sleep, And Miles to go before I Sleep”

Nowadays everybody is health conscious. Parents are more conscious and they want to see their children to be at top and doing their best and because of good facilities talents are seen in every game. At the same time they should never prefer shortcut in life. They have also become professionals. I have already mentioned in one of my book “**Khel, Khiladi and Khel Bhawana**” that not only for players, but for everybody self control and discipline is very important and fruitful throughout life. I also expressed my views on this in some sports functions that need of the day is to pick up them at School level.

I have also brought to the notice that no doubt Sports Ministers and other Dignitaries give full recognition to top players and celebrities of the game and have photographs with them but they don’t show much concern

and enthusiasm to players. It is also seen that much had been done in middle of fifties in games for the players but more is required.

Though much infrastructure improvement in the games and sports has been done by the Government but still it is very important and need of the day to take care of potential talented players at the very initial stage to encourage them to achieve or at least strive to achieve the position which they deserve.

I mentioned earlier that Her-Highness motivated and encouraged budding players. She sent Akthar Ali Tennis player abroad for coaching on her own expenses. Sports Council of Rajasthan, Badminton Association had provided facility for players even in middle of fifties. At that time players were involved in Sports and games to play for pleasure Jaipur Badminton Association with Sports Council had made Memo of Understanding (MOU) to utilize Badminton court at stadium. I appreciate J.C Mohanti as Secretary Sport/ Chairman Sports Council for this gesture. However, for reasons known to them MOU is not renewed.

I have also finalized the report submitted by committee under my Chairmanship in compliance of the Direction of the State Sports Council, Rajasthan in February 2017, pertaining to improvement and Amendment in Rajasthan Sports Act 2005. The report has been approved by the High Court in a case in the year 2017 but in spite of the orders of the court for want of administrative and political will, the Act is not amended till date, therefore players are also suffering a lot.

I left playing competitive Badminton since year 1965, but represented state upto 1968. That apart I was a state level umpire of Badminton, and because of my profession and for want of attending schedule refresher course, my umpire-ship period could not be renewed. There are many good players like Sohanmal Popaliya, Mangal Chand, Dr. Bansal, Sunil Kalani, Ashok Singh, Om Bhadada, Brijraj Singh, Ranvir Singh, Prakash, Pradeep, Pramod, Ashok Kalani, Pradeep Bhayati, later they also became State Champion and represented State.

I was clear in my mind, that after retirement I will get involved in Badminton as per my passion and by chance in 2003 I got an opportunity to conduct two International Matches as a referee at Kualalumpur as per courtesy of Panchu Golanan International Vice President of world Badminton Federation, a player who played in early years with me at Jaipur. As it was necessary to conduct some matches to clear practical

exam in the tournament of that level, but I could not go due to unavoidable circumstances.

I was captain of school team in 1956-58, Maharaja College in 1958, Rajasthan State in 1961, Rajasthan University in 1962-63 and Jodhpur University in 1965. I may also mention that for one reason or other I could not go abroad to play for India. Though as a Badminton official I have attended Asian Games at Delhi in the year 1982, World Olympics at Pune in year 2008 and visited as an Observer of Indian Badminton Team at Berlingam UK. I had an opportunity to see almost all top players of those days. It satisfied old ambition of my life.

Senior Badminton Association Registered on 18th June 2014 :- After coming to Jaipur in 2005 I was again involved in Badminton activities at Jaipur and worked where young and budding players played Badminton and some of them have come up to the National level. Under the supervision of Jaipur President Dileep Shivpuri Secretary Manoj, Anil Singh National Umpire, Atul and others, made me Chief Patron of Jaipur Badminton Association. I also appreciate the work of President Rajasthan Badminton Association and Secretary K.K. Sharma for his good timely efforts to uplift the standard of Badminton players of Rajasthan. I also appreciate the efforts of the Senior Badminton Association of the players who represented Rajasthan State Team. President P.C. Kala, Secretary Virendra Bhargava and all the members who are encouraging youngsters. I also express my gratitude for making me as Patron-in-chief of this association.

I visit stadium almost thrice in a week in the evening to see young ones playing. I notice some of their habits while playing. I am narrating two examples of the present time of year 2015-16. As you know nowadays parents do everything to make their child the best player. As stated I was watching the game. What I had seen that one player, while playing every time was watching his mother and on her instruction, he was returning the shuttle. Then I told his mother, I think he is your son, but kindly allow him to play independently and see what mistakes he does, you may note down and tell him later on otherwise he will not be able to utilize his mind and his purpose will frustrate. By face, she was not looking happy. I didn't mind. Next day the Secretary Manoj Dasot, Atul and coach bowed before me. Other day she came and wished me, then I told her that you came to me only realizing my position, that it is not enough. I wanted that your son should improve his game and develop self confidence. Then she felt sorry.

Another incident is that a servant of an officer used to give him water from Thermos and helped him in changing shoes. Then I asked "Who are you, can't you change shoes yourself?" Then I came to know that the boy was the son of some SP. When Next time I met his father, 'I told him, why are you spoiling your son?' One should do his own work and games teach us discipline, so one must learn cooperation, coordination without any complex, otherwise no purpose of playing games will be fulfilled. He felt sorry. Nowadays what we are seeing is that so many youngsters are playing games but they are missing the basics of playing games i.e. self discipline, confidence and sportsmanship.

Activities in Other Games Cricket, Football, Polo, Tennis, Basketball, Baseball etc. :- I had an opportunity to see at Jaipur number of cricket matches from my early age and then in the year 1961 MCC v/s Rajasthan , 1987 Australia v/s England & India v/s Pakistan and 1997 India v/s South Africa. My brother Dr.T.P.Jain and his medical colleagues used to visit in ambulance for providing medical assistance to cricket players in need. I also accompanied them and witnessed cricket matches between Sir Frank Worrell (West Indies Team) and Maharaja Team played at Jaipur Club, Ganpati Nagar, Railway colony which was not in existence then. Maharaja Team consisted of players like Capt.Vijay Hajare, Vinu Mankad, Poli Umrigar, S.P.Gupta, Manjrekar, S.K Zibbu of Jaipur. Again the above top Indian players with Bapu Nadkarni came to practice at St. Xavier's School in the evening. I remember that one Iqbal brother of Shamsher Singh, bowled Vinu Mankad, he congratulated him and gave wrist watch to him as a reward.

31. On Maharaja College ground Cricket match between Melbourne Cricket Club versus Rajasthan XI was played where in Ken Barrington and other players from MCC and Indian Team consisting of Ranji Trophy players participated in the match. Saleem Durani played for Rajasthan.I along with V.K.Vaid, also served as volunteer and wrote the score board by hand. The famous Singer Mukesh along with Bollywood Actors and Actresses like Dhumal, Tanuja, Prem Nath, Shammi Kapoor and Pran were also there to witness the match for some time. I still remember one incident that one couple, who was sitting near the score board, after seeing a straight drive towards the screen uttered the words "we have been sitting since morning but no Goal has come". We along with other persons could not resist our laugh. Some of the incidents like this cheered every one

I still cherish the old memories. Maharaja College had good Cricket players like Mehta, Budhi Prakash, Suresh, Pramod Arya, Hemant Surana, V.K. Vaid and many others. I met President Purushottam Rungta at Cricket match with M.C.C at Maharaja's College, Jaipur and also met Jai Singh of Dungarpur who later became President of BCCI.

I also had an opportunity with the then Chief Justice of Rajasthan Justice M.G. Murkarjee who was State Level Umpire at Kolkata, to witness one test match at Jaipur where Indian Team Captain was Kapil Dev. Mahendra Singh my colleague member in Disciplinary Committee with me in Bar Council of India, was Secretary of BCCI. Chief Justice and I along with my brother-in-law Dr. Gautam, Dr. Veena who had come from Zambia to see the matches enjoyed. I along with my son Gaurav, Raghav and other players went to Hotel Raj Mahal Palace, where the team was staying for, autograph of the players.

Kapil Dev was reluctant to allow us to take autograph of the players, with due respect boldly I told him that "You are fortunate that the young kids are crazy of your autograph. So please spare some of your valuable time and encourage them, otherwise after some time they will not take your autograph, but of other players of future." Thereafter he allowed us, I thanked him for his gesture.

I also had an opportunity to see some of the Polo matches at Rambag Polo ground, where His Highness, Brigadier Bhawani Singh, R.S.Sodhi, G.S.Garcha, Hanut Singh and many other players participated in Polo matches. As per my memory Ved Prakesh Ahuja was Secretary. I enjoyed the matches. It shows strength, understanding, skill, team spirit, command and tuning with horses of the players.

I may also mention a great instance of my cousin Devendra's maternal uncle Shripal a weight lifter like Wrestler told me that Chandgi Ram used to prepare himself by throwing Cement Kattas in Yamuna at Delhi and thereafter used to squeeze the cloth (Cement Katta) by his hand and that's why in fight with Mehndiram, he only caught his wrist and won the Kushti without further fight in eight minutes. In earlier years the Pahalwans used to prepare themselves in such a way.

I also remember that when we were coming back from Jamshedpur after playing Nationals, in 1959, we stayed at Kanpur and saw the test

between India and Australia, where Jassu Patel of India had taken 9 wickets.

Maharajas College was full of good players of all the games. Basket Ball Team included Khusi Ram, Vishnu, S.Kant, Kanwar Sen, S.K.Khuteta, Gautam Sen, In Kabaddi were Prakash Bakhshi, Bisso Ji, Balu and others, while in Tennis Bilimoriya, Indra Singh Lodha, P.K.Ojha, Narendra Kaul, Hanuman and Shankar Baijal Bhatnagar were the players. Pramod Dutt and his brother W by nick name, OD and many others represented Table tennis.

We saw football players having vigorous practice by giving short passes and even Sobhag Singhji practicing and hitting the ball towards goal by standing back to goalkeeper Virendra Sinha.

I witnessed a good Football match played at Union football Ground of Ramniwas Garden in which Players from Railway like Kulla from Ajmer Division and others participated.

In Jaipur, I also had an opportunity to witness Football Inter-University Tournament at Maharaja College in which players from different Universities like Mr. P. K. Banerjee (Calcutta), Virendra Sinha, Maharaja Sobhag Singh Ji (Rajasthan) participated. We had also seen with entire Badminton team the football match between India and Russia in 1965 held at Bombay with the consent of Indian Football Team Captain Jarnail Singh Dhillon with the help of H.C. Bhargava, our Badminton Team Coach in Bombay.

I keenly witnessed Wrestling (Dangal) of Dara Singh, King Kong, Tiger Joginder Singh, Randhawa, Funtam at Aatish Market where I along with my Mama Harprasad worked as volunteer and remained attached to these wrestlers for the whole day. Wrestlers also sat in Rickshaw for Advertisement. It was a surprise to see that they were also eating ice. It was announced that there would be challenge fight between Kingkong & Darasingh and the winner would get ten thousand rupees. Dhara Singh won the match using Kekda Dav (Crab). As we were with them for a long time, we were of the view that fight with such condition is to attract public at large and this fact (Mili Juli) cannot be ruled out.

My maternal uncle Harprasad was a good Volley Ball, Football and Kabaddi player, and as a teacher he motivated his students and other business persons who were his students for their contribution to construct

a stadium at Bandikui. This achievement clearly shows his love, interest and passion towards games.

I along with state players of different games and sports was present when Sawai Mansingh Stadium was inaugurated by Prime Minister Pandit Jawahar Lal Nehru in the presence of former Raj Pramukh and Chief Minister at Jaipur in the year 1964. It was a proud moment for sports persons.

I had an opportunity to witness good Tennis matches held in Jaipur played at Lilypool Tennis court. In these matches world class players Sconki, Ramanath Krishnan, Premjeet Lal, S.Mukherjee and Aktar Ali along with Rajasthan players. Dr.S.N.Kakkar, Professor Kakkar, Mahesh and Suresh the Purohit Brothers, my father J.P Jain and Miss Padmini had played. I too participated in the tournament with a view to observe the players while they were sitting in players block at the Tennis Court.

The Legendary figure Krishnan told me that he had his coaching at Australia from Hope Island, but could not complete it being strenuous and also for some other reasons therefore he could not improve his first service which remained weak.He also disclosed that Australia National Team is selected from some eight thousand players,who participate in various tournaments.After going through various tests, only 10 players were selected.Mr. Krishnan told me that Nandu Natekar was initially a tennis player, he lost to him in Junior National Finals,there after he shifted to Badminton.After some days on his visit to Jaipur, Krishnan introduced his son Ramesh to me by saying him that N.K. is my old fan.

In Table Tennis, I had an occasion to witness the game of the top players of India like Gautam, Indu Mehta and Rajasthan players Heera Lal Gehlot, K.K. Bhargava, Ramani, H.Lodha and others, who played at Jai Club, when Moolchand Chauhan was the Secretary of Rajasthan Table Tennis Association. Mr. Bhandari was the coach. M.C. Chauhan shifted from Secretary, Badminton Association to Table Tennis Association Ajmer. He became President of Table Tennis Association of India and also of Asia and got many awards including Olympic Awards. He invited me in Asian Table Tennis Tournament at Madras.

