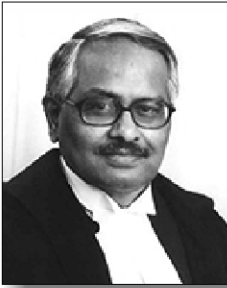
One of the good qualities of Justice Jain is his learning habit from one and all and to behave decently with everyone accordingly.

I wish him a long, peaceful, happy and meaningful life in the service of the society.

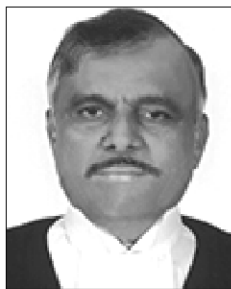

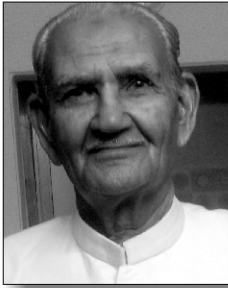

A Worthy Son of A Worthy Father

It gave me immense pleasure to know that Samachar Vichaar Sansthan, Jaipur, with association of a number of luminaries of judicial fraternity of Rajasthan has decided to publish glimpses of the personality of Hon'ble Mr. Justice N. K. Jain, former Judge of Rajasthan High Court and retired Chief Justice of Madras and Karnataka High Courts as well as former Chairperson of Human Rights Commissions at Himachal Pradesh and Rajasthan.

Since I have been fortunate enough to have worked with Justice Jain as a junior colleague at Jaipur Bench of Rajasthan High Court, I avail this opportunity to give tongue to my silent and sincere thoughts and feelings that I have always entertained in my mind and heart about the magnanimous personality of Justice Jain.

Presiding over the Bench of Rajasthan High Court as a Senior Member, Justice Jain was most courteous, accommodative and cooperative not only to his junior colleagues but also to the advocates appearing before him. He was always keen to uphold the Rule of Law making all efforts to propagate the relationship between Rights and Duties. He whole-heartedly believed that Rights and Duties are co-related and every Right has a corresponding duty. He dedicatedly subscribed to the view and followed it in his actions and deeds. Wittiness in courtroom, Independence of thoughts, Impartiality in procedure and integrity of highest level were his indispensable qualities as a judge while dispensing justice to the litigating public. The most fascinating aspect of his well read legal personality, which impressed me the most, was his patient attitude in the courtroom during proceedings and his habit of calling for the views of his junior colleague on the Division Bench and appreciating them as well to the extent of over-ruling his own viewpoint many a times. In his opinion 'difference of opinion' over an issue of fact or of law contributes to the development of law. This certainly has been a very fascinating aspect of Justice Jain's personality as a judge which is also promulgated by the number of books and projects he has authored.

Above all the most impressive and appreciable aspect of the personality of Justice Jain is his humane and compassionate attitude towards almost everyone. In my estimation, Justice Jain is a multifaceted loving personality. He is a worthy son of a worthy father. I sincerely wish him to pass on such legacy to his posterity.

A Great Planner and Administrator

Justice Nagendra Kumar Jain, a human being par excellence has been highly respected for his simplicity, sincerity and honesty both as a lawyer and as a judge. I have been fortunate to have known Justice Jain since my childhood.

His father late Justice J.P. Jain was a very close friend of my father late Pt. Brij Sunder Sharma. They knew each other much before I was born.

Late Justice J.P. Jain and my father at that time lived as neighbours at 4 & 5, New Colony, Jaipur.

Justice Nagendra Kumar Jain and my elder brother late Sudhakar Sharma and so also Justice Jain's sisters and my sisters grew up together as very close family friends. I remember my early childhood playing along with Ashok who was the younger brother of Justice N.K. Jain.

Justice J.P. Jain shifted to Jodhpur when the Bench was abolished in 1958: However, my father who was in politics and became a Minister did not permanently shift to Jodhpur. Both Justice Nagendra Kumar Jain and my elder brother late Shri Sudhakar Sharma had a common interest. Both of them were outstanding Badminton players. I, as a young boy, often accompanied my elder brother to Ashok Club where he and Justice Nagendra Kumar Jain played Badminton. I distinctly remember myself, a young boy in awe watching Justice Nagendra Kumar Jain playing Badminton. He was the only player who used both hands while playing. He would serve with his right hand and switch the racket to his left hand and continue to play the rally with his left hand. He was an outstanding doubles player and represented Rajasthan for a number of years. Later on, when he started legal practice, he shifted to Jodhpur. Justice J.P. Jain had passed away in 1975 while he was a Judge of High Court.

I resumed my association with Justice N.K. Jain, when the High Court Bench was re-established in January, 1977 at Jaipur. I had already started practice and, therefore, was meeting him on a daily basis, resuming the family ties. There were several occasions when we contested cases as lawyers against each other. I distinctly remember the cases of Hindustan Copper Ltd. relating to rectified spirit when I was representing the Department of Excise and Justice Jain represented Hindustan Copper Ltd. Justice Jain was a great planner and

administratively very sound. He became Secretary of Raj. High Court Bar Association and was also elected as member of Raj. Bar Council for several terms. His election planning was very meticulous. He was so thorough in his campaigning that there was no chance of his losing any election.

He was also a member of our "Lawyer's Tea Club" in which we used to sit together during the lunch recess with Justice G.S. Singhvi as our Chairman. This Club still continues to function in the same manner. Now of course we are only eight members out of the original 11. Even as a Judge he would often come to the Tea Club to chat with us. I have appeared before Justice Nagendra Kumar Jain in a large number of cases. He was absolutely fair, sincere and honest to his office.

I and my wife Mamta had stayed with him while he was the Chief Justice of Madras High Court when we visited Chennai. The affection which he and his late wife Aruna bhabhi showed towards us is deeply rooted in our hearts. Justice Jain and I still continue to be members of Senior Badminton Players' Association where we have monthly meetings. I am honoured to have been associated with him.

I wish that he may continue enjoy and remain in good health and spirits in the years to follow.

I know Shri Nagendra since 1953 for more than 65 years. He was our neighbour opposite to our house at 5, New Colony, Jaipur.

At that time new colony was a very important colony. Very eminent persons were residing there viz Shri Tikaram Ji Paliwal, G. K. Sharma, Kamal Khanna, S. S. Jaini, Durlabh ji, Mayaram Ji, Indira Maya Ram, Keshwani Sahib, Gulab Chand Praveen Chand Chhabra, Dr. R. P. Mathur, Gehlot, Amar Singh Chaturvedi, Ved Pal Ji Tyagi, Brij Sunder ji Sharma, Ram Singh Ji, L. N. Sahib, Hari Ram ji Saboo, Devda Sahib, S.S.Gemawat, Beri brothers, Kesar Lal Ji Bakshi, Yogendra Alak, R. S. Mathur and many others. All were like family members.

We were children of almost the same age group. We used to run from one pole to another and Play Aies-pies, Sitoliya, Cricket with Tennis Ball and Badminton at 4, New Colony Compound daily.

We used to celebrate Lohri, Holi, Dussehra, Diwali get-together apart from individual celebrations. We have also visited Saint Xavier School, Railways Ground, Polo ground, Chougan Stadium, Ashok Club, Jai Club, Lilli Pool respectively to see so many top players of football, table tennis, cricket, badminton, tennis, wrestling, polo matches, a number of times and enjoyed watching matches. We also developed team spirit coordination, helping hand for one another and got good feeling during those days.

I may also say Nagendra could not continue Engineering and was selected in NDA, as ground duty pilot, Short Service Commission but for one reason or the other. He did not join this service. He was also not interested to work as Tax consultant. However he started practice with his father Shri J. P. Jain Sahib who later became High Court Judge and died in harness in 1975 at very early age in Jodhpur.

It is very difficult to narrate, but still I am trying to point out some of my feelings with regard to his qualities. Nagendra has a rare quality to understand a person while talking to him for a while. He says hello, hello to everybody but he has very few friends.

He respects others and gets respect from them. I never saw him hurting anybody. He has a quality to take work from the expertise of every person and then give credit to him. He always put others forward getting full

satisfaction by remaining back. He is in the habit of learning good qualities from one and all .

Nagendra's cousin brother Davendra, Mama Harprasad and my self witnessed a number of good tournaments and games together.

He had occasion and opportunity to see, know and interact with so many personalities including top players of various games, eminent Judges, Chief Justice of different Countries, Jurists, and advocates, Prime Minister of different countries , foreign delegates, and film actors and gracious ladies like Maharani Gayatri Devi of Jaipur, Ms. Bhartiya of Maharani College, Ms. Luther of MGD, Lata Mangeshkar, Sudha Moortthy, Anila Kothari and a number of film actresses and many others.

He has no superiority or inferiority complex and no ego problem. He talks in a simple and easy manner. He is a straight forward person with no ifs & buts and with no hypocrisy. He is calm and quiet and of helping hand to deserving & needy persons.

Nagendra is a man of values with immense dedication and devotion. Generally he does not disclose what has been decided and does not explain his plan to others in advance with Prachar and Prasar. According to him, the result will convey the work done by him.

I have not come across a person like him who has so many good qualities. God was very kind to him, as so many good works in different streams and fields have been carried out by him. To my mind, a very few persons have these qualities. It is difficult to find so many qualities in one person. He is true to himself and practiced what he preached.

He is unassuming personality in day-to-day life. He is always happy and cheerful and is a good human being. He is satisfied in life.

I have not seen him angry with / hurting anyone. He is not jealous, greedy, selfish or egoistic and is a clear cut real Karmyogi.

Justice Nagendra Jain with his clarity of vision is the shining example of a holistic person leading purposeful selfless life. He lived happily in a true sportsman spirit throughout his life. I hope his noble contribution in different streams /fields to the society will be helpful and beneficial to the public at large in future.

We have maintained our relations through correspondence on Kshmavani, Deepwali, and New Year Day every year and now we have revised our friendship after 30 years.

I appreciate the noble gesture of Samachar Vichar Sansthan and its associates for giving me an opportunity to say a few words to be incorporated in the book .