I cannot forget the race 400x4 and 100x4 run held at Maharaja College about 60 years back. The runners were Karan Singh, Berry, Pratap Singh and one other athlete who later joined as a teacher in Muslim School, and their action is before my eyes inspiring me I still remember the great Athletes, runners of Maharaja College of that time.

Pleasant Memories

In the year January 1963 at Delhi our entire team had an opportunity to witness a program where in Prime Minister Pandit Nehru Ji was present and Lata Mangeshkar was singing the song "A Mere Watan Ke Logon". In this programme after every item three top actors Dileep Kumar, Devanand, Raj Kapoor appeared and came on stage respectively.

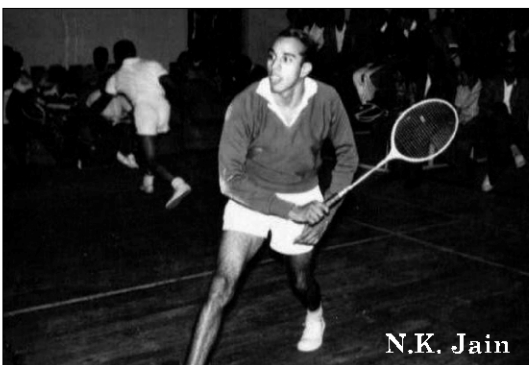

Cinemas:-I had rarely seen movies, but had watched some of James Bond, Sean Connery, then in 1964, I used to see matinee shows in Stadium Cinema at Jodhpur on every Saturday and had seen a number of old films. My friend Omji was incharge of West Air Lines at Jodhpur. He used to adjust Sunil Dutt team of Film 'Reshma aur Shera' to visit Bombay, Jodhpur and Jaisalmer for team unit. He used to adjust and provide tickets to the members of the unit. So during shooting period I had an opportunity to meet so many film stars there.

Good movies always affected my life, I remember all those artists whom I met in my life. A film is prepared with a vision, help and co-operation, assistance of so many persons who are involved directly or indirectly. The film educates us and in the film we see thrill, suspense and entertainment story, dialogues, emotions, sacrifices, love, and affection with sister, brother friend, lyrics and songs by play back singers and so many other good things. Some of the movies like Baiju-Bawra, Do-Bigha Jamin, Shabab, Madhumati, Sone ki Chidiya, Naya Daur, Chori Chori, Awara, Sahab Bibi aur Gulam, Teesri Kasam, Bahurani, Chhalia, Dhool ka Phool, Anarkali, Mugle-Azam, Sholey, Pakeezah and many more are very wonderful movies. "Director is responsible to get the best out of their inner quality, potential with perfect body language and real action in movies. All need appreciations."

With the grace of God, I met in my life with notable personalities of their early years amongst them are film stars viz Dileep Kumar, Devanand, Raj Kapoor, Ashok Kumar, Sunil Dutt, Rajendra Kumar, Sanjeev Khan, Dara Singh, Sajjan, B.M. Vyas, Mahipal, Johny Walker, Mahmood, Hritik Roshan, Om Puri, Sajjan, Rakesh, Asrani, Arun, Mohan Maharshi, Natwar, and Actress Wahida Rahman Vaijayantimala, Nutan, Mala Sinha Anita Guha, Saroja Devi, Madhu Bala, Nargis, Shri Devi, Jaya Prada, Juhi Chawla, Kajol, Mallika, Gulshan Grover, and play back singers are Lata Mangeshkar, Mohd Rafi, Talat, Kalyanji Aanad Ji, Ravindra Jain, Rajendra Jain and South Actor and Actresses and many others at Jodhpur, Jaipur, Bangalore, Mumbai, Madras and other places. Apart from that I had an opportunity to see shooting of a number of films in different studios like R.K. Studio, Filmistan Studio and also Ramoji Film City at Hyderabad. I also had an opportunity to witness the program of Bismilliah Khan at Assam, Pandit Shiv Kumar Sharma at Bombay, and dance of Vaijayanti Mala organized by Justice Basant Kumar at

Bangalore. This gives very good inspiring messages in real life to public at large. It also reflects mental state of the society of that time. Sweet and melodious tune and Music works like a soothing balm to humble soul and charges with positive energy. I always relaxed myself by humming the melodies. I have learnt a lot from films and programmes.

I also had opportunities to meet great Indian leaders President Rajendra Prasad, Dr. Radha Krishnan, Prime Ministers Lal Bahadur Shastri, Indira Gandhi, Rajeev Gandhi, H.D. Dev Gowda, Atal Bihari Vajpayee, Narendra Modi and also some stalwarts advocates M.C. Setalvad, C.K. Daftari, M.C. Chhagla, A.K. Sen, Nana Palkhivala and others. I also had an opportunity to meet and interact Justice Dr. Nagendra Singh (Former Judge International Court of Justice).

As already stated I joined Maharaja College Jaipur in year 1957. K. L. Verma, Somnath Gupta, S.D. Arora, R. S. Kapoor, adorned the Chair of Principal of college for a short time respectively. Other teachers like G.C. Patni, M.C. Gupta, R.R. Kasliwal, M.G. Bhatawdekar, S.V. Sabnis, J.K. Mathur, T.C. Jain, L.S. Kothari, T.L. Dashora, L.R. Soni, Madan Singh Ji were also very popular among the students. Principal and Teaching Staff participated in sports meet also.

I am happy to state here that during college time we used to play Badminton in four open Badminton courts where teachers like M.G. Bhatawdekar, L.S. Kothari, R.K. Mathur, and players like Dinesh Swami, JPS Jain, Zabbar Sahib, Rajendra Sharma, L.C. Gupta, Brijesh, Subhash and Satish Bhargava, V.K. Vaid and others played with us.

During College election time, since I made acquaintance with some new students, who were the players Harish Bader, Subhash Bothra in various games, I had an interaction with K.L. Jain, Jagdish Shrivastava, Satynarayan Singh, K.S. Galundia, Vashishta, Waquar Ahmed, Natwar, Jawahar Singh, Surendra Dada and other senior students & leaders. In college, my class fellows were Prahlad Saraf, Shanti Dhariwal, Gautam Sen, Inder Mohan, Mahendra Aluwalia and others. We also had an opportunity to hear Dr. Radhakrishnan, Lal Bahadur Shastri in college and also some other eminent personalities.

I was whole heartedly devoted to games & sports so much that I had to discontinue my engineering course. Therefore I joined Maharaja College, Jaipur for B.Sc course, but due to my involvement in games &

sports I had to shift to Arts faculty & did my B.A from Rajasthan College, Jaipur. Mr.Huges was Principal of Rajasthan College & K.L. Kamal, S.P.Jain and Ms.Verma earlier Badminton player from Nagpur was also my teacher in Rajasthan College.I recollect some senior & junior students viz.K.N.Bhargava, Brijesh Mathur.Meera Bhatnagar, Roopa Goyal, Ranjeet Chordia, Arjun Ray, Arun Dugar etc.

Jodhpur :- I went to Jodhpur Law College for studying law. Our neighbours were Prof. R.S. Kapoor, Prof. Elhance Sahib, Ram Kishan Mirdha PP and all the advocates who had came from Jaipur. They were residing at Polo Ground area of Paota. I did my law from Jodhpur. S. N. Thanvi was the Principal. D.C. Jain, S.B.L.Saxena, Lekhraj Ji Mehta, M. C. Bhandari, N. M. Kasliwal, taught us law. Law classes were held in the evening. During my studies, my father asked me to find out rulings/citation from digest on different topics like transport, service matters, so I had to do this work from 6.00 to 8.00 P.M in the morning daily. My routine was to go to court at 10.30 A.M after visiting Jodhpur Public Library and remain in the court up to 3.00 P.M. and thereafter to go to college and then to sports ground in the evening from 5.00 to 8.00 PM. Sports teachers were Mahesh Gupta, Sumer Singh, Khan Sahib and Lakh Singh.

We played Inter University Tournament and visited Lucknow. At that relevant time we needed Badminton hall for practice where library was also situated in S.M.K. College and Professor Chatterjee was in-charge. We argued about the attitude of staff that no purpose of participating in tournament would be fulfilled without regular practice. Then we were allowed to practice in the hall for 3-4 days. S.C.Bhargava was in-charge who accompanied the team consisting of myself, Ajit Bapna, Kamalnath and Rakesh with grant of TA, DA for one day but we reached upto Semi Finals and stayed there for ten days.

I also had an opportunity to conduct Inter University West Zone Tournament and final matches with officials of Jodhpur University at Jodhpur, where National Players like Gautam Thakkar, Atul Prem Narayan, and other players played against Jodhpur University team consisting of Anil Shah, R.S. Mehta, G.S. Bapna, R.L.Bhatt and others. Bombay University won the final match. I also made expert comments on Radio Aakashvani. We saw a movie at "Charbhuj Cinema Hall." By that time sports had developed the spirit in me "Don't keep the pressure of winning on head and fear of loss in your heart. "Life" is a game, one should play it with true sports man spirit."

While visiting Udaipur in tournaments I came across some great educationists like Kesri Lal Ji Bordia, Kalu Ram Shrimali, and officers who were attached to Vidhya Bhawan like S.P.S Bhandari, Jagannath Singh Mehta, M.S. Mehta, Menon Sahib. They were great sources of knowledge to one and all including me.

I give an example that while I was going on my scooter in year 1965. and I was passing through Statue Circle I saw one man fell down and collapsed. I stopped my scooter then I requested a Rikshaw wala to take him to Hospital meanwhile a known person also sat in the rikshaw to help and went to S.M.S Hospital in Emergency Ward but attendant was not bothering. Meanwhile I saw Girdhari Lal Bhargava. He asked me how you are here, what is the relation with this person. Then I said I saw this person in the way so I have brought him here. He said, "Don't worry now I will take care." I wanted to pay rikshawwala, then he told me, "Sir I will not take because God has also given me a chance to serve him." I can't forget Yaseen rikshawwala for his kindness and the response from 56 A.P.O. by his company personnel for the immediate help to Sheo Chand, who was in military service .

Vakalat Being A Lawyer :- My father wanted me to become an Engineer and was planning to send me to Germany for Automobile engineering but I could not continue because of my involvement in games activities. My friend Brijesh's brothers was working as in charge of Tea gardens of Tata at Munnar and Gawahati and offered me a job there. I was also given offer to attend Raj Kumari Coaching Scheme and become coach but I wanted to continue in the games only as a hobby, not as a means of livelihood. I was also offered various jobs at a number of places viz Income Tax Department, Sales Tax Department, Stenvag Company, APWI in Railways, AG Office, but my father told me that if I joined the service. I would always be undergraduate. On my visit to Pune in 1954 and 1956, then I saw The National Defence Academy Centre at Khadakwasla, I became keen to serve Nation by joining Indian Military Service. At later stage, I prepared myself both physically as well as mentally very strong, and developed confidence to jump from 1st floor to ground, Unfortunately I could not be selected even in Short Service Commission or as a Ground Duty Pilot due to my weak eyesight.

Ultimately, as per destiny I had passed examination conducted by Bar Council of India for practicing as an Advocate. I was enrolled as an

Advocate by Rajasthan Bar Council on 26th January 1968. I started practice with my father, Sawai Singh, Bhandari, Om Prakash Pradhan, R. Maheshwari, Uttam Chand and brother advocates.

My Father advised me “It is good you have joined this noble profession but you have to work very hard with sincerity to the satisfaction of your client. For two three years you will not get proper earning, after that you will start earning. It is also to be seen how you earn. As per your necessary requirements, you will be happy with great satisfaction Persons who have suffered come trusting you. Therefore, it is your fundamental duty to help them so that they will get justice and bless you. You will have a great satisfaction that your client has got justice and relief.”

I may also mention that during the intervening period my father thought that legal practice would take sufficient time whereas Income Tax Practice would be easy for me. Therefore, I went to Alwar for Income Tax Practice with advocates F.C.Rastogi and Tribhuvannath, advocates who were Juniors of my father at Alwar. In his office Munni Lal Sharma, advocate and Trilok, Advocate Clerk, Office Assistant Kailash were working. I visited Civil Court and met with Advocates Umrao Lal Gupta, B.L. Mahawal, Bhagatji, Mittal, Kripa Dayal Mathur, K.N. Bhargava and others. I have noticed that one can learn art of cross examination from advocates like B.L. Mahawal, Bhagat Ji, and Kripa Dayal Ji. Then after 6-7 months, I came back to Jaipur and worked with S.D. Pandey CA. He had 5-7 CAs and other boys associated with him but I could not enjoy the taxation practice. I came to Jodhpur for my study at evening Law College. Sarva Shri U.C.Jain, Shanti Mehta, Arun Mathur and one girl Rajni Mathur were my class mates.

My routine was to go to Court with my father from 10 O'clock to 5 O'clock. In the evening I used to go for playing Squash. Mohan was Coach at Ummaid Club, Jodhpur Some times I used to go at RSEB Badminton Court at Mohanpura with Noor Mohammad, Liladhar of Railways some friend advocates viz.G.S. Bapna, Dalveer Bhandari, Rajendra Lodha, L.M.Lodha and there after we used to take milk at Milk Mandir,Sojati Gate Jodhpur.