My Reminiscences

It is an honour to write a few lines about the legendary figure Justice Nagendra K. Jain whose grandmother and my grandfather were real sister and brother. My father Shri S. P. Jain – who tutored Alwar State's Her Highness and joined Maharaja Alwar's Police Service – and my Chachaji Justice J. P. Jain – father of Justice Nagendra Jain – worked closely in Alwar and had very warm relationship. After reorganization of States when my father was transferred to Jaipur, our family stayed with Chachaji Justice J.P. Jain for a few weeks before shifting to rented accommodation, and this was the first time I had an opportunity to closely watch Nagendra Bhaiya's simplicity and affectionate nature.

Later, when I studied in Maharaja's College for PUC and B.Sc. during 1966 to 1970, I saw Nagendra Bhaiya as an ace badminton player entering the law profession, with my remote admiration for his achievements. During the summer vacation of 1967, when my Chachaji visited our house and asked me to come with him to Jodhpur, I readily agreed, as his sons, Ashok (Bob) and Anil (Guddu), were of my age and friendly too. During my about one week's stay in Jodhpur, I had further opportunity to watch Nagendra Bhaiya's great professionalism, simplicity and humanity, which was highly motivating as well as inspiring. This was a good observational learning for me.

Later, I attended his marriage at Agra. Interestingly, I represented my family from his (groom) side as well as from his to-be wife's (bridegroom) side, as Aruna Didi was my maternal cousin (her Nana and my Nana were highly educated real brothers and lived in Agra). My parents were very close to both sides. During my Ph.D. days at I.I.T. Kanpur in 1970s I used to travel to Jaipur via Agra, which strengthened my bonding with Mausiji's family. After Nagendra Bhaiya settled in Jaipur, whenever I visited their house, Gaurav and Garima always had a dilemma – whether to call me Chacha or Mama.

During 1970s, I had several occasional interactions with Nagendra Bhaiya. After my Ph.D., when I was an Assistant Professor and Hostel Warden at Institute for Social & Economic Change, Nagarbhavi, Bangalore, the Foundation Stone Laying ceremony of National Law

School of India (NLSI) was held in around 1984 on the backside of my Institute and I was invited to attend this function. There I came to know about Nagendra Bhaiya's association with NLSI (now NLSIU).

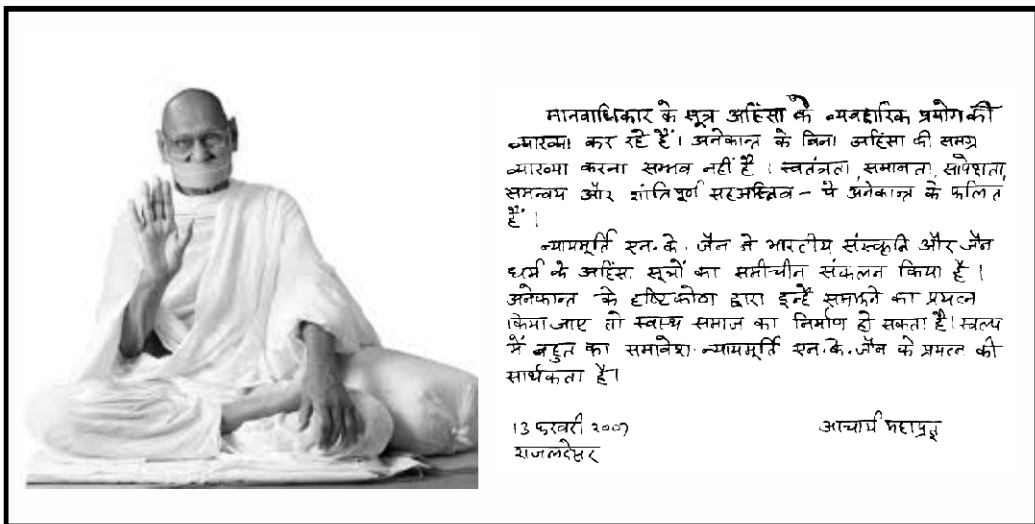
I had many more occasions to meet and interact with him during the period he was Justice of High Court of Rajasthan and Tamil Nadu (Madras) and later, when he was Chief Justice of Madras High Court and then Karnataka High Court. I met him several times when he had official visits to Delhi from Bangalore, as I had joined I.I.T. Delhi in 1985. With my specialisation in the field of Intellectual Property Rights(IPRs) in 1990s, we also had interactions on various IPR related issues.

In each of my personal and professional interactions, I found Nagendra Bhaiya more and more impressive, knowledgeable, humble, generous and humane. His soft, kind and gentle attitude emit positive vibes that make him more distinct from the rest. His affectionate interaction with me has continued, or more correctly, increased after his return to Jaipur and his tenure as Chairman, Rajasthan Human Rights Commission. I may also place on with this article the blessing of Mahapragya on writing a book containing to Amhimsa in Indian Culture, Human Rights and Jain Dharma. I pray almighty to bless Nagendra Bhaiya with good health, happiness and as a continued guiding spirit for all of us around.

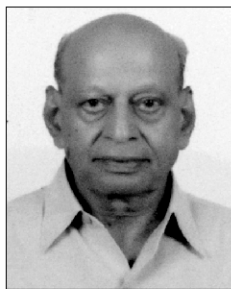

Justice Jain involved in Social, Religious and Philanthropic Activities

I was called upon by Samachar Vichar Sansthan, Jaipur to share and write about my memories of Hon'ble Justice (Retd.) Shri N.K. Jain.

Justice Shri N.K. Jain was born on 20th October, 1942 in a respectable family in Alwar. His father Late Justice J.P. Jain was also a brilliant and successful lawyer and a judge, but unfortunately, he met with a Cardiac arrest and the cruel hands of nature snatched him from amongst us. His parents were religious persons and both of them were followers of Lord Mahavir and Shri Jain inherited the religious qualities of his parents.

After a brilliant academic career, he passed the law examination and got himself enrolled as an advocate on 26th January 1968 with the Bar Council of Rajasthan. Thereafter, he started his practice in the very well reputed High Court at Jaipur bench.

I had the good fortune of knowing him, when he started the practice in the High Court Jaipur Bench. He was soft spoken and used to mix-up with the Advocates freely. His arguments were impressive and to the point. He also respected opposite counsels and the judges. By dint of his hard labour and sharp intellect, he soon rose to the heights in the profession. He was kind and considerate to his clients.

He remained as a member of the Bar Council, Rajasthan from 1970 to 1990 till elevation. He was also a member of the Executive Council, Supreme Court of India from 1984 to 1986. He remained as a member of Bar Council of India and Bar Council India Trust from 1986 to 1990.

His reputation as a brilliant advocate spread throughout the State. Soon he caught the eyes of the Chief Justice and was recommended for Judgeship and was elevated as a Judge of Rajasthan High Court on 20.07.1990.

As a Judge, he gave patient hearing to the advocates and he conducted the proceedings of the Court with decorum. He gave judgments after full consideration and nobody raised any finger on the judgments delivered by him. He always encouraged the junior advocates and in case he was not prepared would grant him adjournments and ask him to

prepare the case well. He administered justice without fear and earned the respect of his colleague judges and the members of the Bar.

Justice Mr. N.K.Jain (Retd.) inherited the qualities of head and heart from his father and he was elevated from Rajasthan High Court Bench as the Chief Justice of Madras High Court on 19.12.1997 till 2001 and thereafter, he was transferred to Karnataka High Court as Chief Justice and remained there till 19.10.2004. He earned good name in Madras and Karnataka High Court. It was borne out of the law reports.

He served after retirement from Karnataka High Court as the Chairperson of the Human Rights Commission at Himachal Pradesh from 24.11.2004. He also served as the Chairperson of Rajasthan State Human Rights Commission from 16.07.2005 to 15.07.2010.

Besides the legal profession, he also participated in social, religious and philanthropic activities. He was elected as President of Shri Mahavir Digambar Jain Atishaya Kshetra from 26.02.2011 to 24.02.2014.

He was also interested in sports and he used to play Badminton. He played for State for 14 years.

I would like to say that Former Justice Shri N.K. Jain was a brilliant lawyer and a very good judge. But most importantly, he is a kind person and a humanitarian whose contribution to law and society is an inspiration for all.

सेवानिवृत्ति के बाद आपने कई सामाजिक, शैक्षणिक, धार्मिक एवं अनेक जनोपयोगी कार्य किये। आपने कई लघु पुस्तिकाएँ लिखीं व मानवाधिकार आयोग तथा अन्य लोगों ने आपको छपवाकर आमजन को वितरित की। साथ ही आमजन व शोषित वर्ग को अपने अधिकारों एवं कर्तव्यों के प्रति जागरूक करने के लिए आपने हजारों पेंसिलेट विभिन्न संस्थाओं में निःशुल्क वितरित करवाये। अभी आप गीता बजाज शिक्षण संस्था से जुड़े हुए हैं। आप इसमें चेयरमैन के पद पर कार्य करते हुए सभी शिक्षकों एवं विद्यार्थियों का मार्गदर्शन कर रहे हैं। सेवा करना ही आपके जीवन का लक्ष्य रहा है। रामचरित मानस में एक दोहा आया है - “परहित सरिस धर्म नहीं भाई, पर पीड़ा सम नहीं अधमाई।”

वास्तव में परहित करना ही आपके जीवन का उद्देश्य रहा है। जैन साहब ने यह साबित कर दिया है कि इरादे बुलन्द हों और कुछ कर पाने का हौसला हो तो रास्ते अपने आप निकलते जाते हैं। क्योंकि रास्ते भी ऐसे बुलन्द इरादे वालों का इंतजार करते हैं। आपने गगनचुम्बी ऊँचाइयों को छुआ है। फिर भी आप धरातल की सतह पर ही चलते रहे अर्थात् आपको एक पल के लिए भी अहंकार नहीं हुआ। यह आपका सबसे बड़ा गुण रहा है, जिससे मैं बहुत प्रभावित हुआ हूँ। आपकी कार्य शैली पारदर्शी रही है। आप विलक्षण प्रतिभा के धनी रहे हैं। आपका व्यक्तित्व बहुआयामी रहा है।

Rajasthan High Court Bar Association, Jaipur

JAIPUR is Known as the Pink City of India. It derives its name from its founder, the Astronomer, Maharaja Sawai Jai Singh.

There are about one thousand Advocates In Jaipur. Initially Bar at Jaipur before 1931 was known as Anju-man Vakla, Jaipur. Later on in 1939, the Bar was known as Bar Association, Jaipur. Late Sarvashri C.L. Mishra, C.L. Agarwal, G.N. Sharma, Ramesh Chand Swami. K.C. Sanghi, Sherumalji, S.B.L. Saxena. Shri G.C. Kasliwal, Shri R.K. Rastogi were the stalwarts of the Bar. In 1946 its President was Shri D.M. Bhandari who was later on elevated to the Bench and retired as Chief Justice. On the establishment of Jaipur Bench in the Year 1949, the lawyers practicing in various princely State Courts Shifted to Jaipur viz Shri N.L. Jain & Late Shri V.P. Tyagi from Kota. R.A. Gupta and Late Shri J.P. Jain from Alwar, Late Shri B.B. Sharma, G.L. Yadav, Shri A.S. Chaturvedi from Bharatpur. Shri C.B. Bhargava, P.N. Dutt, O.C. Chatterjee from Jhunjhunu and Advocates of Ajmer Late Shri M.B.L. Bhargava, M.D. Bhargava. Shri B.P. Beri, Shri S.K. Jindal, kept on appearing in Jaipur frequently, till merger of Ajmer in state of Rajasthan in the year 1956.

On abolition of the High Court Bench from Jaipur in 1958, about 20 Advocates shifted to Jodhpur for practising before the unified High Court. On being motivated by high ideals of profession, the then leaders of Jaipur Bar thought of forming an association in the year 1959. The same was constituted and registered on 10th February, 1959, under the Societies Registration Act, XXI of 1860. In the name of Rajasthan High Court Bar Association Jaipur, and formulated the following objects thereof, such as:-

- (i) To Maintain a high standard of ethics, honour and dignity of the legal profession;
- (ii) To consider matters affecting the interests of legal practitioners and litigant public and to uphold and safeguard their interests.
- (iii) To maintain a suitable library and to provide facilities for the advancement of the legal knowledge; and
- (iv) To Publish Law Books/Text Books/Judgments & Legal Journals etc.

The first provisional Executive committee consisted of the following persons :-

2. Shri C. L. Agarwal
3. Shri R. K. Rastogi
4. Shri V. P. Tyagi
5. Shri C. B. Bhargave
6. Shri R. A. Gupta
7. Shri J. P. Jain
8. Shri G. C. Kasliwal
9. Shri B. P. Beri
10. Shri P. N. Dutt
11. Shri D. P. Gupta

The Association was provided with a hall for its members at Jodhpur. On the persuasion of its first president Late Shri M.B.L. Bhargav and its Secretary Shri D.P. Gupta, some Chambers were provided to its members. Due to the persuasion of the then president late Shri C.L. Agarwal and Secretary Shri N.M. Kasliwal, the members got the Telephones on priority with the help of the then Communication Minister Shri Raj Bahadur. Later on, members contributed and raised funds for purchasing some books for library under the Presidentship of Sarvashri M.M. Tiwari, Late J.P. Jain, P.C. Bhandari, and P.N. Dutt and with the help of its Secretaries namely, Sarvashri J.S. Rastogi, H.C. Rastogi, N.K. Jain, S.N. Bhargava and B.R. Arora. The Association started publishing judgments of all cases through cyclostyle machine which was presented by Shri M. B. L. Bhargava, A tea-club was run by the Association under the patronage of Sarvashri P.C. Bhandari and R.S. Purohit. In the year 1969, the then president Late Shri J.P. Jain, persuaded the then chairman. U.I.T. Jodhpur through its Member Advocate Shri M.M. Singhvi and other Authorities to arrange land for Lawyers' Colony in one area known as Jalam Vilas, Paota B-Road, Jodhpur.

The wives of the members had also started a club known as Ladies Club under the Presidentship of Smt. Shanti Metha with founder members Smt. Shakuntla Agarwal, Late Smt. Usha Bhargava, Smt Vimla Kasliwal etc. which rendered Social Services and also donated funds, medicines during Famine. Blood was donated at the time of China's invasion and during the Indopak War.

The Bench was re-established at Jaipur on 31.1.1977 during the tenure of Late Shri V.P. Tyagi, the then Chief Justice, who was one of our founder members. All the Advocates, who had gone to jodhpur returned to Jaipur.

The strength of the Association at the time of re-establishment of Jaipur Bench was only thirty, which considerably increased under the

Presidentship of Sarvashri M.B.L Bhargave, S.M. Mehta, V.S. Dave, C.N. Sharma and L.L. Sharma. At present the strength is 266 including 9 life Members.

Initially, the association was provided with only one room for its Library as well as for the use of its members. Later on 16 Chambers were allotted. In the year 1980, a separate building with a big hall and 19 chambers were added. This new building was inaugurated by the then chief Justice Shri C.M. Lodha.

In the beginning, the Library consisted of a few books only, whereas it has now increased considerably. Apart from this, the Association has also been able to obtain a loan of Rs. 10,000/- from Bar council of Rajasthan for the purchase of Books.

With the persistent efforts of its Secretaries during 5 Years at Jaipur, namely sarvashri H.C. Rastogi, N.K. Jain, A.K. Bhandari and G.S. Bafna and present Secretary N.K. Jain who was again elected, the association has enriched the library and increased the facilities by purchasing its own Furniture and Fixtures, Almirah, Sofa-Set Radio, Water Cooler, Desert Cooler etc. out of the Contribution from its members.

The Accounts of the Association are being maintained and M/s. N.C. Jain & Associated Chartered Accountants, Jaipur are our Auditors.

The Association is celebrating 31st January every year as the Bench day by holding cultural programmes etc.

In year 1980, a Seminar was organised which was presided by shri D.M. Bhandari. Shri P. Shiv Shankar Union Law Minister was one of the speakers along with Shri C.M. Lodha.

The association is running its own tea-club for its members.

The Ladies Club formed at Jodhpur is also continuing its activities at Jaipur. A film show was organised for raising funds for providing help to the affected persons during the time of flood, cyclone near Jodhpur & in Andhra Pradesh at Present Smt. Kanti Dave is the President and Smt. Manju Bafna is its Secretary.

The basic object of the Association is to promote the brotherhood, fraternity amongst its members and to promote the administration of Justice by maintaining high standard of the profession. It obligates the Lawyers to observe scrupulously those norms which make him worthy of the confidence of the community, Profession of law is not a trade. Commercial considerations do not govern it. The association has been

standing all along as a watchdog to maintain the high standard to which the Legal Profession should confirm and which are necessary to make its members worthy of this Honorable and Noble Profession.

The association has been taking active steps for removal of corruption in Judiciary. It never legged behind in honouring those Judges who had impressed its members with their ability, integrity, courteous behaviour, and high sense of imparting justice. The Association from the very beginning has been denouncing the practice of toutism in the profession. The Association has been alive to the independence of judiciary and whenever situation arose, it rose to the occasion.

Association did not confine its activity for the members only but also took-up the problems of common-men and of the Nation by way of raising funds during cyclone, Flood and donated blood during war time. Most of the members have volunteered themselves for legal aid programme to the poor, without any legal fee.

Some members in the past had adorned the Bench, remained as Chairman, elected members of Bar council before and after Advocates Act. Some of them remained members of Bar council of india, M.P. M.L.A. Advocate Genral, Addl. Advocate General and some of the members are still holding such posts .

The member of the Association had privilege of honouring eminent Jurists legal luminaries and Statesmen namely Dr. Nagendra Singh , Sarvashri M.C. Chhagla, C.K. Daftari, M.H. Beg, K.N. Wanchoo, Y.V. Chandrachud and many others.

Chairman's Note

With the enactment of the Advocate's Act, 1961 the law relating to legal practitioners has been consolidated which provides for constitution of bar council. Earlier than this, two years leadership was necessary before enrolment but the old practice of having various types of lawyers at different levels has been dispensed with and one class of legal practitioners has been formed i.e.; Advocates.

The salient feature of the Act is that for each State, there shall be a Bar council, whose important functions are inter-alia to admit persons as an advocate on its roll and entertain and determine cases of misconduct against advocates on its roll and further to safeguard interests, privileges and rights of its members. At all India level there is a provision of Bar council of India, which consists of one member elected from each state Bar council to the Bar council of India.

Though a span of 25 years is not a long period to celebrate the silver jubilee of an institution like Rajasthan Bar council, yet it is sufficient period to have a look at the services rendered by its members during that period so that the new incumbents at the Bar could derive inspiration and learn noble qualities from them like dedication, devotion for justice, self sacrifice and feeling of brotherhood amongst its fraternity.

The Bar council of Rajasthan is completing 25 years of its beginning and during this period, the membership has swollen to 13,000 members. Apart from the enrolment which the Bar Council has at the state level, its members have constituted themselves in about 150 associations attached to different courts at different levels in 27 districts. Nearly 11,000 Advocates are in active practice and about 2,000 have got their sanads suspended being on different posts, services, vocation and occupation.

The Bar council started functioning under the chairmanship of Shri Hasti Mal Parekh with a small fund of Approximately Rs. 25,000/- in 1961 but the same has been increased to Approximately Rs. 12 Lakhs. Bar Council has its own rich and big reference library at its office at Jodhpur. Mr. M.M. Bhandari managed the affairs of the Bar Council in the capacity

of its Secretary efficiently and sincerely from its inception till he retired in the year 1952, and Shri O.P. Gupta, the present Secretary of the Bar council is managing the affairs with the same missionary Spirit. Bar council is running in its 6th term. Till date 70 members were elected. It had 12 chairmen including the then Advocate General as Ex-officio chairman Dr. L.M. Singhvi and Dr. S.K. Tiwari, Mr. R.K. Rastogi, 11 vice-chairmen and 3 members were elected to the Bar council of india. Advocates of eminence like Sarva Shri Amrit Lal Metha, M.C. Bhandari, N.M. Kasliwal was elevated to High Court Bench. Bar Council functions through statutory committees like Disciplinary and Enrolment committee and 26 members were co-opted till date for Disciplinary Committees.