Shri V.S.Dave was my neighbour at house no.16, Jodhpur. He constructed the common wall between my house no.15 and had not taken my share of construction and shown the gesture like an elder brother. The

next Plot No.17 was open for amenities. We made a play ground by levelling and putting net for tennis, Badminton and VolleyBall courts with the help of about 200 students reading in P.T.I course under supervision of Mrs. Shanti Mehta Vice-Principal, in their internship programme. The collector K.K. Bhatnagar graced the occasion and inaugurated it. Sh.V.S. Dave, H.C. Rastogi arranged lunch for all Children. Neighbours of Zalim Vilas area started playing regularly in the evening.

Mrs. Shanti Mehta Vice-Principal of Physical Training College asked me to select and prepare some girls to play Baseball and coach them. They had to play and represent India to play a match against New Zealand. I with G.S.Bapna and Ms.Bhawani, Maharani college and other persons selected girls and coached them for the match. The girls played well but lost.

Marriage :- I got married with Aruna daughter of Smt. Laxmi Devi and Sh.Laxmi Chand Jain Engineer on 24th November 1968 at Agra. Distinguished persons attended our reception at Jaipur on 26th November and on 30th November 1968 at Jodhpur. Dharam Pal Jain arranged a new Bus for the marriage party to go to Agra. My father was very punctual as such the bus reached at Bharatpur mid way on time and all were surprised as they were not ready. I have learnt punctuality from my father that one should be at time in programmes.

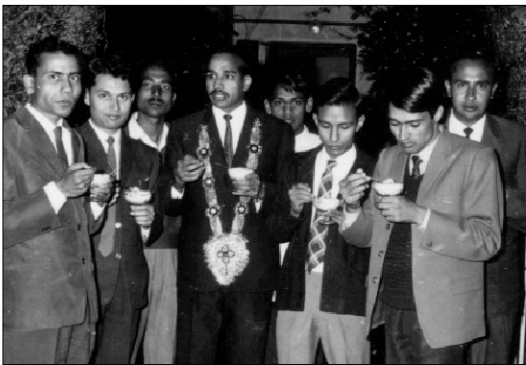
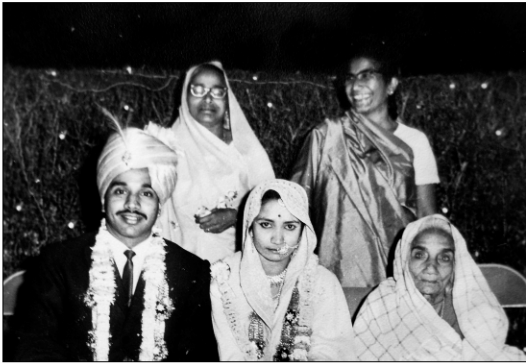

Marriage at Agra, reception at Jaipur & Jodhpur with Judges, family and friends



Chief Justice and Judges :- I had an opportunity to appear before so many eminent Judges viz Justice D.S.Dave, Justice D.M.Bhandari, Justice Jagat Narayan, Justice Kan Singh, Justice L.N.Chhangani, Justice M.L.Joshi, Justice R.D.Gattani, Justice C.M.Lodha, M.L.Shrimal and Justice G.M. Lodha. Justice C.B.Bhargava and others and also to assist stalwart and eminent, senior advocates like C.L.Agrawal, R.K.Rastogi, H.P.Gupta, SagarMal Mehta, N.M.Kasliwal and many others. I also observed senior advocates while they argued in court and presented their cases before the Judge in a cool and efficient manner. I learnt a lot from these personalities, senior advocates also from Delhi.

I am narrating some of the good qualities of Judges before whom I appeared between years 1968 to 1990.

Chief Justice D. S. Dave :- A God fearing, soft spoken and nice gentleman.

Chief Justice D. M. Bhandari :- As the arguments started he would rub his palm on his face which always gave an idea of a favourable result. I appeared many times in his Division Bench and I was also encouraged by him.

Chief Justice Jagat Narain (ICS) :- If convinced he had a good and special quality to change/review his earlier order saying that it was not correct. He proved to be a good judge, Chief Justice, administrator and remained acting Governor.

Justice L.N. Chhangani :- A good human being, he used to point out in court that how much you earn is not important, but how you earn is important in life.

Justice C. B. Bhargava :- As a Judge, he gave full opportunity to the counsel for arguing the matter and would never lose his temperament.

Justice Kan Singh :- He had vast knowledge of civil and criminal law and had a habit of patient hearing. With his good behaviour he was liked by bar & bench.

Justice M. L. Shrimal :- When he was the Government Advocate, he had mastery in facts and had a good habit of catching the deficiencies in pleadings and other technical process. He always encouraged youngsters.

Justice Lehar Singh Mehta :- He was having mastery in Civil, Revenue and also in Criminal law. He always helped youngsters. In cases,

if anybody cited Halsbury's laws of England, he got advantage from his court.

Justice Shri C.M. Lodha :- was a brilliant advocate and eminent Judge and master in all subjects. He was of the view that for a successful lawyer hard work, patience, sincerity and communication skill were necessary.

Justice Guman Mal Lodha :- He was a good advocate and also helped and cooperated with Members of Bar in organizing different functions. He was a great politician and expert in Civil law, Writ petitions and election petitions. He was very kind to me even after his retirement as Chief Justice of Guwahati and as a Chairman of Animal Welfare Board gave me an opportunity of inaugurating its building at Chennai when I was at Madras.

Justice M.L. Joshi :- On his elevation he proved to be a very good judge for his simplicity and patient hearing, good behaviour with the members of the bar and Colleagues.

Justice S.C. Agarwal :- a barrister and an eminent lawyer practicing at Delhi. He was elevated as a judge of Rajasthan High Court. He gave patient hearing having vast knowledge especially of the Constitutional law. He was elevated to Apex Court. He was liked and respected for his good behaviour by the entire legal fraternity.

Justice D.P.Gupta :- He was capable to give dictation in three matters simultaneously. He was elevated to the bench and proved to be a good Judge, Chief Justice and Administrator. He also worked as acting Governor.

Justice N.M. Kasliwal :- was a good civil lawyer and later became expert in constitutional matter. He was my teacher in law at Jodhpur. I also appeared before him in some cases and assisted him in a number of cases of my father. He had lucrative practice in constitutional and civil law. He was liked and respected by all for his patience hearing and good behaviour in High Court and Supreme Court.

Jaipur and Jodhpur Life :- I may state that when I came to Jaipur for some time to practice law I used to sit in the office of Kapoor Chand Singhi. He had four-five associates including his son S.K. Singhi, Tara Chand Jain, Shri Ballabh Das. Suddenly my father suffered heart attack at Jodhpur. I had to leave for Jodhpur immediately and I stayed at Jaipur only for 6 months.

I worked with my father till his elevation as Judge of Rajasthan High Court on 8th August 1970. Thereafter we shifted from the Government House C-14 Air force Road, and I had a separate office at the residence of Poonam Chand Chopra at 92 Polo Ground Paota with friend Uttam Chand Advocate and others.

My father was hale and hearty, however he was heart patient and became unwell in the court while working. After dictating Judgment in four cases on 12th September 1975 I was called into his chamber. He saw with love and affection in my eyes indicating me that I should not worry, everything will be all right. He advised me to do hard work and wished that God might bless me. He went to Delhi and Dr. Padamavati, head of the AIIMS Hospital, checked him and said that he will be all right and would return home on 15th September 1975. On the way there was derailment at near Ladnoo Station, and when he reached at home at Jodhpur in night he was having high fever. Then his regular Doctor Dr. B. Joseph and Dr. P. K. Banarejee attended to him and on 16th night he was insisting to go to court next day, but all of a sudden due to severe cardiac arrest he took his last breath at night on 17th September 1975.

Here I once again record my gratitude for the condolences and support during that period from the Judges, Advocates and Government Officers, Ministerial Staff, Friends and Relatives and all others concerned

When we were preparing to shift on 30.09.1975, one old senior advocate Gandhi Lal Ji Shah along with his son Kailash came to our house for condolence. I asked uncle "why have you come at this age". He humbly told me, "I have come for this condolence for my own satisfaction for a person who has much impressed me. I could not come earlier as I was confined to bed." I have learnt from this that if you go for condolences. It is for your own self satisfaction, and I am following this till today.

I appeared before Justice V.P. Tyagi's Court for more than three months as amicus curiae and learned a lot about criminal law and N.N. Mathur helped me for sending opinions to the Government. I place on record the timely help and assistance given by M.L. Panwar Advocate at Jodhpur and thereafter by advocates N.L. Tibriwal and R.S. Kejriwal at Jaipur.

Dr. Dharam Chand Jain, Dean and Professor of law gave me an opportunity to teach the law students. I taught them in the year 1976 and 1977 and came back to Jaipur due to restoration of High Court Bench at

Jaipur. During the period while preparing topic for teaching I had cleared my concepts about the provisions of Indian Penal Code, Criminal Law Procedure and Civil Law Procedure to a great extent with clarity. I pay my sincere gratitude to Prof. Jain Sahib.

I may point out that on demand for restoration of Jaipur Bench by Rajasthan High Court Bar Association Advocates at Jodhpur, one day we walked on the road in which other advocates and G.M. Lodha also joined and gave ice-cream party to about hundred fifty advocates at ice-cream shop opposite M.L. Shrimal's house (coffee house). All advocates of Jaipur appreciated his gesture.

Rajasthan High Court Bar Association at Jodhpur :- The association had 25-30 advocates only who had come from Jaipur at that relevant time. In those days association elections were not held. President, Secretary and other office bearers were being nominated unanimously for the tenure period. I was also Joint Secretary of the Association. We advocates of Jaipur were residing at Paota area at Jodhpur. We met at least once in a day. We had very good bonding with senior N.M. Kasliwal, S.M. Mehta V.S. Dave H.C. Rastogi, R.P. Goyal B.R. Arora, S.K. Goyal, J.S. Rastogi, C.K. Garg, S.R. Singhi and others.

We went for picnic at Balsamand, Mandore, C.L. Agrawal used to take long walk and give description of place and its historical importance. In this way we enriched our knowledge on the subject with other materials. We used to celebrate New Year, Lohri, Holi, Diwali, Christmas, New Year and other festivals with one another. I can't forget the old good memories of years 1965 to 1977 in my life.

Worked as General Secretary :- Jaipur bench of Rajasthan High Court was restored in the year 1977. Rajasthan High Court Bar Association celebrated Bench Day at Mahaveer High School on 31.12.1977. Souvenir were distributed to the artist Govind Ji, Music Director of Bombay, Mrs. Maya Israni and others by Mrs. Sheela Tyagi wife of Chief Justice V.P. Tyagi.

I have already mentioned names of some eminent advocates of their time published in Rajasthan High Court Bar Association issued on occasion of Rajasthan Lawyer's seminar, inaugurated by former CJI Justice Y.V. Chandrachud in July 1981-82 and the Chairman's Note published in souvenir (attached as annexure), as such I am not mentioning their names here.

Initially in Bar Association there was one set of All India Reporter and some other books. So Advocates could go and sit in the library and note down, but some advocates used to take books and did not return the same for 2-3 days and there was too much resentment for not getting the book. We purchased second set from Justice G. M. Lodha. Then we put on notice board that book could be taken subject to payment of Re.1/- per day for 3 days only and every month, we requested respective advocates to pay the dues.

We also requested fellow members not to sign slip for the issue of book for their friends otherwise the friend would never become member and get advantage. Such members should be deprived from getting the benefit of the Library and facility.

We informed the members that out standing dues against them will be displayed on the notice board and the defaulters will not be eligible to vote or contest the association's election.

I am narrating two incidents. One fellow had to pay 256 rupees dues. I insisted that he should pay the dues, otherwise he will not be entitled to VOTE and he would be debarred from the Association from taking the advantage of the library. Ultimately some advocates including this fellow cleared the dues, accordingly to be eligible for voting.

My friends from Jodhpur did not become members of the association but they wanted books and one of them asked me to give a slip in his name so that he could get the book. With great respect I refused for it and I requested him that if he wanted to take advantage of library, he should become a member. However I brought the books from my house for him, thereafter he and other friends became members.

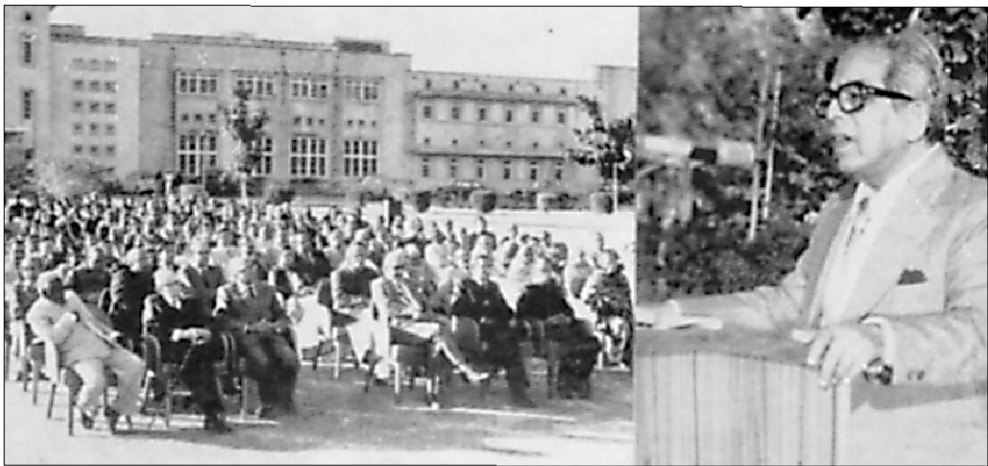
During my tenure as General Secretary of the Association we arranged a good number of parties to honour the different dignitaries. We had subscribed contribution from advocate of below 2 years tenure 10 rupees, and from 5years 25 rupees, from 10 years tenure 50 rupees and from others 100 rupees or more. Earlier it was practice that the senior used to pay subscription/contribution of his juniors, I stopped this system, Then I requested fellow juniors, "we have reduced the fees, so that you can pay your own contribution and feel that you have joined the function in your own way, otherwise next time the possibility is, if you join another senior and he will pay your contribution and in this way you will never have your own existence as an advocate or member of the Association." I also

requested some of the seniors who had got 4-5 juniors, not to pay subscription or contribution fee for their juniors as they themselves had to realize and pay their share. They also realized it and I had not taken share/contribution of their juniors from them for the associations function.