Before the commencement of the Act, 7 members out of 21 elected members of the Bar council namely, Sarva Shri C.B. Bhargave, B.P. Beri, Kan Singh, V.P. Tyagi, C.M. Lodha, J.P. Jain and M.L. Joshi were elevated to the Bench. From amongst 70 elected members till date, six members namely, Sarva Shri D.P. Gupta, M.L. Shrimal, G.M. Lodha, S.K. Mal Lodha, V.S. Dave and Pana Chand Jain have been elevated to the Bench. Sarva Shri M.B.L. Bhargava, B.L. Luhadia, Dr. L. M. Singhvi were elected as M.Ps. and Sarva Shri R.D. Goyal, G.C. Kasliwal, V.P. Tyagi, Jaswant Singh Nahar, Durga Lal Bardar, G.M. Lodha, Satish Chand Sharma, Purushottam Mantri, B.M. Singhvi were elected as M.L. As. Sarva Shri P.D. Mantri, B.M. Singhvi, R.D. Goyal and V.P. Tyagi had Been Ministres while Sarva Shri Durga Lal Bardar and G.M. Lodha were the chairman of petition committee of Legislative Assembly. Shri V.P. Tyagi, Shri D.P. Gupta Adorned the highest office of Governor of the State. Shri C. M. Lodha and M. L. Shrimal had held the office of chief Justice, Assam High Court and Sikkim High Court respectively. Dr. L. M. Singhvi is the founder president & patron of commonwealth Legal Aid Association along with Lord Denning of England. He had also been President of the Supreme Court Bar Association. Shri C. L. Agarwal was the Managing Trustee of the Bar council of india Trust and Legal Education Committee. Shri V. S. Dave was Vice-Chairman, Executive Committee Bar Council of India & remained associated with National Law School, Bangalore. Sarva Shri N. M. Singhvi, S. N. Purohit, Kan Singh, M. M. Singhvi were attached with social activities and also elected as Governors of Lions and Rotary Clubs. Sarva Shri B. P. Beri, C. M. Lodha, V. P. Tyagi and Pana Chand Jain were elected Government of their respective Districts in Rotary and Lions

clubs. Shri Marudhar Mridul a well known poet has been presented the U. S. R. Jawahar Lal Nehru Award for his Contribution to literature. Shri Than Chand Metha, Sumer Chand Bhandari, M. B. L. Bhargava, C. L. Agarwal donated their libraries and created trust for welfare of advocates and for the advancement of education, art and culture. Shri Than Chand Metha also created trust for the Eye Hospital. Shri D. L. Mehta is the Chairman of Rajasthan High Court Legal Aid Committee & Sarva Shri V. S. Dave, S. R. Singhi, J. M. Bhandari, L. R. Metha, N. L. Tibrewal and N. N. Mathur remained as its members. Sarva Shri V. P. Tyagi, Kan Singh Parihar held the offices of Vice-Chancellor of Rajasthan and Jodhpur Universities respectively. Shri R.D. Goyal and Pt. M.B.L. Bhargav were amongst the founding fathers of our country's constitution being the members of Bar Council of Rajasthan since its inception. Sarva Shri L.L. Sharma and M.L. Garg were co-opted members in Bar council of India.

There are about 40 advocates who have completed 50 years of active practice and we have the privilege of honouring them on the occasion of Silver Jubilee. Shri L.N. Chhangani, headed chhangani Commission to probe into the affairs Akali Government. Shri P.D. Kudal heads kudal Commission of enquiry into Gandhi Pratishthan. Shri B.P. Beri headed Beri Commissoin to probe into police firing in 1967 and then Land Grabing & Pay Commission in 1977. Shri Kan Singh headed Committee for Public Enquiries, and Sarva Shri C.B. Bhargava and Shri R.D. Gattani Separately headed Jodhpur University Enquiry Commission. Shri D.L. Mehta headed Bharatpur Firing Commission. Sarva Shri M.L. Joshi, D. P. Gupta held the office of Lokayukta and Mr. M.L. Shrimal is at present Lokayukta of Rajasthan.

The Advocates of Rajasthan followed the footsteps of eminent lawyers of India namely, Pandit Moti Lal Nehru, Sardar Patel, Bhula Bhai Desai, C.R. Das, Tej Bahadur Sapru, Babu Rajendra Prasad, M.C. Chhagla and many others in struggle for freedom. Prominent amongst them are Sarva Shri Banshi Lal Luhadia, Puran Chand Lunadia, Mohammad Gaffar Ali, C.S. Parashar Radha Ballabh Agarwal, Babu Harish Chandra, D.M. Bhandari, C.L. Mishra, G.C.Kasliwal, Hanuman Bux, Kripa Dayal Mathur, Dwarka Das Purohit, Dau Dayal Acharya, S.S. Deedwarka, Vidyadhar Kulhari, Ramesh Chandra Swami, Sirumal Vishan Das, Dharam Chand Surana, and Heera Lal Deopura. Their Contribution to freedom struggle can not be forgotten. The names of the lawyers are mentioned in the following pages. Other lawyers who have participated in

national struggle but do not find a place will be remembered, if their names have gone unnoticed. A Large number of advocates were attached to prajamandal.

Advocates enrolled with Bar Council of many jewels including eminent lawyers, patriots, distinguished judges, effective Parliamentarians, active Politicians including ministers, heads of the Autonomous and Local Bodies, philanthropists, educationists and dedicated social workers Some of the advocates, who were enrolled with Bar council had been selected in I.A.S., I.P.S., and other allied services. Judicial Services of the state have, of course, been manned singularly by our members. Many members like Sarva Shri Gopi Lal Yadav, Narottam Lal Joshi, Mathuresh Bihari Mathur, Amrit Lal Payak, Nathuram Mirdha, Mathura Dass Mathur , Brij Mohan Sharma, P.C. Mathur, Brij Sunder Sharma were also members of Assemblies of erstwhile princely states of Rajputana and left deep impression on the floor as and when they participated.

Many of our members have distinguished themselves by holding various assignments of great responsibility at the National and state level. A few of them had been members of council of Ministers, Government of India. Notable amongst them are Sarva Shri Raj Bahadur, Jagannath Pahadia, K.K. Goyal, Satish Chandra Agarwal, Nathuram Mirdha, Ashok Gehlot and shri Nawal Kishor Sharma. Besides, Mr. Raj Bahadur was High Commissioner of India in Nepal. Shri Nathu Ram Mirdha was President National Agriculture Commission and Shri Satish Chandra Agarwal was Chairman of Public Accounts Committee of Parliament.

Three of our members have held the high office of Chief Minister of the state sarva Shri Tika Ram Paliwal, Jagannath Pahadia and Heera Lal Deopura. Some of our members have held the high office of Speaker of Rajasthan Legislative Assembly namely, Sarva Shri Narottam Lal Joshi, N.N. Acharya, Ram Kishore Vyas, Poonam Chand Bishnoi and Shri Heera Lal Deopura. Shri Ahmed Bux Sindhi and Shri Ram Chandra Choudhary remained as Deputy Speaker, Shri Girraj Prasad Tewari is at present Speaker of the VIII Vidhan Sabha.

Shri D.M. Bhandari, an eminent lawyer and member of First Lok Shba, later adorned the office of judge and chief Justice and after retirement he had been the member of Krishna-Kaveri Dispute Tribunal. In the process of Law making at the national level, though the members

are less in number but the contribution is of great importance. The prominent parliamentarians Sarva Shri Mool Chand Daga, Bisheshwar Nath Bhargava, Swami Dinesh Chandra, Ram Singh Yadav, Birdi Chand, Girdhari Lal Vyas and at the State Level Sarva Shri Inder Nath Modi, N.R. Bhandawat was elected Governor of District 305 Rotary club for 1986-87.

The Bar council of Rajasthan is not confined to its statutory functions under the Advocates Act but has undertaken various schemes and proposals for the betterment, upliftment and welfare of its members. The Bar council has sent a draft of Advocates Welfare Act to the State Government to enact the same. The draft of the Advocates Welfare Act has been framed with a view to ensure social Security of the member advocates or their families and to provide some monetary help, either on account of death or cessation of practice as per schedule. The amount will be paid from the contribution of lawyers fraternity alone and will not be burden either on the litigants or the State.

Scheme for Indigent and Disabled Advocates Fund started in 1966 for helping them which was increased to Rs. 5000/- . So far 30 advocates have been benefitted.

Library Loan Scheme to the Associations started in 1981. And now three model schemes have been framed by the Bar Council of India in lieu

of collection of Rs. 10/- per year under sec. 40/4A of Chapter I of the Part VI of Bar council of India Rules, and state councils will adopt accordingly, and 20% of total collection of Rs. 10/- by the Bar council will be sent to Bar council of India & B.C. I. will formulate scheme u/s 44 (b) for Advocates Suffered due to National Calamity.

The various conferences have been held from time to time, to name, a few (i) All India Law Conference, 1966, & Bar Council Chairmans conference, 1966 at Jaipur, (ii) All India Law Seminar at Jodhpur, (iii) State Level Law Conference at Alwar, inaugurated by Justice Venkataramaiah (iv) All Rajasthan Advocates Conference held at Jaipur for Advocates Welfare Act, President by Lokayukta, Justice Shrimal (v) C.L. Agarwal Memorial Law Lectures at Jaipur, Inaugurated by Justice P.N. Bhagwati (vi) Recently Inter-University Moot Court Competition at Jodhpur was organised under the joint auspices of Bar Council of India Trust and Jodhpur University. It was inaugurated by Mr. Justice R. S. Pathak, Judge S. C. of India (vii) State Level Law Seminar held at Jaipur presided by the then Justice D. A. Desai, Judge S. C. of India.

Bar Council of Rajasthan presented portraits of Chief Justices on the eve of their retirement . Mr. C. B. Bhargava was the first Pusine Judge whose portrait was presented & thereafter of Late Justice J. P. Jain which were unveiled in the rooms in which they held their courts.

On elevation of Dr. Nagendra Singh as Judge, International Court of Justice, Hon'ble Mr. Justice A.N. Ray Chief Justics of India, C.K. Daphtari, Shri Niren De, Attorney General, M.C. Chhagla, Shri Ramjethmalani the then Chairman, visited Bar Council and only recently Bar Council of Rajasthan had the privilege of honouring Shri P. N. Bhagwati, Chief Justice of India, Shri H. R. Bhardeaj, Minister of State for Law and Justice Shri Nawal Kishore Sharma, the then Petroleum Minister of India at Jodhpur.

Since 1973, I as its member and then as its Chairman have the privilege to make important suggestions concerning (i) Reduction of a number of arrears, mitigating the delay in imparting justice and making justice less costlier to Hon'ble Chief Justice of India and all concerned, (ii) For 5 years Degree Law Course, (iii) to abolish postal ballot in election and to amend certain rules to Bar Council in India. (iv) In Lok Pal Bill 1985, (v) Regarding procedural change; delay in appointment of Judges and better working conditions of Judicial Officers to Chairman Law Commission (vi)

Certain schemes for Advocates to provide central enactment on social security measures to the members of the legal profession to chairman social security measure Committee, Government of India. (vii) For allotment of land to Advocates of Rajasthan at respective places, and (viii) To provide library loan facilities to lawyers having under 10 year's practice to the Governor and the Chief Minister of Rajasthan.

Credit is yours and faults are mine. I thank you all and wish you all glorious future of dedicated service to our people following the high tradition of our noble profession and for taking them to new heights.

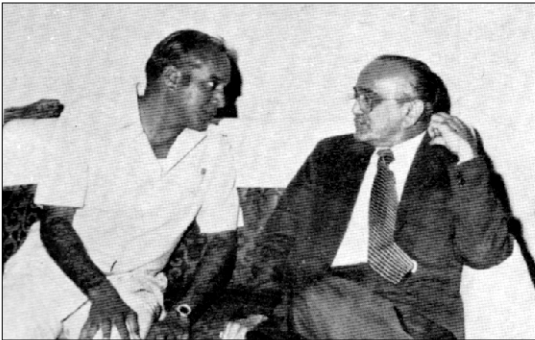

Why say "acting"

For us in Law Weekly, it was quite irksome to refer to the judge as Acting Chief Justice. We felt that the proper address was Chief Justice (Acting). When our country's foremost lawyer the former Attorney General Sri K. Parasaran a distinguished and noble member of our Bar addressed Mr. Justice Jain as Mr. Chief Justice Jain on 27-8-2000, we felt vindicated.

Presidential Speech By
The Hon'ble Thiru Justice N.K.Jain,
Chief Justice, High Court, Madras.

Mr. President of the Association, Dear Brother and Sister Judges and Judicial Officers,

I am very glad to participate in this function and thank the organizers for giving me an opportunity to release the Directory of Judicial Officers compiled by Judicial Officers' Association.

I find that it is the result of strenuous and hard team work. Everyone had his role in the successful compilation of this Directory. It has been prepared very meticulously and a long felt need has come true now. I congratulate one and all for this achievement.

This Directory will help the members of the Association to know about each other and will act as a bridge between themselves and a sense of brotherhood will grow amongst them. That apart, it will be very useful for the Registry and Judges of this court for identifying and making reference to them.

The Association has already started a welfare fund, which has been appreciated by one and all. Floating of such a fund has created a bond amongst the Judicial Officers and the Utility was realized immediately on untimely death of a Judicial Officer. The Directory also contains details of the said welfare scheme. Now, the publication of the Judicial Officers Directory with relevant particulars and photographs is yet another achievement. I congratulate all concerned including printers for the compilation of this Directory in a nice way with good get up.

You have heard the previous speakers, your President and Secretary, and hope you will keep their advice in mind, which will help you all in discharging your duties. It will not be out of place to mention on this occasion that every Judicial Officer is the master of his own Court. They are functioning effectively. It is not appropriate for me to say anything as to how he should function. Yet, I will be failing in my duty, if I do not appreciate your work and also give some advice collectively on this occasion.

There may be many reasons for delay. But, as the Courts are blamed and held responsible for the delay, we should be more vigilant, and should try to find out particular reasons for the delay, and the practical difficulties, if any, and try to solve them with the cooperation of all concerned to dispose of the old cases. It has also been emphasized by the Hon'ble Chief Justice of India that top priority should be given for the disposal of old cases, and you should be alive to such a call always in mind. I am happy to note that you have responded to my constant requests on the basis of the anxiety of Hon'ble Chief Justice of India' in discharging your duties with satisfaction. During the year 2000, the Judicial Officers consisting of about 650 out of 689 Strength in the State have disposed of 13,40,994 Cases, including 22,369 seven years old cases, both civil and criminal, and for the six months from January 2001 to June, 2001, you have disposed of 6,96,896 cases including 10,722 seven years old cases. I congratulate you all and it is because of your personal efforts with the active cooperation of the advocates and staff and others, that you have been able to achieve this target. Please keep it Up.

It will be appropriate to bestow personal attention more to see that summons are served and warrants are executed in time. Sometimes, even after service of notice, the acknowledgements are not tagged with the respective files and some times, notices returned unserved are not brought to the notice of the court, and thus, cases are to be adjourned in courts either for want of service or notice returned served. It should be avoided. The cases should not be adjourned in a casual manner. Particular care should be taken to see that the witnesses should not go without being examined on the dates fixed and so you must so regulate your court work. In the case of professional witnesses like Doctors and Investigating Officers, if they are made to wait for the whole day or to attend the court for the second time, or again and again, whatever may be the reasons, apart from the witnesses being harassed, the work to be done by those witnesses also suffers. The apex court has already given such directions.

So far as the Judicial officers functioning in the family courts and Motor Accidents Claims Tribunals are concerned, they should realize that the delay in disposal of those cases will have direct impact on the litigants. So also while dealing with adoption matters, the cases should be disposed of, taking into account the advice of the India council for child welfare or other child welfare Agencies approved by them at the earliest but in any case within two months, as observed by the supreme court of India. I may

also remind that necessary instructions in this regard have already been issued to the Judicial Officers.

Please also see that Judgments are pronounced without delay. Once Judgment is reserved, avoid reopening of the cases there after for further hearing. Avoid reserving orders in more number of cases at a time. Take care for disposal of cases, particularly the old cases, as emphasized by the Hon'ble chief Justice of India.

After disposal of a case, you should see that copy of the order or Judgment is furnished without any delay. The Judicial Officers should monitor and concentrate on the administrative side and have periodical inspections of various sections including Record sections to speed up the matters like sending records to higher Courts, return of documents to parties, payments of compensation to litigants in Motor Accident and Land Acquisition cases, issuance of order copies etc., In criminal courts, number of matters are pending for execution of non-bailable warrants. Regular monitoring is necessary in criminal courts for serving the NBWs. The Chief Judicial Magistrates should have periodical meetings with police officials and members of the staff and try to eliminate the cases which are pending for long, for execution of NBWs or production of witnesses, and should get reports from the Superintendents of Police. In this respect, I must appreciate the action taken by the Chief Judicial Magistrate and the Principal District Judge, Magistrate and the principal District Judge, Madurai with the Commissioner of Police, Madurai for disposing more than 6000 cases in a short span of 4 months at Madurai. All the Principal District Judges/Chief Judicial Magistrates should be vigilant and monitor execution of NBWs, for reducing the cases so as to avoid unnecessary harassment.

As you are aware, the Judicial Training is gathering Momentum in our country. Without having a proper building and other infrastructural facilities, we have started this Tamil Nadu Judicial Academy as it is necessary to upkeep and refresh the latest laws. We have conducted three different courses in a shorter span of time. I hope on account of that, the Judges who have attended those courses must have felt better in their skill, approach and ethical attitude on account of the opportunity to interact and discuss with each other and also with the eminent faculty members of Hon'ble Judges, senior Advocates, eminent Jurists and experienced persons in all various fields. In this way, the judicial

education and training system will provide a lot to the Judicial Officers in helping them to discharge their duties in a befitting manner, so that they can refresh those points till they get next opportunity to attend another course. This will provide upto date knowledge in law and help you in rendering substantial justice. The members of the Academic Committee, Hon'ble Director and the staff deserve appreciation and I congratulate them all.

As you know, Fast Track Courts are being established in our state also as per XI Finance Commission Recommendation to clear the backlog of old cases. Judges in the Subordinate courts should also observe punctuality in attending court and to dispose of the cases maintaining the norms prescribed by the commission as we have given adhoc promotions to our officers instead of engaging retired Judges, as meant for. At present, we wanted to establish 30 courts in the state and I am happy to inform that the Government has issued the Government order. So, training for them will commence shortly so as to start functioning.

Another important field where the Judicial Officers should bestow their attention is the Legal Aid. If proper advice is given to the party or parties concerned, most of the cases can be settled at the threshold. Most of the cases pending would be out of mere prestige issue or with ego. Tamil Nadu State Legal Services Authority has published 14 small books covering important Acts and abstracts of various provisions so also where to approach for redressal. In this way, legal awareness is created among the common man, so that they can approach the concerned Taluk Committees for redressal of their grievances. We have made a panel of competent and efficient advocates, including ladies, on the recommendation of the respective Chairman of District and Taluk Legal Aid Committees. All efforts have been taken for creating some posts and enhancing honorarium. Again, I am happy to intimate that the Government has also agreed to double the honorarium for those persons, who are working for Legal Aid and I extend my sincere thanks for the same to the Government. Where there are Law Colleges, law students are also involved to assist legal aid advocates to give advice and redress the grievances of the downtrodden and needy persons, by conducting Lok Adalats, Legal Awareness comps and Legal Aid Clinics so as to fulfil the desire of the Executive chairman and the patron in chief, National Legal Services Authority in achieving the object of the Act. Shortly, we are going to start Legal Clinics in Madurai and Trichy in addition to Chennai. I

appreciate the work done by Member Secretary and the respective chairman of the District and Taluk Legal Aid committees, social workers, Non-Government organizations, senior advocates and their team work. Only yesterday, we had meeting of the state Legal Services Authority. We have passed certain resolutions requesting the High Court/ Government to consider to provide some more facilities for the betterment in achieving the object through Legal Aid Programme and I hope the High court and the Government will take necessary steps at the earliest.

We know about your hard work and sincerity. Always think about the poor litigant. He does not come to the court because he wants to but he is before you because of compulsion. Always be kind towards the helpless litigants. As to the behaviour of the Judicial officers, you should sit in time in the morning and even after lunch, and be more courteous, and should not create any impression of any partisan attitude. The important requirement of a Judge is to detach himself with respective parties, so as to avoid any criticism, as such criticism would not only affect the working of that particular Judicial Officer but also affect the Judiciary in general. You should maintain the dignity, respect and should prove to be worthy of the confidence reposed on you by the public.