During my tenure as secretary, the office was very systematic in keeping the account and by the second day of the function, I used to put on notice board the accounts mentioning receipts and expenditures. It used to be mentioned in the notice that it must have escaped the notice of members so persons who have not paid the contribution should pay within two days. I may also appreciate the duties discharged by Jagdish and Suman Librarian in the association nicely who were appointed by me.

Bar Council of Rajasthan :- Bar Council is a statutory body constituted under Advocate Act of 1961 and it had 20 members as per the term. The election of Bar Council was conducted in the preferential voting system. Here I will like to narrate the circumstance which forced me to seek election for membership of Bar Council of Rajasthan at an early age in the year 1971. My father had argued a case of one Shikhar Chand Sethi of Railways. He won the case. He wanted to be enrolled as an advocate at the earliest, he went to M.M. Bhandari Secretary of Bar Council to enquire about the process of early enrolment. I went with him and Bhandari informed that it will take 2-3 months and if there is some urgency, enrolment can be made by circulation amongst the members of the Committee on deposit of circulation fee, Sethi applied for enrolment by circulation. Out of three members of the enrolment Committee two were from Jodhpur and third from Ajmer. Sethi approached me for help, I took him to R.C. Maheshwari Sahib the Chairman of the Committee, and requested him for an early action in the matter, but I am sorry to mention here that his behaviour at that moment was not befitting to his status. This incident compelled me to contest for the election.

Worked as Bar Counsellor :- I contested and won the election and with the help and support of two three Advocates of all districts and major support by Advocates of Alwar, Jaipur and Jodhpur. I won the elections. I always remember for their valuable support for winning the election. Thereafter, continued to be a member of Bar Council of Rajasthan and Chairman and also became member of enrolment committee with Advocate Shyamlal of Bharatpur and Ravi Sharma of Alwar upto 1985. In between Jitendra son of Maheshwari applied for enrolment as an Advocate and he was enrolled in a day. When his father R.L. Maheshwari, unknown about his son's enrolment, approached me for quick action, I humbly informed him that his son had already been enrolled, R.L. Maheshwari felt extremely sorry for his earlier behaviour.

With the Chairmanship of D.S. Sisodia, I was appointed a member of Enrolment Committee from the beginning. Thereafter winning subsequent election, I became Chairman of the Enrolment Committee and continued till 1985. I remained Chairman of the Bar Council of Rajasthan in 1985-86. Thereafter, I became member of Bar Council of India, Bar Council India (Trust) and became elected member of Executive and Governing council of National Law School, Bangalore till my elevation.

In my Convenorship, C.L. Agrawal memorial lecture was conducted by Bar Council of Rajasthan and the then CJI Justice Hon'ble P.N. Bhagwati had delivered his first lecture.

25th Anniversary Souvenir was to be published and for final proof reading, some articles were given to one of the members of the editorial board, but the article was not returned after proof reading. The article of Justice N.M. Kasliwal and Justice Milap Chand Jain were not received as they knew that I had good relations with them as such, I couldn't ignore their articles. I was told by others that next election of Chairmanship was going to be held shortly. As such for one reason or the other the same was not given back after proof reading and publication was delayed. Justice M.C.Jain had reduced his article and I told Justice Kasliwal Sahib that I am not going to publish his article. In these circumstances, I got another copy from press and after seeing the proof published, in souvenir, which was released by the former President of India, Gyani Zail Singh Sahib in 1985. We honoured advocates of Rajasthan who had completed fifty years of practice and the advocates who were Swatantra Senani in a function by Law Minister H.R. Bhardwaj. Member Bar Council, M. R. Calla had done a good anchoring in that function.

The Bar Council of Rajasthan with the joint auspices of Bar council of India held work shop on Company Law & Arbitration. Eminent experts, Jurists, & Senior Advocates like F.S.Nariman, Anil Diwan, Soli Sorabjee, K.K. Venugopala, Dr. L.M. Singhvi, Chairman Bar Council, Madhav Menon, Vice Chancellor, National Law School, Bangalore University and other advocates of Rajasthan participated in this workshop which was held at OTS and about 90 delegates participated for 3 days.

Chairman and members of Bar Council, managing trustee and Bar Council of India trust, Senior Advocates and eminent professors, participated in Moot Court competition at Jodhpur, organized with the help of N.N.Mathur member of Bar Council India.

I have a privilege to appear before estimated committee of parliament, New Delhi as Chairman in 1985-86 to discuss the reforms in Judiciary system, later on some of them were implemented.

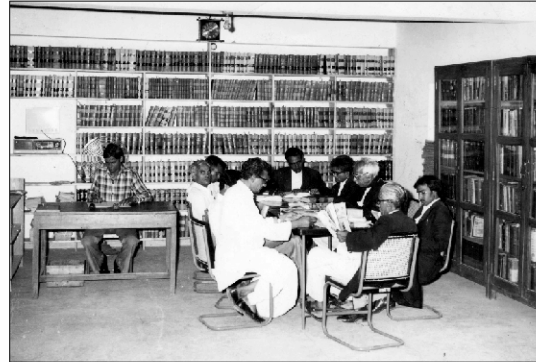

Bar Council of India :- I had an opportunity and privilege to work with senior advocates like Bajpai Sahib of Calcutta, V.C. Mishra from Allahabad Mohanti Sahib from Orissa, V.R. Reddy from Hyderabad, D.S.Patil from Pune and O.P Sharma of Delhi, as Chairman and for some time with K.K. Parasaran, and Soli Sorabji as ex-officios, Chairman and Vice Chairman of the Bar Council of India. With Secretary Shrivastav Sahib, Trust Secretary Tondon, Joshi and other staff members.

I also had an opportunity to work with members in respective Disciplinary Committees consisting of Om Prakesh Sharma, C.L. Sachdeva, S.S. Chawla, Mahendra Singh, Dharya Sheel Patil, B.N. Sharma. I inducted co-opted members with me in different Disciplinary Committees namely M.L. Garg, A.K. Bhandari, J.K. Singhi, R.K. Kala, Kamla Jain and others to hold respective meetings at different places in India like Calcutta, Bombay, Madras, Bangalore, Hyderabad, Delhi, Jabalpur, Allahbad, Nainital, Patna and Indore etc. R.K. Kala my friend, member of the defaulters club left for heavenly abode on 4th June 2015. Till date I know a number of my school, college classmates, players, advocates, brother Judges, sports persons, friends, distinguished personalities who are no more, but one can't go against the wishes of the Almighty and we have to obey his Command. I pray that their soul may rest in peace.

I would also like to mention a rare incident that on my visit to Bombay to attend the disciplinary committee meeting of Bar Council of India in 1988-89. I went to see my sister Meena's husband Dr. Sudhir who had been working in Nanawati Hospital. It was a great and rare occasion for me to see Mother Teresa who had also visited the Hospital at that time. I can't forget her gesture of Saint and Noble soul and my meeting with her in my life.

Mr. Joshi Protocol Officer of Bombay High Court introduced me to Lata Mangeshkar at Bombay Airport. We had interaction where in she told me that one Jain Girl has come in their family.

As the member of Legal Education Committee, with some members I had inspected some Law Colleges of Assam, Delhi, Hanumangarh (Rajasthan) and other places. We always postponed college inspection at Bagh Dogra and other colleges of Assam.

Bar Association of India :- I am a life member and was an executive member from the year 1984 to 1986. I was fully acquainted with

Senior Advocates and learnt from them. A number of advocates appeared before me in my court. I came across Senior Advocates namely K.K.Venu Gopal, Soli Sorabjee, K.K.Parasaran, Mukul Rohatgi, Kapil Sibbal, P. Chidambaram, Dr.L.M.Singhvi and Manu Singhvi, Harish Salve, R.K. Dhawan, Vishwanathan, Indira Jaisingh and others, Dr. Subramaniam Swami and Viako appeared in person. They argued to the point and were very humble in behaviour. I always cherish and get inspiration from their good qualities.

Senior Advocates :- I had an opportunity to deliberate with a number of eminent advocates on their visit to Jodhpur/Jaipur like former Justice C.B. Agarwal, F.S. Nariman, Lal Narayan Sinha, Solicitor General, Naren Dey, and former Justice G. K. Thakkar, Retired Judge, Bombay. I also had great privilege to assist Justice M.C. Chhagla, C.K. Daftari, Ashok Sen, K.K. Sanghi, C.L. Agarwal, R.K. Rastogi, H.P. Gupta, N.M. Kasliwal, M.C. Bhandari, S.M. Mehta and learned a lot from these luminaries.

Tax Bar :- In Tax Department of Rajasthan there were seven regions viz Jaipur, Jodhpur, Udaipur, Bikaner, Ajmer, Kota, Sawai Madhopur in the year 1964.

The Tax Bar of Jodhpur consisted of S.K.Kakkar, F.S.Chordiya, Ashwani Bhatt, P.S. Bhansali, B.M.Kothari and others and from Jaipur, Commissioner Verma, Vaishnav, P.D. Kher, Parashar, Lalchand, Kowal, P.P.Sharma and player O.N. Dixit, R.L.Rohilla, M.L. Pareek, R.L. Kalia, H.R. Lodha O.P.Gupta and many others. Apart from officers in Jaipur Advocate K.C. Patni, M.R. Verma, N.M. Ranka, R.C. Ghiya, B.C.Jain, T.C. Jain, Harish Ajmera, Vishnu Agarwal and many young advocates were there.

Amongst these regions tournaments were held between different advocates/C.A. family and Ministerial Staff members Games viz Badminton, table tennis, Athletics. In such tournaments I was asked to play Badminton for Jodhpur region and after actively playing Badminton once in a year I had played Badminton for almost 4-5 years on the persuasion of my law teacher in college S.K.Kakkar, Advocate. I played singles as well as doubles with Parashar, Sardar Ji and with Commissioner and G. S. Bapna as my partner. After shifting to Jaipur I did not play against Jodhpur region.

USA Visit:- I would also like to mention that when I visited Bombay to see matches of world class Badminton players in 1984 and from there I went to USA without informing my wife Aruna and on return she was annoyed as she was not informed earlier whereas Mrs. Tholia, Sudha and my brother-in-law Ajay knew about the programme, however I felt sorry and tendered unconditional apology. In New York, I stayed with Sunil Tholia and visited Canada to see Suman and Dr. Ashok our neighbours at Jaipur and thereafter I visited a number of places in USA and Europe and came back to India from there after 2 months. The trip was adventurous and marvellous. I had learnt a lot and suggested good things to Government to improve Telephone system like contact call and to Mahaveer School students to improve general knowledge and also understand Traffic system and Medical Facilities and some other facilities. I am thankful and record my appreciation to Sunil and his wife Raj, Padamkala, Rajkumar Tongia, Suman, Dr. Ashok family and others.

I may share one incident on visit to a school, I saw two girls moving round the rope by holding each other from side. All students were jumping but 2 kids were hesitating what is to be seen is that how their teacher encouraged the kids to jump slowly-slowly. After some time gradually they started jumping, it was a memorable motivation.

Thereafter I and my wife Smt. Aruna visited a number of countries abroad after 20 years. I am also very happy and acknowledge my gratitude to Nishant and Tushar, son of my brother-in-law Nishith for looking after Aruna and me very well at U.K. and Europe and Singapore trip respectively. The entire trip was thrilling and joyful.

As High Court Judge Jodhpur/Jaipur :- I was elevated and became Judge of Rajasthan High Court with six other brother Judges on 20.07.1990. I had opportunity to work at Principal Seat at Jodhpur from July 1990 to June 1996. During this period the then Chief Justice of India Hon'ble Justice Kania nominated me as Member Academic Council of National Law School University, Bangalore from 1993 to 1996. I heard illustrious arguments from eminent Seniors like H. M. Parekh, Lekhraj Mehta, Than Chandji Mehta, S.C. Bhandari, M.M. Singhvi, M.C. Bhandari, Murli Manohar Vyas, M.D. Purohit, K.N. Joshi, Marudhar Mridul, Bhim Raj Purohit, Munni Lal Garg, B.L. Purohit, B.L. Maheshwari, Ram Raj Vyas, R.R. Nagori, B.N. Chanda, A.L. Chopra, B.C. Mehta, M.C. Bhoot, R.L. Jangid, Ram Rakh Vyas, N.P. Gupta, D.S.