The High Court is taking care of the interest and welfare of the Judicial officers. All possible steps are being taken. High Court tries to accommodate officers at the place of their choice to the extent possible, however without disturbing one officer for the sake of accommodating another officer. You are always free to approach your superiors for redressing your grievance, be it transfer or promotion. But let it be only when the need arises. I assure you that whatever possible from our side will be extended to one and all. I am fully aware of the problems of the Judicial Officers including granting them promotion and other entitlements as that of car, houses etc., and others indicated by your president and are taking steps to solve the same including security, if necessary as pointed out to me yesterday by a representation.

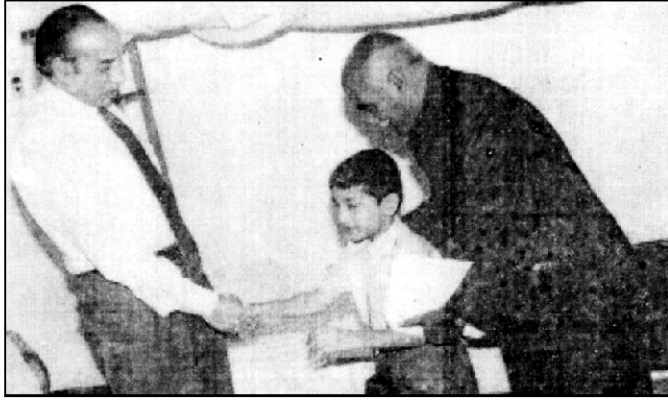
While publishing the Directory in future, you can incorporate some more salient features and particulars relating to Judicial Officers.

Sri K.V. Venkatapathi, Advocate General welcomes the Chief Justice

“My Lord the Chief Justice, Hon'ble Judge, Family members of Hon'ble Chief Justice, Thiru A.W.A. Salam, Secretary of Judicial Service Commission Srilanka, respected colleagues at the Bar, Ladies and Gentlemen.

It is a matter of great joy that Your Lordship after having been the Acting Chief Justice since 6th June this year has been appointed as the permanent Chief Justice of this great Chartered High Court. Your Lordship came to this Hon'ble Court on transfer on 19-12-1997 when I had the privilege of welcoming Your Lordship as the Judge of this High Court. You have the unique distinction of having acted as Chief Justice thrice in this High court. It is also noteworthy that in the annals of this High Court you have the distinction of becoming the Permanent Chief Justice after having acted as Acting Chief Justice thrice, which opportunity no other Acting Chief Justice got before.

Your Lordship was born on 20th October 1942. After initial schooling and tertiary education, you obtained a degree in law and enrolled yourself as an Advocate on 26-1-1968. During the period of 1975-1977 you worked as part time Lecturer in Jodhpur University. From a close look at your life, it will become evident that you are a multifaceted personality. In your student days you were a star-performer in Badminton at the National level and held your sway in that field throughout a decade which extended from 1955 to 1966. You were a Recipient of Best Sportsman Medal of the College which earned you a scholarship from the Sports Council in 1961. In the field of Badminton you occupied pivotal positions like Joint Secretary, Vice President of the Rajasthan Badminton Association and also you had the occasion to be the State Umpire in Badminton. It is also very creditable that you amended the Asian Trial Games in Badminton.

While you were pursuing your practice very actively you were also engaged in the activities relating to Rajasthan/ Association/ Federation and/ Council of India in various capacities.

You built up extensive practice in both Civil and Criminal sides, Constitutional matters, Company Law and Tax matters before Rajasthan Bench of High Court.

You were elevated as a permanent Judge of Rajasthan High Court. Even as a High Court Judge, you were nominated as a member of Academic Council, National Law School Bangalore and continued in this position till August 1995. It is noteworthy to mention here that you are the scion of a Judge. Yes, your father was also a High Court Judge upto 1975 who died in harness.

MANY PROBLEMS SOLVED

In your Lordship's tenure as Acting Chief Justice thrice, you have done vast improvements in the administration of the High Court. During your **FIRST TENURE** from January 1999 to May 1999 as Acting Chief Justice, you were responsible to solve many problems and made many improvements in the High Court which I would like to mention here.

1. Inter-se seniority between direct recruit and integrated Judicial Officers pending for a long time had been settled in one sitting and that was approved by the Supreme court and seniority fixed and promotions effected immediately.
2. Govt. was pleased to sanction 294 posts in various categories in High Court Service in G.O.Ms No. 526, Home Department dated 21-4-99.
3. Administrative files moved as fast as they could.
4. About 40,000 pending copy application for over 2 years in the Current Section were compiled with and brought upto date.

5. About 39,550 cases were disposed of in about 4 months time between January 1999 and April, including 35 Full Bench matters.
6. The Govt. was pleased to sanction construction of one more floor in the Annexe Building and construction of garage in the administrative building in G.O.Ms No. 1482 Home Department dated 10-11-99.
7. The Government was also pleased to sanction computerization of the High Court in G.O.Ms No. 923 Home Department, dated 27-10-99.
8. Selection of 73 Civil Judges (Junior Division) was made, training imparted and posting given.
9. Promotions were effected in the Judicial Service as well as High Court Service.
10. Construction of 286 Additional Law Chambers was sanctioned by the Government.
11. As acting Chief justice, Your Lordship had taken efforts to make 11 Additional Judges as permanent.

Your above first two achievements are remarkable. The first problem which remained unsolved for nearly a decade was solved in your first tenure and many of the Judicial Officers got their due seniority and promotions which brought cheers to the Judicial Officers, while the second problem of dearth of staff was solved by getting sanction of 294 posts in various categories in the High Court service, in one stroke which paved the way for speedy justice. The sanction got for construction of 286 Additional Law Chambers from Government is indeed a feather in your cap as the whole Bar hails the construction of Additional Chambers.

(5 Months and 42,760 cases)

During this FIRST TENURE of 5 months, the disposal of 42,760 cases is no mean achievement. I think this record surpasses the earlier records if any, in the matter of disposals.

After the disposal of cases getting copies of orders quickly had been the most difficult task to the Advocates. But during this first tenure your Lordship caused to clear the copies of orders in as many as 38,940 in just 5 months.

(12 Days- Promotions given)

During the **SECOND TENURE** which was the shortest period of 12 days from September 28 to October 9th of 1999, you never failed to give relief to the officers and staff. The question of promotions to the officers and staff of the High Court was pending in High Court for a very long time. Immediately on your assumption as Acting Chief Justice for the second time you solved this problem and gave promotions to the officers and staff and thus brought cheers in their life.

(3rd Tenure – 10 points programme)

During THIRD TENURE as Acting Chief Justice from 6th June 2000 till date the achievements made by you are not small. I may be failing in my duty if I do not mention them here;

1. Separate Press Building was constructed.
2. Supreme Court Exhibition was inaugurated and held for 2 weeks.
3. On Independence Day, a Prison Adalat was held at Central Prison, Chennai and a Legal Aid Cell was also set up in the Prison Campus.
4. As Executive Chairman of Tamil Nadu Legal Services Authority, a Souvenir, first of its kind in this State, was published in Madurai.
5. Nine Acts were translated in Tamil and released and distributed to the Public to inculcate legal knowledge and legal awareness in legal aid programme.
6. Orientation Programme was arranged for 50 newly recruited Civil Judges (Junior Division) and posting given.
7. Several Lok Adalats were held and the important one among them is the Lok Adalat held at Neyveli, wherein long pending Land Acquisition cases were settled and amounts distributed to the claimants.
8. After summer vacation 2000, about 16 new Courts were inaugurated in various places in Tamil Nadu.
9. Separate Pay & Accounts Office has been sanctioned by the Government exclusively for the High Court.
10. Arrangement to supply the cause-list through the Internet and in print in the night itself.

Of the above achievements during your THIRD TENURE, the inauguration of 16 Courts in various places in Tamil Nadu after Summer Vacation during the current year is a very great achievement. In this matter you have created a record. The creation of Pay and Accounts Office in the High court Campus exclusively for the High court is welcomed by all the staff and officers of the High Court. In this respect, I make an appeal to Your Lordship that all the Courts, Judicial Officers and Law officers functioning in the High Court campus should be attached to the newly created Pay and Accounts Office here so that all the staff and officers working in this campus benefit from it.

The most rewarding benefit in so far as the Advocates based in this Metropolitan and practicing in the High Court are concerned is the supply of cause-list overnight through the computers linked to the Internet and in print. My colleagues and myself personally thank you and lustily cheer this achievement of yours.

(3 Months and 36,945 cases)

It is noteworthy that in less than 3 months i.e. from 6-6-2000 to 31-8-2000 you have achieved a record disposal of 36,945 cases in the High Court including 52 Full Bench matters in respect of the copies of orders during the same period, out of 20,073 cases the order copies have been issued in 19545 cases leaving only a negligible pendency of 528 cases.

The present Government is always very keen in solving the problems facing the Judiciary. Your Lordship made the most of this Government's goodwill a good gesture. I will be failing in my duty if I do not convey the gratitude of the entire Bar and of the Judiciary to the Hon'ble Chief Minister Dr. Kalaingar for lavishly sanctioning these for the construction of 286 Additional Law Chambers, one more floor in the Annexe building, a garage in the Administration Building, a separate building for the Press besides sanctioning 294 posts in various categories to the High Court Office and various other projects proposed by the High Court. This only shows the Hon'ble Chief Minister's respect and regard for the Judiciary his concern for its problems and his readiness to help it out even when the Government is faced with the financial crunch.

Your Lordship has been very kind to the members of the Bar, who feel at home whenever they appear before you. You never hurt the feelings of anyone of the Bar members. True to the dictum that no person is dressed for the day unless he wears a smile on his face, you always wear a smiling face which attracts each and every member of the Bar. This sterling quality has earned you a lofty place in the hearts of Bar members.

I have had the privilege of welcoming 4 Chief Justices, working with 5 Chief Justices and welcoming 26 Judges in my capacity as Advocate-General within a span of 4 years. I cherish this privilege. I hope to welcome many more new Judges in the next few days and request Your Lordship to take steps to get them soon.

Your Lordship is left with more than 4 years of service. Considering your tremendous achievements I thought three short spells of about nine months as Acting Chief Justice we are very confident that this High Court will be there to see many vicissitudes of changes in many fields in the 4 long years before you. But we do not want to be very greedy. We would like to spare Your Lordship to the Supreme Court to bring in more achievements on all India level so that the entire country will have the advantage of these achievements.