Sisodia, Rajesh Balia, Narendra Narain Mathur, R.P. Dave, M.L. Panwar, S.S. Bhandawat, N.M. Lodha, Mukesh and a few others at Jodhpur. I also had an opportunity to hear sensible arguments of hard working youngsters like Rajendra Prasad Vyas, M. R. Singhvi, Mahendra Singhvi, J.L. Purohit, Sandeep Mehta, Govind Mathur, Dinesh Maheshwari, Vijay Vishnoi, Manoj Garg, Gopal Krishna Vyas, Vineet Kothari, Sangeet Raj Lodha, R.R. Nagori, A.R. Chopra, M.C. Bhoot, S.S. Mehta, Prakesh Tatia, Suresh Kumbhat, S.K. Ojha, K.L.Thakur, H.R. Panwar, D.C. Mehta and others. A Few of them have been elevated as Judges of High Court and also as Chief Justice. Ganpat Singh Bhandari was Registrar and Sunil Garg was Deputy Registrar at that time.

During the period I was working as a Judge in High Court Jodhpur, I used to go to High Court from our house in the morning at about 10 A.M.

I am giving two instances of that period. My car was over taken by another car of senior brother Judge, as my driver intended to overtake that car. I said to him "Driver sahib, You must know that car with National Flag is not to be over taken."

Secondly my driver was driving the car in the middle line of the road, I told him to drive the car at his side not in the middle line of the road. If the truck comes from opposite side he will not know the Judge was sitting in the car, there will be an accident. The drivers used to leave the cars without closing the National Flag. I told everything to the senior Judges at High Court so that they could instruct their driver accordingly. It is to be appreciated not only driver but sometimes family members/friends also misused the position and took advantage, so it is good that the concerned person should be careful and check them.

In Jodhpur I worked with various Chief Justices Jusitce K. C. Agarwal, Justice G.C. Mittal, Justice A.P. Ravani, Justice M.G. Mukharjee. I had an opportunity to sit in Division Bench with senior judges like Justice M.C. Jain, Justice Kanta Bhatnagar, Justice J.R. Chopra, Justice R.S. Verma and Justice Milap Chandra Jain and for the cases decided by them as a District and Session Judge and their appeal which could not be heard by them but with other senior person. As stated I was hearing with some other senior judge who was not party in lower/appellate court in that judgment. The case was heard and judgment was reserved and in this way two three cases were reserved from respective bench and I was asked to write judgments. While writing judgment I found that in criminal cases sometimes names of accused and

use of weapon and injury caused are partly similar in such circumstances I was not in a position to bifurcate and recapitulate the facts of that particular case with other case for writing judgment. So I requested to brother judges of respective bench not to keep judgment reserved till the decision of earlier case. I was very much relaxed when they agreed with me.

I want to give another example that while sitting in DB. I observed that some advocates at the end of the day, made a request to make their case listed at serial number twenty or more onwards which could not be taken up for hearing as parted and be fixed for next day as the issue involved is simple. This deprived the hearing of cases listed as per cause list. Therefore I persuaded the senior Judge to discontinue this system to which brother judge agreed.

One more point is that one judge used to put hard and strong words in the judgment. In a murder reference when the judgment came to me for approval, it was difficult for me to understand at least twenty words. Then I told brother judge I am not in a position to follow meaning of them then how a common man will follow. That apart according to the advice of my father the judgment should be in a simple language which one can understand easily, as judges are not writing thesis. It was good that he never used hard words in judgment in our Division Bench at least in future.

In Jodhpur we brother judges spent time in lunch hours talking about relevant or irrelevant matters including Advocates in court cases. It was seen after lunch not only advocates but judges also felt they were more fresh.

I may also place on record that on my visit to Sikkim while I was going along with Chief Justice S.N.Bhargava, when our car passed, I saw on the way the public of all age group was standing in bowing position I told brother Justice Bhargava that he is well known and popular, that's why they are doing Namaskar to him. Then he told me that they were doing Namaskar to National Flag. We admire the persons for their patriotism, culture of the area of that time.

I had no occasion while working at Jodhpur to go and sit at Jaipur Bench for six years. I have availed only thirty P.L,14 days on mother's death, came from Chennai and 6 days on the marriage of my son & daughter and about 10 days while availing LTC. I have not availed eight

LTC, with the blessing of Almighty I was not required to take any medical leave in my twenty years of working as Judge and as Chairman Human Rights because of proper advice of Doctor Dixit at Bangalore and there after Dr. Arvind Gupta and Dr. M. Dassora at Jaipur.

Jaipur Bench :- I was transferred to Jaipur Bench where I worked for about 15 months, during the period I had the opportunity of hearing the arguments of a number of Senior Advocates like, Sagar Mal Mehta, K.K. Mehrishi, N.L. Jain, J.K. Mathur, Wali Sahib, K.C. Soni, C.N. Sharma, B.P. Agarwal, Balbhadra Prasad Gupta, R.C. Kasliwal, Bajrang Lal Sharma, Dr. S.K. Tiwari, M.M. Tiwari, J.S. Rastogi, D.K. Soral, Suraj Narain Pareek, D.L. Bardar, and many others. I also had an opportunity to hear the valuable arguments of some good Junior Advocates like R.M. Lodha, J.K. Singhi, A.K. Bhandari, Narendra Kumar Jain, N.K. Maloo, Jagdeep Dhankad, Vimal Choudhary, Mohd. Rafiq, Paras Kuhaad, Vimal Kumar Jain, Manish Bhandari, Ajay Rastogi, Kamalakar Sharma, Ajeet Kumar Sharma, Prem Asopa, Shiv Kumar Sharma, R.P. Garg, Prakash Chand Jain, R.D. Rastogi, Rajendra Soni Gyanendra Bardar, Suresh Purohit, Virendra Dangi, Prem Kishan Sharma, R.C. Joshi, Virendra Bandhu, R.K. Kala, Tripurari Sharma, V.K. Sharma, Rajendra Sharma, Shyam Arya, S.K. Gupta, A.K. Gupta, S.R. Surana, Jagdeep Dhankhar, Kamal Shrimal etc. and Some Advocates who visited Jaipur from outside. Sunil Garg, S.C. Mittal, L.C. Bhadu and Prithviraj were Registrar and Deputy Registrars respectively.

I place on record the assistance provided by my staff particularly Sushil Purohit, my Paras Mehta, my reader Pema Ram, my driver and Lakshmi Chand my Jamadar and all ministerial staff who helped me in discharging my duties as a Judge. I also appreciate PA B.K. Shrivastava, R.K. Bhatt and Protocol Officer Mukesh of Jaipur.

Madras High Court :- I was transferred to Madras High Court and joined there on 19.12.1997 and worked there as a Judge, Acting Chief Justice and Chief Justice till transfer to Karnataka High Court on 30.8.2001. In Madras High Court, I had an opportunity to hear a number of senior advocates namely R.K. Krishnamurty, N.R. Chandran, A.L. Somaiya, Mohan Parasaran, R. Gandhi, Hebibulla Bashe, Ravindra, V.K. Venkatapathy, M. Venkatachalapathi, T.R. Rajagopalan, V.T. Gopalan, V.J. Latha, R. Karuppan, Udaya Holla, F.M. Ibrahim Kalifulla, D. Murugesan, R. Pandian, V. Dhanapalan, R. Sudhakar, S. Manikumar, Prabha Sridevan, Sundraswamy Ramdass, M.N. Sheshadri, K.N.

Puttegowda, S.S. Vijayaraghavan, T.R. Gajagopalan, G. Krishnamurty, K. M. Vijayan, K. V.Venkatapathi, R. Muthukumaraswamy, S. Prabhakaran, R. Vijayakumar, R. Rajasekaran, M.S. Janarthanam. A. Kulasekaran.

I have also worked and interacted with Chief Justice M.S. Liberhan, Justice A.C.Agarwal, and Justice K.G. Balakrishnan respectively and other senior Judges Justice M.S. Janarthan, Justice Kanakaraj, Justice D.Raju, Justice Shivraj.V.Patil and other judges of Madras High Court. I visited house of Justice P.R. Gokula Krishnan former Chief Justice of Gujarat and Justice Rama Jois former Chief Justice of Punjab/Hariyana and Governor. Some senior advocates like A.S. Bopanna, C.S. Vaidyanathan, K.V. Vishwanathan and many others appeared before me. K. Jaya Raman was Registrar General, S. Kumar was Registrar.

I have already appreciated the eminent, senior advocates of Madras High Court Association function my Presidential speech and also in my reference / transfer party with my remark that I have learned a lot from brother Judges and Advocates and Others and enjoyed my stay with happiness and satisfaction. (As annex. 3 and 5) I am happy to mention that with the grace of God, a number of my colleague, advocates have become Hon'ble Judges, Chief Justice of High Courts and also adorned to Apex Court after my retirement.

I had an opportunity to see and interact with about twenty five Chief Justice of India right from Justice Y.V.Chandrachud and about Eighty Five Supreme Court Judges, and a large number of Chief Justices and Judges of different High Courts. I have learnt a lot from them.

I also worked with more than nineteen officers of Indian Administrative Services and about twelve officers of Indian Police Service in different Tribunal, Criminal Board, Human Right Commission, Lok-ayukta office and while conducting enquiry of Mr. Basha in Coimbatore blast case. In my view officers were good, hard working and efficient persons. They have work culture in comparison to our officers of Rajasthan, of course with some exceptions.

I had attended a number of functions and given lectures, messages on Rajasthan Conclave Programme in September 2000. On completion of fifty years of active practice of senior advocate K.K. Parasaran on 19.08.2000. On 50 years celebration of Supreme Court Exhibition on 23.08.2000, and inauguration of Tirupati Balaji's T.T.P Branch at Madras

on 18.07.2000, on 6th South Chakra on 23.08.2001, on Silver Jubilee of Bhasha Sangam of UP in presence of Governor Anshuman Singh and Chief Justice of Uttrakhand and other dignitaries on 25.08.2001 at Madras.

I am happy and appreciate the work of my Private Secretary PA Hari, Mohan and others who have prepared about 100 speeches, messages and talks during four years tenure at Madras in four binding small books.

I also mention that the Governor of Tamil Nadu Ms. Justice Fatima Beevi used to call foreign dignitaries visiting Madras and host dinner in their honour, but two three times I did not attend dinner at her invitation and then she asked me why I was not attending. Thereafter, I joined at her invitation. I extend my sincere thanks to one and all, particularly to Justice Fatima Beevi.

I may mention that I was called twice from Prime Minister's office during the tenure of Hon'ble Atal Bihari Vajpayee Sahib for Acting Governor's charge for some time as Governor of Tamil Nadu was going for leave for Haj and for eye operation.

I told them on phone that I will administer oath to Governor of other state who can take additional charge. Then I administered oath to Governor Hon'ble Shri. C.Rang Rajan, the Governor of Andhra.

Karnataka High Court :- I was transferred on 31st August 2001 to Karnataka High Court from Madras High Court. During the period I had an opportunity to meet and welcome a number of foreign Judges, eminent jurists and delegates in High Court at Bangalore. A case of Madam Jayalalita was transferred from Madras to Karnataka State. On inquiry I was informed that I must be happy as this transfer was made to nullify the effect of murmuring at that point of time. I had an occasion to meet Former Chief Justices of different High Courts stationed at Bangalore, Justice V.S. Malimath, Justice S. Mohan, Justice M. Rama Jois, Justice K.A. Swami, Justice N.Y. Hanumanthappa, Justice B.N. Misra and also Justice Gopal Sri Ram of Malaysia Judge Federal Court England and Justice Rahman Judge, Supreme Court of Bangladesh who sat with me and watched the proceedings in court number one. I worked with number of brother and sister judges during the period and enjoyed their company. On opening of the new court and in functions, I had an opportunity to visit a number of places and also interact with a number of District Judges,

Lawyers, MLA, MLC, MP and officers of District members of staff and public at large. They were kind enough to hear me patiently and Judges followed my suggestions to maintain rule of law.

I had an opportunity to open advocates VVIP ward of 12 beds at Victoria Hospital for advocates constructed by Advocate Cooperative Society, Bangalore on 05.10.2001. I have already narrated about the brother and sister Judges, Eminent Advocates, Senior Lawyers, Presidents of different Bar Associations, Ministerial Staff and others in reply to my welcome/farewell address in Karnataka High Court on my Superannuation.

Foreign Sovereign :- In Karnataka initially I was not attending functions on invitation by Governor. She asked me as to why I was not joining these functions. I told her about the limitations of a Judge but she persuaded me to join which gave me a wonderful and a rare opportunity to meet interact and dine with Sovereigns, The Heads of the Countries and Prime Ministers of about 12-13 Different Countries. Once again I place on record my gratitude for the gesture of the respected Governors Madam Rama Devi and T.N. Chaturvedi for providing me these great opportunities from time to time.

Dr. N. Mahalingaru of Tamil Nadu association invited me on civic function to felicitate Mr. Vishwanathan Anand on 01.01.2001 at Chennai, who had recently been crowned to be the World's Chess Champion at Tehran. I felt honoured to put a crown on his head, the son of the soil. I appreciated and congratulated him stating that his mind was working like a computer at the age of 5 years. Everybody with claps had given standing ovation to him. I saw sister Justice Prabha Sridaven. I was called and introduced to her, then she told me "I am his aunt". This fact I did not know.

I had an occasion to attend yearly Conferences of Chief Justices of different High Court for five years respectively and got Honour to attend dinner at President House hosted by Hon'ble President. In one such conference a resolution was passed on October 2003, of Chief Justice B.S.Reddy of Andhra Pradesh, Chief Justice V.K. Gupta of Himachal Pradesh under my Chairmanship, a committee was constituted by Chief Justice India to examine the recommendation of Committee Report (Justice Malimath Committee) and also to consider suggestion, ways and means to implement the recommendation of First National Judicial

Committee (Justice Shetty's Committee). The report was submitted in time and approved by Chief Justice Conference, later the said recommendations were implemented.

I may mention that in Karnataka Hon'ble Chief Minister Sh. S.M. Krishna called me on the retirement of Governor Hon'ble Smt. Rama Devi and said it is likely that Central Government will take some time in finalizing new Governor so I have to be ready and come from Jaipur to take charge as Acting Governor for some time. But I respectfully told him that It will be better, if I administer oath to other person. Soli Sorabji also came to find out the situation, place and also talked to me. He did not give his consent then Sh. T.N. Chaturvedi came and I administered oath to him as the Governor.

The students of first year and second year of National Law School, Bangalore had called Amzad Ali Khan for entertainment programme in the year 1977 from their own resources. Students of Jodhpur Univeristy gave me an opportunity to hear the great poet Kavi Neeraj at Jodhpur. I appreciate their gesture for performing the programme without any charge, of course now the time has changed.

I would also like to share one more instance that a Professor from Jodhpur University S.P.S. Bhandari and his worthy son Prem Bhandari invited me to USA on behalf of Jain Community North New York for a function in 2002 but I could not go there due to work load, I gave thanks with regret.

Abroad:- I had also an opportunity to attend conference of Chief Justices of different Countries with former Chief Justice, Justice P.N. Bhagwati as a representative of UNO at Srilanka. I also appreciate the work of my P.P.S Shri Narayan (Dist. Judge), Raghavendra Upadhyay, Smt. Noorunnisa Begum and others who have prepared about 203 speeches messages and talks during my three years tenure at Karnataka which is recorded in six binding small books.

Shravanabelagola :- I have visited 'Shravanabelagola' a number of times to get the blessings of Swami Charu Kirtiji. I am enough fortunate to attend Mahamastikabhishek in the year 1994 when I was Judge of Rajasthan High Court and member National Law School in University at Bangalore and in 2006 when I was Chairman of Human Rights Commission. Swamiji was very kind to me and Honoured me in presence

of Acharya Vardhman Sagar Ji and other Acharyas and Muniraj in 1994 and again in 2018 with my family. Once again I express my sincere gratitude for his kindness and blessings.

I was fortunate to Honour respectively on this centenary year to one Sh. Ganesh Ayyer in a function organized by Philips C. Jessup International Law Moot Court Competition at Chennai on 07.02.1999 and advocate Sh. K. Rajgopalacharya at Trichnapallai on completing his 75 years of active practice on 20.10.2000 and Justice Sri Nittoor Srinivasa Rau at Bangalore. I also attended the function with Former Chief Justice of India and other Judges, where Association felicitated about 70 advocates aged 77 years who had completed more than 50 years of regular practice. This was a great experience.

I had visited the number of places in Kerala when Justice A.R. Lakshmanan was the Chief Justice and in Andhra also when Justice Anil R.Dave was Chief Justice. In South I found persons with whom I had come in contact are simple and they have maintained their culture and traditions. They are conscious of cleanliness and environment. I had noticed that in every opening of new courts/ functions were planted 9 to 10 trees by officials of Judiciary and Government, with Administrative Judge, S.P. and Concerned MLA/MLC of the Area in court premises, which is maintained by Court persons. I was fortunate to plant trees in more than 200 hundred courts in seven years of my stay in South. This was good learning to me how to preserve environment and to be friendly with nature. On account of this practice, I was motivated and as Chairman, Human Right Commission, planted 2 to 3 trees in every legal awareness programme/function for 5 years (2005 to 2010).

Chairman Human Rights Commission, Shimla :- On my superannuation from Karnataka on 19.10.2004 I was neither enrolled as a senior advocate and nor involved in Arbitration Workm however I was entrusted with the work of Chairman, Human Rights Commission, Himachal Pradesh at Shimla where I joined on 24-11-2004. I had worked with brother members B.S. Chouhan, I.D. Bali, and Sister Chandra Prabha Negi and Vinod Gupta as Secretary, I.G.P. and DFO Negi and others in the office, I had a nice time there I met Chief Justice V.K. Gupta, Justice L.S. Panta and other brother judges of Himachal Pradesh and some dignitaries. During my stay, I also met the then President of India

Dr. Abdul Kalam at Governor's house with Governor Justice V.S. Kokje of Himachal Pradesh at dinner.

I narrate some instances of Shimla in January 2005 while I was taking a meeting of the officers of different departments and IGP. I just asked how many wards are there in Shimla. They answered there are 13 wards. Then I told them to provide me 4 to 5 policemen for each ward I was asked for what and why do you require. I told them that I want services of 4 to 5 persons from reserve police so that they can collect and deposit electricity, water and telephone charges monthly by visiting once, this will help the old age residents whose kids are not staying with them. This will also help the police to know the whereabouts of the persons. Old person would feel happy and in this way Police will become friendly. It will be helpful for the Police at the time of any investigation. With great surprise the IGP issued directions within two days, by this immediate action respective residents of the area got great relief particularly as in those days this online facility was not available. Once again I appreciate the gesture of Inspector General of Police.

As per direction of Commission in a case of compensation on damaged building where two persons died, Government issued necessary directions to concerned to peruse dilapidated buildings and repair them on priority basis. Similarly the Commission advised to water works department to check and systematize supply of clear, clean and unadulterated water.

One more direction was to be brought to the notice pertaining to death in Medical Hospitals. A Committee was formed of Head, Superintendent, CMHO with concerned Doctor to hold necessary inquiry to fix the responsibility of the liability of concerned person and send the report to take appropriate action in compliance to the direction of the Commission. Thus appropriate relief has been given without approaching Commission again and again. I appreciate the gesture of Police Department, Concerned IGP and Government. I also attended some functions and also the function pertaining to Hindi Week by Punjab National Bank.

I also narrate one more example that on seeing Photograph & News of joining by me as Chairman, Human Rights Commission at Shimla, a fellow came to meet me next day, and said, "when you had come to Shimla as Manager in year 1978 with Rajasthan Badminton Team. I had taken a

group photograph of the players, that photo is in my Shop and your face is resembling with photo I have come to congratulate you and this was surprising for me.

Chairman, Rajasthan Human Rights Commission :- I took charge as Chairman of Human Rights Commission Rajasthan on 16.07.2005 and worked with brother members D.S. Meena, Justice Jagat Singh and Pukhraj Servi. The secretaries were R.K. Sharma, N.R.Yadav, Girriraj Singh and IGP Jaswant Sampat, Malhotra, Morris Babu, N.R.K. Reddy, Shriniwas Jagga respectively Sub-Inspector Deepa and other officers were Vikram, Amar Chand Sharma, Navin Dua and Ministerial and other staff. I have tried my best to discharge my duties as Chairman and with help and co-opreation of brother member's officials and for that I am fully satisfied. I have tried to educate with a little endeavour the concept of Human Rights to the respective elite gathering in short by following ways:

As we all know the circumstances rights from Magna Carta (Charter of Liberty) we had seen two world wars and thereafter as per conference at San Francisco. The Universal Declaration of Human Rights 1948, 10th December was declared as Human Rights Day.

The Universal declaration of Human Rights has 30 Articles. On 26th January 1950 our Constitution came into force and all the 30 Articles have been incorporated in our Constitution as per Article 12 to 28 and remaining were incorporated in Directive Principles of State Policy, meaning thereby all Articles mentioned in Universal Declaration have been inserted in our Indian Constitution long back.

We have three wings Legislature, Judiciary and Executive. Persons of all the three wings have to discharge their duties for betterment of the public at large as per the Jurisdiction and they are equal, nobody is superior or inferior to anybody and for Democracy the media is the fourth pillar.

The Parliament enacted the protection of Human Rights Act 1993 (Act.No.10 of 1994) which came into force on 8th January 1994.

Central Committee consists of PM/Opposition Leader/ Speaker/ Chairman of Rajya Sabha/Home Minister, they select a retired Chief Justice of India as its Chairman, One retired Judge, Supreme Court, One retired Chief Justice of High Court and two persons having knowledge and experience of Human Rights as its members.

Similarly State committee consists of CM/ Speaker / Home Minister/ Opposition Leader. They select one retired Chief Justice, One High Court Judge, One District Judge and two members having knowledge and experience of Human Rights as its members. Now in State Human Rights Commission instead of five persons, now three persons are there either High Court Judge or District Judge and only one Member with Chief Justice as per amended Act No. 43/2006. They have to consider cases of Human Rights violation as per list II and III in the VII Schedule.

In view of the Section 21-A of the Act Rajasthan constituted State Human Rights Commission on 18th January 1998 and Chairman and members were appointed in March 2000. For one reason or the other. Former Chairperson Justice Kanta Bhatnagar had to resign in about three four months and thereafter Justice Sagir Ahmad also had to resign after about 30 months. The post was kept vacant. On 6th July 2005 it was reconstituted and I came from Himachal Pradesh and Joined as Chairman on 16th July 2005.

Commission is an independent and autonomous Body. It has all powers of Civil Court, can take cognizance suo moto and grant interim relief. If recommendations are not accepted, they have to give reasons and every year report is to be submitted and placed in Assembly. For any grievance of the order passed by Commission the same can be challenged in High Court by either party.

Apart from disposal of the complaints to logical conclusion against Human Rights violation, the Commission interacted with public at large as well as with the officials of various Departments. The Commission also inspected and visited some of the Police Stations, Jails, General Hospitals, Hostels under Social Welfare Department, etc and suggested required improvement and regular monitoring by their respective in charges.

One of the functions of the Commission is to spread human rights literacy among various sections of the society and to promote awareness regarding safeguards available for the protection of these rights, through publications, seminars and other available means, so as to enable them to know about their duties and rights in this regard. The Commission published 18 books out of 32 small books on different subjects authored by me pertaining to Human Rights for public awareness and the rest were published by Gaurav Jain in the memory of his beloved grandfather

Justice J. P. Jain Some schools informed that teachers are discussing the respective subject with students during zero hour. I am happy to say that about 35 schools have responded that they have kept these booklets in their school libraries for the benefit of the teachers and students till 2007. Some of the individuals / institutions / NGOs' have requested the Commission and sought permission for the reprint of the articles published in the booklets on various subjects regarding Human Rights, on their own behalf about more than one lakh books have been published by them and distributed in Schools, NGOs' and other places on various occasions up to 2010 & thereafter also It is a good sign of their concern regarding awareness of Human Rights among the citizens.

It is said “ignorance of law is no excuse” but nobody has full knowledge of the Constitution and various Acts made by the Parliament and Assembly. In India apart from Constitution Parliament Assembly has power to pass the Acts as per the need of public welfare.

Apex court had decided a number of issues and points through several landmark Judgments that brought within the ambit of Article 21 of the Constitution, several other rights including Directive Principles of State Policy of the Constitution. The people of this country owe a great debt to the Apex Court for coming to rescue of every person in so far as protection of “Life” and “Liberty” is concerned.

To my mind effective human rights education can produce changes in values and attitude, behaviour and also develop knowledge and analytic skill with attitude of brotherhood. The sensitization of human rights in day to day life will help in treating others as we expect others to treat us.

As stated it is made clear that Commission is not a parallel Court and works for Good Governance. Commission can interact with the officers and concerned officers of different departments and request them to do their work sincerely and sensibly.

Rajasthan State Human Rights Commission is supposed to be an institution meant for promoting and protecting the Human Rights of the people of the State, thereby fostering the administration for good governance. Good Governance is guided by the principles of accountability and commitment to Human Rights.

I had an opportunity to visit a number of schools, law colleges and Universities, officials, and NGOs'. I emphasized the importance of duties

in such programme on the basis of small books and Article 51 of the constitution, which contains the duties of the citizens through various seminars, workshops and programmes. In such programs you not only enrich your knowledge but also create greater awareness as learning is a continuous process. As a student you are dealing with social and connected problems. You can very well provide the service as you are fully aware of the problems of the weaker section of the society. You can resolve the dispute, through negotiation, reconciliation, mediation, between the parties. And I hope the students of Law will join together and will help the needy persons.

I also emphasized to schools, officials, NGOs' and all concerned, that everybody is talking of his rights and nobody is bothering about his duties, whereas Rights and Duties are co-related.

Mahatma Gandhi emphasized their importance as per letter written to Julien Huxley in 1947 "I learned from my illiterate but wise mother that all rights to be deserved and preserved come from duty well done. Thus, we can enjoy rights when we do the duty as citizen of the world. For this is one fundamental statement, perhaps it is easy enough to define duties of man and woman or co-relate every right to some corresponding duty which is first preformed".