I on behalf of the Bar and on my own, extend hearty welcome to you Lordship to be the permanent Chief Justice of this great High Court, assuring you our fullest cooperation at all times to come. Thank you.

Our popular and learned Advocate General Sri K.V. Venkatapathy, in his Welcome speech, has given expression to all our feelings of delight at the finalisation by the Rastrapathi of the act of shedding of the unwanted prefix "Acting" by Chief Justice Jain . We in Law Weekly associate ourselves with every word that the learned Advocate General spoke on the occasion.

We only wish to add that the spirit of bon homier which always prevailed with our Hon. Chief Justice while in the company of members of the Bar, either in Court or off the Court, deserves special mention. The innovation of the New Year Day Get-together of Advocates and Judges on the first working day of every year at 9.30 A.M. in the High Court's Forecourt lawn, shows the importance that our learned Chief Justice paid to the preserving of bon homie atmosphere. Again, the concern for the average lawyer's working time utilization is to be seen in the bringing out of newly well edited cause lists. This has served to save at least a valuable half hour of every day to the average lawyer which he was perforce made to spend previously because of the cause list being received not only "in loose sheets" (as pointed out by the learned

Advocate General), but in a dis-arranged manner, which had made the matter worse. The Administration Reforms brought about by His Lordship in the formation of the Judicial hierarchy in the State, and in the administrative regime of the High Court and in the various sections of the High Court, particularly in the Copying Department regarding the Bail orders, have carved out a niche in the hearts of the members of the Bar towards our Chief Justice. He carries with him the blessings of the elders in this state and the good wishes of the members of the Bar and his colleagues who all pray to the Almighty to bestow the Choicest Blessings on Chief Justice N.K.Jain and his family for all time to come.

GENERAL'S FAREWELL ADDRESS**

“My Lord the Chief Justice, Family members of Hon'ble Chief Justice, Judges of this Hon'ble High Court, Members of the Bar, Ladies & Gentlemen. We have gathered here to bid farewell to My Lord Chief Justice on his transfer as Chief Justice of Karnataka High Court and My Lord will be assuming the charge as Chief Justice of Karnataka High Court on 31-8-2001. My Lord Hon'ble Chief Justice officiated as Acting Chief Justice of the Hon'ble High Court thrice and was made permanent Chief Justice of this Hon'ble Court on 13-9-2000.

Having been with Your Lordship from 19-12-1997, Your Lordship's attitude has always been to take things as it comes without any rejoice or regret. Because of this attitude Your Lordship was able to bypass several problems. Because of the intensity of involvement in your work as Chief Justice, you had no time to think or ruminate over small things. It is customary to refer to the digest of your unclear Farewell Address. But I am not referring to it because I am duty bound to recount your achievements and improvements in the judicial administration as the Chief Justice. They are too many.

As a judge of the Hon'ble Court you treated the Bar very kindly and you treated both the senior and the junior lawyers alike. During the arguments you expressed your views freely and without reservation which enable the lawyer to understand the court. Your Lordship always believed that the problems coming before you should be solved rather than which lawyer should win his argument. Socrates defines four qualities of a Judge. They are, hear courteously, to answer wisely, to consider soberly and to decide impartially. Your Lordship satisfied all the four criteria, you were also of the view that law is not alien to commonsense. You brought

several reforms. Initially there was resistance, later on, re-conciliation and finally recognition. We always felt that the office of Chief Justice never weighed on your shoulders and you were ready to talk with all of us on any problem whenever we wanted. On behalf of the entire members of the Bar I thank you for your courtesy.

Arrear Reduced

About your achievements and improvements my predecessor sri. K.V. Venkatapathy had referred to some of them while welcoming your Lordship on Your Lordship's assumption as Chief Justice on 13-9-2000. Your Lordship with the help of brother judges and with the assistance of the lawyers as a team reduced the arrear of cases in this Court considerably. We are passing through an age of social questioning. Hence, reduction of arrears was a major programme in your Agenda. The records show that in the High Court 2,41,885 cases were disposed of after Your Lordship assumed office as Chief Justice. This is upto August 2001. It is heartening to note that out of these 31,353 cases were 7 years old and 1542 cases were 15 years old cases. Similarly due to your supervision and superintendence, subordinate courts disposed during the same period 21,78,047 cases, of which 36000 cases were seven years old cases. During Your Lordship's tenure eight new subordinate courts were constituted. Your Lordship got sanction for constitution of 30 Fast Track Courts in Ist Phase in the cadre of Additional District Judges to clear pending criminal cases in the State including cases involving under trial prisoners. By Your Lordship's Endeavour Chief Judicial Magistrate in various Districts with the help of the Commissioner of Police and police officials were able to dispose of long pending criminal cases because of non execution of Non Bailable Warrant. Nearly 20000 Non Bailable Warrants were executed in the year 2000 and four thousand for this year which accelerated the disposal of pending cases. Lawyers were very happy when Your Lordship took steps to distribute the cause lists in the book form with index facility which saved a lot of time and energy of the lawyers. When the cause lists were supplied in loose sheets, arranging them was a difficult operation requiring special skill. Similarly putting cause list in the Internet enables a lawyer to adjust his work because the cases listed next day is known to him the previous day.

Quick Copies

The junior members of the Bar and the clerks are happy because the bail orders and other interim orders are issued in the computerized form

on the same day of the order. Your Lordship was able to get sanction for 50 computers with the peripheral towards the computerization of the High Court. Your Lordship's efforts to construct Additional Law Chambers for the lawyers is going to become a reality soon and the construction is almost complete and every lawyer who is going to occupy the chambers will remember you.

Your Lordship was responsible for amending the High Court Original Side, Appellate side and Civil Rules of Practice. The Rules framed under Article 226 of the Constitution of India, even though finalized, is yet to be approved. Because of heavy workload and changing circumstances all the Rules required an amendment. Lord Denning in his book "Closing Chapter" refers to great lawyer Edmund Flowden, who commended an amendment with the words "blessed be the amending hand."

Many Achievements

Your Lordship has always had a soft corner for the Subordinate Judges. Twelve District Judges were promoted to the cadre of District Judge (Super Time Scale). Since it is a known fact that the delay in disposal of the cases in lower Courts is because of want of Presiding Officers, Your Lordship was responsible for amil Nadu Public Service Commission's selection of District Munsiff / Judicial Magistrates. Similarly Your Lordship initiated action for direct recruitment of judicial officers for the Union Territory of Pondicherry and mutual transfer policy of Judicial Officers of Tamil Nadu and Union Territory of Pondicherry was also approved. Apart from the above achievements it is necessary to list out the following efforts taken by Your Lordship. At your Lordship's instance Committees were constituted in every District consisting of the District Judge, District Collector, top Police Officer of the District, member of the Bar Council, and the President of the local Bar Association, in order to sort out any dispute that may arise between the members of the Bar and others, and if necessary to take assistance of the Hon'ble Portfolio Judge and the Home Secretary, in case of any problem. Your Lordship has taken steps for the establishment of an Engineering College by A.G. & O.T. with the Hon'ble Chief Justice of India as the Visitor Chancellor and it is under process. Your Lordship got approval of the Government for construction of a Guest House for High Court at Egmore. During Your Lordship's tenure Tamil Nadu Judicial Academy was inaugurated in the Judicial Officer's Quarters and three courses of training for in, Service Judicial Officers were imparted.

Staff Members Honoured

Your Lordship persuaded several Senior Advocates to give lectures to them. A proposal for the construction of separate building for the judicial Academy at Pallikarnai was recommended by Your Lordship and the Government has approved the same. Your Lordship persuaded the Government to sanction of 50 new cars for Hon'ble Judges. Merit Certificates were issued by Your Lordship on Republic Day and Independence Day to sincere, honest and dedicated staff members in the Registry and this has increased the efficiency of the staff. Your Lordship is the Patron-in-Chief of the Legal Services Authority of Tamil Nadu. Your Lordship was actively associated in all the legal aid programmes. Regular Lok Adalats were held at Erode and Tanjavur.

Because of your Lordship's active support Prison Adalats were constituted at 4 Central Prisons. Women Prison Adalat was also constituted. New lawyers were empaneled to attend to legal aid schemes. All these achievements and improvements narrated above are not exhaustive, but only illustrative. Because of the time constraint, I am not in a position to cover all your achievements.

Courteous & Friendly

As a man you followed the principle which is Ahimsa Paramo Dharmaha. You are very courteous and friendly. If anyone meets you outside the court, he feels, he is meeting a friend and not a Chief Justice. You are going to join the new station tomorrow. On behalf of the Bar and on my own, I wish you a very successful and fruitful tenure. I conclude my address with the benediction – “May life and destiny treat you kindly and all good be yours. God Bless you and your family.”

**Reply To Farewell Address By The Honourable Chief Justice of
Karnataka Sri. N.k.jain At Bangalore On 15.10.2004**

1. My esteemed Brother Justice S.R. Nayak, sister Judge and brother Judges, Sri. A.G. Mulwadmath, Chairman of the Bar Council of Karnataka, Sri. B.T. Parthsarathy, Advocate General, President of the Advocates Association, Bangalore, Past Presidents of the Association, Ms. Sheela Aneesh, President of the Women Lawyers' Federation, former Chairmen of the Bar Council, former Advocate Generals, learned senior advocates, other learned members of the Bar, learned members of the Judiciary, Registrars, Officers and Staff of the High Court and the subordinate Courts, ladies and gentlemen.

2. I am overwhelmed and deeply touched by the kind words and sentiments expressed by the Chairman, Karnataka Bar Council in his farewell address and I have no words to express my thanks.

3. By God's grace, I had an opportunity to serve in this High Court as Chief Justice for 3 years. I had the privilege of hearing the arguments of eminent counsel of this High Court. I have learnt a lot. That apart, being a sportsman, the good habits of we-feeling, dedication, hard work, anticipation with court craft, concentration, to remain calm at all situations have been cultivated by me since the age of 12 years. I have developed the habit of learning good things and qualities from every one, even from my opponent, in order to overcome any shortcomings and mistakes and to improve and develop skill with perfection, by keeping in mind that learning is a constant process, not only in games but also in all walks of life, and particularly in the legal profession. I have gained much from the persons with whom I have come in contact during my stay here at Bangalore.