The Commission has also inspected and visited some of the Police Stations, Jails, General Hospitals, Hostels under Social Welfare Department etc. and suggested required improvement and regular monitoring by their respective in charges. The Commission is also publishing quarterly news letter.

In this way the Commission is trying to create atmosphere and environment conducive to the development and protection of human rights. But without the effective support of the society no Commission or organization can run effectively.

I am happy to share that a number of law students of different law Universities of India have made internship with me and students made 71 projects on different subjects out of them 42 PPT projects are available on website www.justicenagendrakjain.com. They exhibited their projects in respective colleges and NGOs' are also projecting them in creating legal awareness accordingly. Once again I appreciate the hard work of the law students.

I may also mention that number of NGOs like Koshish Sansthan, Cancer (Mrs. Kapoor, Mrs. Gupta) Mahaveer Cancer Director, Anila Kothari, Gemawat, Karnawat, R.P. Tayal, Solanki, Usha, Kusum Patni, Subhash Motwani of Jaipur Cancer Relief Society, mentally retarded persons by Prayas Sansthan (Jitendra), Sushila (HIV), Traffic Road Safety Prerna Arora, Bal Bhavan, Charanjeet Dhillon, Anil Kavi Raj (Rajasthan Jan Manch), Manish & Namrata Saxena worked to save environment and animals. Mohitash, Direndra Bhatnagar, Reddy, Chetan, Dr. Anil Aneja of visually impaired Training & Development Delhi and various District Legal Aid Committees of State, Karnataka, Human Rights Commission, Himachal and many others also worked in this direction. From that time they were doing Yeomen service to the society and before start of their function/ seminar or get together they also take pledge for 51A of the Constitution.

I had an opportunity to meet discuss, interact with students, law students, officers of different departments in about 180 visits at different centers not only in Jaipur but also in Jodhpur, Udaipur, Ajmer, Alwar, Bharatpur, Dholpur, Bikaner and other places. I had also opportunity to visit and conduct the programme on awareness and educate about the duties as envisage of Article-51A of the constitutions on my various visits at Agra, Delhi, Indore, Shimla, Madras, Bangalore. I used to give some examples on respective topics wherever I had occasion to say about Human Rights. I also appreciate the persons who are working for awareness of Cancer patients. They are doing good work Koshish Sansthan has cured 83 ladies suffering from breast cancer and they are made as common stream in the society. I am also mentioning the names of some institutions that are visited for this purpose.

Trainees of Training Programme, Positive women network, Moot court competition in different law colleges and Universities, Rajasthan Pension Samaj/Association, World Vision India Jaipur, CUTS, OTS, Maharani College, Jain Samaj, Dalit Adhikar Kendra, Jodhpur Cancer Relief Society, Madhuri Braj Varis Seva Kendra, Bharitya Vidhya Mandir, Child Labour on Labour Day, Miss Jaipur Beauty Contest, Vidhyasthali Law College, Jaipur National University, Anuvrath Sansthan, Vishya Bharti Sansthan, Ladnu, Hadcon, Rotary & Lions Club, AG Office, NCC Annual Training Programme, Police Academy, Rajasthan Jan Manch and Press Club, Culture Society of Rajasthan, Mahaveer

School, Subodh School, Central Academy, Tagore Public School, Ryan International School, Indian Gerontological Association, Fifth International Summer school of Jain, Jaipur Public School, Digamber Jain Social Group Federation, Digamber Jain Mahasamiti, UN convention on Disabilities; implications for visually impaired Training & Development Delhi, Institute of Public Administration, IIPA New Delhi, Wings of Research in local Development, UGC Centre for Study of Social Exclusion and Inclusive Policy, Gyan Jyoti Children's Academy, Maharshi Dayanand Law College, Words of Research and Local Development, Jain Vishva Bharati University, Jai Narayan Vyas University of Jodhpur, Social Science Research Centre, University of Rajasthan, Pandit Jhabar Mal Sharma Memorial Speech Function, Jaipur Pensioners Hitkari Sahakari Samiti, Jain Social Group Capital Jaipur, Social Security Foundation, Seth Motilal Law College Jhunjhunu, Shree Jain Ratna Yuvak Parishad, Jaipur, Akashdeep Sansthan, World Aids Day, Fifth Annual Review meeting of Tobacco Cessation Centre, Diamond Jubilee Celebration National Symposium on Cancer, Diagnosis, Awareness, Treatment, Workshop on Law Enforcement Officers at Revenue Office Ajmer, Training Institute, Workshop on Human Rights Education, Child Labour and Women Trafficking and Systematic improvements for better protection of Human Rights of Women and Children, National Seminar on Human Rights and Duties: Retrospectes and Prospects, Rajasthan Jain Sathiya Parishad, Anurag Sangeet Sansthan, National Seminar of Human Rights Education at Gandhi Viyda Mandir, Sardarshahar, Bright Horizon School, National Seminar of Human Rights awareness at Bhartiya Vidya Bhavan, Vidya Ashram Jaipur, Aadarsh Mahila B.Ed MahaVidhya at Mahaveerji, Sophia College Ajmer, Vimukti Girls School, Dr. Veena and Dr. Gautam of Zambia, Biyani Girls College, IIS University, Save the Children, People watch Tamilnadu, Tamilnadu Police Academy Chennai, Judicial Academy High Court Madras and Karnataka, Amity University and some more institutions and many other places.

I appreciate organizations/institution for their concern on Human Right Education and to inculcate human values in youth. Once again I congratulate the members of various institutions/NGOs for their work, help and contribution, co-operation and Yeomen services to the society with the hope that they will continue and join together in awareness programme with dedication and determination.

The effective human rights education can produce changes in values, behaviour, also develop knowledge and analytic skill with attitude of brotherhood. The sensitization of Human rights in day to day life will help in treating others as we expect others to treat us.

The basic human values are honesty, industry, clarity in thought, discipline and sense of moderation. One should always live in the present moment, follow the moderate path, act continuously with sincerity and accept the fruit of action as God's gift and move forward are the guiding principles of successful life. To my mind the basic concept of Human Right that one should behave in the same manner as he expects from others to behave with him and if he discharges his duty properly then violation of Human Right will minimize.

I often gave examples, some are :- I went to Madurai to attend a function on my returning back to Madras, somebody requested my PS that the Chief may visit our institution/place. I overheard and visited the institution/ place. I was told that they were teaching children of primary class of very backward families. I may narrate an instance that a small girl of five year age heard a case of feticide, as she was taught by her teacher, there is no difference between girl and boy child and hearing the conversation she called her mother and teacher. She said, "if you don't want the child then my mother and I will keep the girl child, because of the awareness by these small teachings of NGOs teacher the young girl implemented the advice of her teacher."What she has said, it is appreciable. By these small teachings an illiterate became aware about the reality of the life. Mr. Henry was the director of "Pupils watch institution of Human Rights Education", at that time it was working in 10 states.

Even educated persons have the habit of chewing Pan Masala / Gutkha which they put in their hand and after rubbing consume it. One brother Judge was also in this habit of taking about 40 pouches of Zarda / Pan Masala every day. It seems that earlier when he was an advocate of the company, the company instead of giving fees to him had provided Zarda / Pan Masala pouches. Then on advice, Justice Chopra prepared homemade mouth freshener recipe like sounf, supari and elayachi etc. Brother Judge gradually left this bad habit. The message is given to all that one should not be slave of his habit

I may give one other instance that in three days Conference of blind persons conducted by UNICEF and others at Jaipur, about three hundred delegates from all over India with Reddy and professor of Delhi University had participated along with me and others.

We distributed a consolidated book of Mahila Adhikar, Daliton ke Adhikar, Balkon Ke Adhikar and Giraftari written by me. At the point of time somebody said, "why are you giving the books to them, how they will read?" It hurt me and the incharge person sitting beside me also over heard. I was surprised to see that on next day Dr. Anil and Chetan prepared books in Brel-lipi and distributed to all the delegates. It was a good answer for those persons who are having eyes. I used to emphasize with this example that persons who go abroad while sitting in car put their safetybelt, don't use mobile, stop the car according to signals and do not throw any waste/litter on the road. But as soon as they come to India they behave like Indian citizens.

Another instance, Anurag Sangeet Sansthan, Jaipur used to organize a regular three days programme of All India Sangeet Competition like Dance, Music, Tabla and different categories for blind every year. I used to attend the programme. I noticed many good things and qualities of competitors. After their performance from the stage they properly selected their shoes without any disturbance. A good gift of God to them, but we while attending some Functions/Condolences are always in searching mode. We also tried to test their eyes through one Mahaveer Chandwad by calling Doctor of Anand Hospital but as per opinion nobody could get eyesight improved excepts transplantation.

Similarly family members are responsible for the case of feticide matters as they go to the Doctors. Of course doctors are also responsible for not guiding them properly. So far as child marriage is concerned only parents are responsible to arrange marriages of their child.

On a telephone call to any father, as per the instruction the receiver says to the caller, father is not here. Similarly innocent children say to the guest who has come to meet his father that his father has told child to tell the guest that he is not at home. Please see what message we are giving to kids and what they are learning. So it is necessary that one should not live in hypocrisy. We have to change our attitude and mind set. I can give so many good examples which I have told in several functions.

The endeavour of the Commission is to do its best to protect the human rights of every person in general and particularly among the vulnerable sections of the society with the help and co-operation of all concerned in the state.

It is seen that now a days our students are very knowledgeable, intelligent with good IQ. They can compete with any other student of the world. But they need more Human Values (Sanskar) as computer can't give Sanskar, only one can learn with the conduct of his Mother-Father, teachers in the school, society surroundings and functions pertaining to moral human values and ethics.

I can not resist to mention that a consolidate book of 'Mahilao ke Adhikar', 'Dalito ke Adhikar', 'Balko ke Adhikar', 'Girafitari' were distributed even at the time of condolence meeting by their family members on the respective death of Smt. Anguri Devi, Dharmapal Jain, Harprasad Jain, Nemichand Jain, Sakalchand Mehta on person's death by their family members. It is a great tribute to the departed soul and also their concern for creating awareness.

It is also seen that the students are very ambitious and because of this, they have fear, ego, frustration and lack of tolerance. They also can't forebear their defeat in case they lose or they are not successful for want of tolerance and lack of discipline. Therefore they have to learn from their defeat and should behave patiently. Due to the habit of chatting on mobile in social media culture it will be difficult to find out correct news and to take correct decision in life.

I said regularly in my lectures at O.T.S and in continuation to the bureaucrats and officers that they should not use their power in very vigilant manner. They should meet the public as they have fixed timing between 2.00 to 3.00 and 3.00 to 4.00, but they are busy in other work to maintain law and order problem. So on the pretext they can't give time to meet them, in the circumstances the complainant instead of his complaint talked against the concerned officers behaviour so one should be careful to avoid to get any kind of curse. To my mind good positive thought also helps in Good Governance, Without keeping position of the post in your head you must discharge your duties which will help in Good Governance.

In India there are so many reasons like poverty, lack of education, unemployment, unhealthy customs and traditions, slackness and not

having positive attitude. Political and administrative will is more required and honestly to be implemented for good governance.

Out of 32 small books written by me in my one book "Ahinsa Non-violence and Human Rights in Indian Culture with special reference to Jainis, was appreciated by Acharaya Vidhyanand Ji Muniraj and Acharya Mahapragya and was blessed with their kind message. The book was translated in English by S.C.Jain Director International Summer School for Jain Studies New Delhi, Dr. P.C.Jain, Prof. S.P. Jain, Saroj Jain former Professor of Bio-Chemistry title of Ahinsa non violence and Human Rights in Indian Culture with special reference to Jainis another book Human Rights and Jain Dharm forward note was given by Dr. Shivraj.V.Patil Former Supreme Court Judge and Member National Human Rights Commission and appreciated the work of the Commission. The other four books contain about 215 rulings on different topics on various issues of Supreme Court and other book Article-14 Right to Equality, Law of Precedent, Gender Justice in Employment & in Profession, Empowerment of Women, Directive Principles of State Policies, Public Interest Litigations and others with respective forwarding note by Justice N.M. Kasliwal, Justice M.L. Shrimal, Justice Jagatnathan, Justice R.C. Chouhan, Justice Y.R. Meena and Professor S.P. Jain. These booklets were published by Gaurav Jain in the memory of his beloved grandfather Justice J.P. Jain. Some of the books were distributed to concerned persons for legal awareness. I had requested in my one booklet "Right and Duty" with reference of article-51A of the constitution that all religions preach and practice upliftment of our life style and no religion talks of exploitation. All the great respected saints of all religions of our country, Acharya Dharma Guru, are preaching and inculcating good human values, so one may become a good citizen. Even if they taught them about the duties as per Article 51-A of the constitution then it will have greater effect in common man's life, because all the religions are squeezed in Article 51-A of our Constitution. All the religions talk about upliftment of humanity and not for exploitation. So one should be polite, humble and with non-violence attitude and should discharge his duties with sincerity for happy and purposeful living.

I also emphasized in my lectures that today in materialistic days everything is available except Human Values. In earlier days by living and maintaining relations one felt pleasure whereas now life is like formality, so one should not compare old times and comparison with past working of Court also. Now it is an age of technology which was not there earlier. Everybody knows what is right or wrong. So it is one's duty to take correct decisions and implement them as per their conscience. I may also mention that I was always reluctant to speak with media, however as Human Right Chairman Shri Kalpesh Yagnik and Shri Shyam Acharya Ji and some others have taken my interview.

I have always given some slogans like "Be aware of rights and Be devoted to the duties", "Humanity is the sensitivity to the unknown". I also appreciate the work of my PA Jitendra Pawar and Pradeep Goyal who have prepared about 217 lectures, speeches, messages and talks during my five years tenure as Chairman, Human Rights Commission, in fifteen binding small books. After 2010 every month I gave about two lectures in school Law College, N.G.O, OTS, Police Academy and other places on different topics, legal awareness, literacy and human rights. Pradeep Goyal have compiled about 220 lectures in various books up to 2017.

Shri Mahaveer Ji :-

I also share one fact in this book that Raj Kumar Kala, the then President N. K. Sethi inducted me in Mahaveer ji committee in the year 1999. However, in the year 1976 Gaindi Lal Ji Shah, Vice President and R. C. Kasliwal also asked me to work as member in Mahaveer Ji committee in place of my father who was member of the committee since 1958 and died in 1975. I regretted as I could not join at that time, later I worked as the member of the Committee, Officials and Ministerial staff with great satisfaction.

With the grace of God and blessing of Acharya 108 Shri Vidhyanandji Muniraj and cooperation, support and help of members of the Prabandh Karni Committee, Shree Mahavirji, I was elected un-animously as President of Shri Mahaveerji on 26.02.2011 for three years.

I express my gratitude to all the members specially members R.K. Jain, Advocate Tarun Jain and his friend Milap Chand Dandiya. I had tried my best to discharge my duties to my satisfaction. God was kind

enough to get some substantial work done through me during my tenure in Shri Mahaveerji. I am narrating a few:-

I had experienced in three years that the discourses, CHATURMAS period is invaluable and helps us in having self discipline and to practice values of self realization in life. Examples of Good Players For Inculcating Sports Man Spirit In Life

- Justice N.K. Jain

I may state here that my father in his college days, before starting legal practice at Rajgarh in 1937, was a good player of tennis and hockey in Agra College, Agra. As an advocate, he also used to play Tennis regularly in the premises of Rajgarh Court. Thereafter, on shifting to Alwar in 1941, he played Tennis regularly at Jai Kishan Club, then in Jaipur at Jai Club and thereafter at Ummed Club Jodhpur till 1967. From him I have inherited the quality of playing games and had a desire to be known as a person with sportsman's spirit from the very beginning.

To my mind in games and sports, only one party/individual is the winner. But all the participants can develop team spirit. One might have played, better than the winner, but winner is a winner which depends upon the day also. What is important is winning part should not be on head and losing should not be taken to heart. We must learn from our mistakes. This spirit will always be helpful to everyone in real life. It will also help to control our emotions, ego and frustration.

I may narrate example/ illustration of two great sports persons of India's top Badminton players Suresh Goel and Prakash Padukone. One match was between Suresh Goel and Tan Yee Khan of Malaysia, at Jaipur. Suresh was almost in winning position and line man Judge gave the judgment on a point against Tan Yee Khan, but Suresh said that it was right. The umpire agreed and Suresh lost the match but the entire audience and even Tan Yee Khan praised his sportsmanship and appreciated him.

Prakash Padukone was playing with Thailand's number one player in year 1976, Bandidgayen in an International match at Delhi. The incident was almost similar. The lineman gave lines Judgment in favour of Prakash Padukone almost last point 16 all, but Prakash said it was right, and umpire S.R. Chhada overruled him. Then Prakash served his service about 2-3 feet out of the court and next point was taken by Thailander. In view of Prakash's own conscience decision was against himself, he lost the match, but entire audience raised from their seat and clapped for his gesture. I witnessed these two incidents with a gap of about 9-10 years. These incidents gave a positive message to show what is true sportsmanship. One should always inculcate sportsman spirit in life. Please admire the sportsmanship of a player like Prakash Padukone who later became All England Champion in 1980.

I may also state about the behaviour of VIPs while attending tournament, when called as the Chief Guest for distribution of prizes. A minister generally felt proud in coming late and thereafter with some of his followers, he came towards seats, crossing the court with his dirty shoes, even when the game was in progress and organizers had to put more seats for his guests, which caused inconvenience to spectators, organizers and others.

I still remember one incident, when His Highness Sawai Man Singh Ji was the Chief Guest at Raj Mandir in an important Badminton Tournament at Rajmandir. He entered as per time given but as the match was going on, he stopped for a while till the rally was over and then he was escorted and carried to his seat.

Similarly His Highness and Her Highness both were to grace an event. They came together in car but Her Highness was late in entering the court hall, so His Highness kept on waiting for her at the entrance. Her Highness went inside and sat on her seat thereafter Kamal Khanna escorted him to his seat near Her Highness. See the difference in the gentleness and magnanimity of a sports person, the former Raj Pramukh of the State.

Brijesh and I went to Hyderabad for Nationals in 1956 along with Rajasthan team. When we both were having a cup of tea, suddenly Shri Nandu Natekar, India's top badminton player passed through our table and we requested him to sit and join us. We asked him how to improve the game. He nicely told us in a simple way, "Apart from physical fitness, improve your service, judgments and do not give negative point, You should also improve cross court placement, drop shots, deceptive drops at appropriate situation and for these things. "you must watch matches regularly and find out in respective court, which place is better for player to put the shuttle so that opponent may have to move more and come on wrong foot". He also advised that we should keep on applying our mind while witnessing the match but should not talk to any person even sitting by our side and try to apply our mind while we are practicing. In practice, we should not bother that we are getting point or not and we should not bother to lose the game and also try to sit and watch the game as a linesman also. In this way our game will definitely improve and we will have better court craft and anticipation. On other day at later time we were sitting with Nandu Natekar and Gautam Thakkar after finishing tea, Gautam picked up Nandu Natekar's Kit bag, then Nandu said, "I will take my kit myself. These small incidents have great effect in life if we

follow them in our life. We have learnt a lot. We have not only improved our game, but have also learned self discipline and do our own work and also learned to apply them in life.”

I gave this advice to a number of players at different times so that they may improve their game. I remember one incident. I taught P.C. Kala how to play with left hander like me when we were in selection process to represent inter college tournament at Alwar. For the first time, I lost to him, and for three days I was disturbed and was cursing myself that why I told him how to play with a left hander but later on, I realized also what Nandu Natekar told us and ultimately I became normal and felt happy. It was good that he had noted it and followed the good points and implemented it against me.

I am also narrating one incident as told by Raj Bhargava. "Once Mr. George Luise came to Ajmer and was in Railway club watching badminton game, where Raj Bhargava was playing with someone. After the match, George Luise asked him to give him a chance to play. Then he allowed somebody to play with him and Raj was surprised to see his strokes and way of playing the game at the age of more than 60 years. Then he asked "Sir, who are you and where from you have come". Then in a humble way George Luise said, I am George Luise". By hearing his name Raj Bhargava, other players bowed down to him as he had been a World champion for years. These examples show that one should be courteous to an outsider also, with his actions and behaviour.

I give one more example that in matches there used to be bet between two persons, for example I say A will win and the other player says B will win. For that match if I become umpire then I cannot help the player in whom I am interested that he should win, So once you are on umpire chair then you can't help player even if you are interested in him to help out of the way. By this example I have learnt that we should not deprive meritorious persons even if we are interested in the other player. This learning helped me in discharging my duties with conscience throughout my life.

I may give one more example that in doubles, partners should have very good friendship and heart to heart understanding while playing. One makes a point other hits/finishes the shuttle and gets point and this circle keeps on moving. Considering doubles game, if anybody feels that he is a better player or partner has missed the point and they blame each other as the case may be, even by this feeling they are bound to lose. I have learnt these good things not only in using words but practically in my life. This is

also necessary to congratulate and praise each other at appropriate time. This is very important and essence of good sportsmanship as per advice also of R.S. Gentle a National Hockey Player.

R.S. Gentle told us that there should be team spirit in the game. For example he told us that if he is playing with (a) right winger and could not convert the ball into goal then he passes it to other (b) centre/left winger and he converts it into goal. Now there are three observations, from the public view is that how nicely (b) had converted the goal and got claps and praise. The reaction of (a) and (b) are very necessary to be seen and understood. If (a) thinks that the thing which he could not do by converting the ball into goal, his team mate (b) had converted it into goal and so he becomes happy and if (b) thinks in right perspective that he had done it because of pass given by (a) and feels obliged for having pass. Then they mutually appreciate each other and it will be a coordination and helping hand amongst the players in future. But the other side (b) thinks that he has made goal and vice versa takes credit for only himself, then in future there will be no coordination and there will be no chance of winning. With great respect I wonder what players are doing individually nowadays. I have learnt that team spirit is necessary and it must be paramount, as it keeps the player mentally and physically fit and strong, otherwise no purpose will be served by playing any game.

We asked the Athletic Coach that Milkha Singh and Makhan Singh both are equal then how you coach them. As the two persons of equal calibre practice together then they will know weakness of each other. Then how will you manage? He told us, it is a secret, but however he stated in such situation for individual games, when two players who are equal on merit, he stated competing with each other, there is no option but to play with the each other for practice. The coach told us that if you practice with your colleague, who is also like you in merit then you should not take advantage of his weakness in practice for winning and see that he should take advantage of your weakness and win in practice. But in match you can adjust yourself accordingly & in a game you should be capable to play with strategy i.e. you have to change your game according to situation. And with strong nerves & determination you will overcome your competitor.

Now I will try to narrate some incidents and examples of great players from whom I have learnt a lot. Vijay Merchant was the legendary figure in cricket, on my visit to Bombay with my friend Brijesh, we met the legendary figure. Our question to him was why you have retired from playing cricket so early when you are still at the top. With smile he replied,

“one should retire at peak so that players/ public may talk as why he has taken retirement”. According to him slowly at later stage as per age reflections, body movement becomes slow. Even though the mind’s condition is good but strike or shot goes to the other side rather than the anticipated place. It also helps us to maintain our prestige, otherwise, to be in the team one will always bow or surrender before higher authorities. I have also taken note of this valuable advice in my life. I stopped playing competitive Badminton after 1965, though represented state upto year 1968.

I learned a lot from the above instances in life and always encouraged youngsters to show their hidden talent. I can give more good examples/ incidents of sport personalities of their hard work and dedication but due to time and place constraint above examples are sufficient to inculcate sports man spirit in life for happy living and to be a good citizen.

Blessings and Advice for being a Good Advocate / Judge

With the grace of God, orders of my elevation as a Judge of Rajasthan High Court had come on 10th July 1990. I visited my father’s nearest friend Justice C.B. Bhargava’s house at Jaipur to get his blessings. He was not well and was confined to bed.

On hearing the news, he became very happy, he said that Jagdish Ji is not here today, but he would be happy from heavens and shower his blessing. He blessed and gave me some tips. He said to me “You should be punctual in court. You should not discriminate between senior and junior, you should behave properly with advocates. You should not lose temper in any condition, should be alert and smiling.” He advised me not to ask the Chief Justice to give me a particular work of admission, orders or Bail matter and try to sit for some time on hearing matters first.

He also advised me to hear Advocates patiently. He also suggested “some times you know and get the point but you should show that the advocate has made you understand about the point. Secondly if he makes arguments repeatedly then narrate the point that you have followed him and so he should argue next point.”

Justice Bhargava Sahib said, “you are the master of court. You should manage hearing in such a way that the case may remain partly unheard. You may prepare factual points at home. Next day after applying facts, law on the controversy, decide the case then and there or at the earliest.”

I have followed his kind advice throughout my life in letter and spirit. I have given this advice to follow the same to a number of brother Judges also in my career. I am happy and satisfied that some of them have followed it and proved very good, efficient and considerate Judges.

I also visited Ram Chandarji Kasliwal, Advocate at Jaipur, a good friend of my father for his blessings. He gave me a small Murti of wood of Swami Bahubali with his blessings. He also advised me that I should do darshan before going to the Court every day, which I have followed throughout my tenure.

I also visited my neighbour Chachaji L.L. Sharma, C.N. Sharma advocates and Gopinath Pillai is a good friend of my father. They were very happy and blessed me with the advice that I should work hard and my work only should create my name with good image just like my great father. They prayed that I should reach on higher pedestal in my life.

I visited the residence of Justice Kan Singh ji at Jodhpur. He was happy that I had become Judge and remembering my father he blessed me with advice, that I must perform my duties with my conscience without expecting fruit of the result and appreciation. He also told me never to consider myself the cause of result of my activities and never to be attached to not doing my duty.

I was also impressed with the sincere advice of Justice C. M. Lodha when I was advocate. He came to my house to meet my father, I was not well He also came to see me in the room. On interaction he advised me to do hard work with patience and sincerity and not to get disturbed. I was lacking in communication skill. He gave me an example, that "one advocate argued a case very nicely and effectively." Justice Lodha was impressed by his oratory but nothing was found on record at home while preparing for dictation, whereas another advocate in a simple way gave him relevant points on merit for his case and he decided in his favour. So he advised me that I should improve my communication skill but I should not be disheartened.