4. Karnataka State is famous for its culture, tradition and temples and sacred pilgrim centres. Its capital Bangalore the Silicon Valley, which is well known as garden city, is now the cyber capital of the country. While opening some courts, I also had occasion to visit some of the important places in the State. The people here are very simple in nature, God fearing, peace-loving and tolerant, having unassuming character with no pomp

and show. The fact that the people here have maintained the traditional south Indian culture has not only attracted me, but also made me admire them. Though I was a handicap, since I did not know the local language, the people of this State were so good that language was never a barrier for communication. Language constraint is still there, so also some unfamiliar faces. But due to the common aspects of indelible imprints of rich, high and noble traditions coupled with the quality of hospitality of the States of Rajasthan and Karnataka, from the first day, I never thought myself to be an outsider.

The pendency of cases is always the main problem of judicial system. Paucity of courts was one of the reasons for this pendency. The vacancies in judicial post were another reason for increasing the pendency. My request to the Government was readily responded to by the former Chief Minister, Hon'ble Shri S.M.Krishna and the present Chief Minister, Hon'ble Shri N. Dharam Singh.

I may say here that on my visit to different places, I had requested the Judicial Officers to be more courteous, impartial and careful while discharging their duties and to expedite the matters. I had also brought to the notice of the Judicial Officers that with the co-operation of the concerned Deputy Commissioner and the Superintendent of Police, they could monitor and dispose of the cases which were pending for non-production of accused persons or for non appearance of witnesses. So also I have urged to my companion Judges to dispose of cases well in time. It has given good results. There is a steep increase in the work load on account of heavy filings due to fact that the High Court has not been working with full strength for quite some time now. Despite this, with the co-operation of brother and sister Judges, advocates and staff, we have been able to dispose of about 2.38 lakh cases as against the institution of 2.83 lakh cases as on 8.10.2004 in the High Court during my tenure. I am fully satisfied that in response to my constant reminders, the members of the sub-ordinate judiciary have disposed of about 25 lakh cases since 2001 upto September 2004, which is remarkable. Each one of them deserves appreciation. I offer my sincere gratitude to those who inspired, encouraged, co-operated and assisted me in discharging my onerous duties. Because of the co-operation I received from the Brother/ sister Judges sitting with me on the Bench, as also my personal staff, I was able to pronounce orders instantly, and, even in reserved matters not later than one week in any case, except in two cases in two weeks. Questions of

law referred to in 22 cases including connected matters were decided by the larger Benches of 5 Judges 259 cases, including connected matters, by the Full Benches and in all about 22,587 cases have been disposed of by me till 8.10.2004. Judicial Officers, members of the Bar and Staff in the subordinate Judiciary have also extended their full co-operation in discharging my administrative functions effectively with satisfaction. Judicial Officers Association has taken care of the welfare of the Judicial Officers, issued Directory of Judges in 2002, and has been arranging sports meet and cultural programmes, which I have attended for three years. I wish them all good luck. I fully support them to have their own guest house and to form a Society to get land for forming a layout for Judicial Officers.

7. It is needless for me to point out that Judges and Advocates are like members of the same family. Our functions are alike because they are all connected with dispensation of justice. An advocate discharges his duties with his best of ability and capability in the interest of his client, without having partisan attitude but as Judges, we have to apply the law on the point to the facts of each case and to discharge our duties with detachment. Credit for a judgment does not go to the Judge alone but to lawyers also, because the assistance at the Bar is directly proportionate to the quality of the judgment rendered by the Judge. Advocates are the Judges of Judges. To my mind, the combination of a healthy Bar and an upright Bench alone can ensure speedy dispensation of justice according to law in its proper perspective. Throughout my tenure here I have been saying in Court itself that the young advocates must work hard and equip themselves in a better manner. There is no necessity for me to repeat it now. I appreciate the valuable assistance given by the Advocates to me in dispensation of justice.

8. To my dear and affectionate colleagues, past and present, I may say that I enjoyed with you and all those with whom I had an opportunity to work all these years. You have been so affectionate towards me and my family, which made us feel at home. I am indeed thankful to my Sister Judge and each and every one of my brother Judges individually. I shall never forget the pleasant company.

9. All the officers and staff in the Registry have sincerely discharged their duties, which made my work easier. It is not possible to name all those who were instrumental for my effective discharge of duties but a few of them can be mentioned. Registrar General Sri. N. Aanda, Registrar

(Judicial) Sri. R. Venkatesh, Registrar (Vigilance) Sri. R.B.Budhal, Registrar (Admn.) Shri S.S. Kulkarni, Shri. N. Narayan, my Secretary, as also their predecessors, Shri A.C. Kabbin, former Registrar General and now my Brother Judge, Shri. A.S. Pachhapure, former Registrar (Vigilance) now is working as Special Judge, Sri. Kukkaje Ramakrishna Bhatt, former Registrar (Judicial) now working as District Judge at Tumkur, have been of immense assistance to me in the discharge of my administrative functions and my thanks are due to all of them.

10. Karnataka Judiciary has switched on to scientific approach by streaming the judicial progress through computerization. In order to curtail the law's delays, computerization has been taken up in the High Court and other lower Courts in Karnataka. The work of modernization of Justice delivery system for making it more effective and quick is almost completed in the High Court while considerable progress has been made in the lower Courts. Brother Justice G.C. Bharuka, former Judge of this High Court, after him Brother Justice R.V. Raveendran, who is now the Chief Justice of Madhya Pradesh and now the Committee headed by Brother Justice S.R. Bannur Math, in a team spirit along with Officers and officials of NIC, have done tremendous work in this regard. I would like to place the same on record.

11. As the Patron-in-Chief of the Legal Services Authority, I had an occasion to devote my attention for the settlement of cases also. The members of the State Legal Services Authority, its Executive Chairman, former and present, and Member secretaries, past and present Chairmen of High Court Legal Services Committee, Member Secretary and other members, and staff of the Committee have worked hard to achieve the object of the Legal Services Authorities Act. In the beginning Brother Justice A.J. Sadashiva gave momentum to the activities of the State Authority. Thereafter, Brother Justice Raveendran, who was earlier functioning as Chairman of the High Court Legal Services Committee, took over as Executive Chairman and did yeomen service in an excellent manner with Member Secretary Sri. Arali Nagaraj and thereafter Sri. A.M. Bennur and their staff. I may point out that up to the end of August 2004 a total number of 4532 Lok Adalat sittings have been held, a total number of more than one lakh of cases have been settled and an amount of more than 109 crores of rupees has been awarded as compensation in Motor Vehicle Accident and Land Acquisition cases. 1842 legal literacy and legal aid camps have been arranged in which more than 6 lakhs of

people have been benefited. Permanent Lok Adalats have been established in 8 districts. The State Authority has been making tremendous contributions in the field of spreading legal awareness among the people of the State. A number of booklets and pamphlets containing the gist of various important statutory provisions have been published. I had an occasion to release five booklets on 09-11-2001. On 16-1-2003, another book on legal information to common people containing 25 law topics was released, with an abridged edition of the same booklet. Eight audio Cassettes containing songs on legal literacy were released on 12-4-2003. Audio cassettes have been brought out and musical recitals, dances and dramas, radio and television programmes have been arranged to spread legal awareness. All the concerned deserve appreciation for their commitment, dedicated, hard and sincere work.

12. Initially brother Justice R.V. Raveendran and thereafter Brother Justice P.V. Vishwanatha Shetty, as Executive Chairman of High Court Legal Services Committee, have taken keen interest in settlement of matters. Five Brihant Lok Adalats were arranged, in two of which Honourable Sri. K.G. Balakrishnan Judge Supreme Court of India and Sri. Justice S. Rajendrababu, Former Chief Justice of India, attended. The then Hon'ble Chief Justice of India Sri. V.N. Khare inaugurated the Legal Services Clinic in the High Court premises which hears the problem of the weaker section of the society and the downtrodden on various matters and renders legal advises to them. Daily Lok Adalats sitting are being held in the High Court. It is a matter of great satisfaction that all concerned, in particular all brother Judges have rendered valuable service, given support, co-operation and worked hard even after regular Court Hours. I hope that all the concerned in further will work in a team spirit and be able to do wonderful job in order to achieve the object of the Legal Service Authorities Act.

13. Karnataka Judicial Academy has grown into a big important institution in the State by the valuable services rendered by its Presidents Brother Justice P.Vishwanatha Shetty, thereafter brother Justice B. Padmraj, and now Brother Justice A.M. Farooq, other Governors (former and present), V. Jagannath, Director and other officers of the Karnataka Judicial Academy past and present. The computer hall and the Lecture Hall were inaugurated by Hon'ble Justice Shri N. Santosh Hegde, Judge, of Supreme Court of India on 24.6.2002. Valuable services were rendered by them in conducting a large number of training programmes and

arranging seminars and conferences. Staff has also been benefited by this training programme. All concerned deserve appreciation for the same. I am thankful to all of them. I am sure that the training courses, workshops and conferences held have enriched the knowledge of the participants and enabled them to discharge their duties more efficiently.

14. Dr. H.R. Bhardwaj, Chairman of I.C.A.D.R. New Delhi, now Union Law Minister was kind enough to agree to my proposal to start a regional centre of the I.C.A.D.R. at Bangalore. We were able to have the Regional Centre at Bangalore with the assistance of Shri Krishna Murthy, Treasurer, ICADR, Brother Justice Chandrashekaraiiah and now Brother Justice N.Kumar as the Executive Chairmen of the Bangalore Regional Centre for Alternative Dispute Resolution (ICADR), and other Members as also Shri Sandresh, Asst. Secretary of the I.C.A.D.R. have co-operated and taken pains to ensure smooth functioning of the Regional Centre.

15. At this stage I may also point out that the National Law Schools of India University, Bangalore in particular the Director Prof. A Jaya Govind who is also a member of the ICADR, Bangalore Regional Centre, has extended full co-operation with the working of the ICADR and with their assistance we have been able to introduce a Diploma/ Degree Courses in Arbitration and Conciliation. In this way, students who have passed this course will have an opportunity to have training from the ICADR Regional Centre at Bangalore, so that they can be appointed as Arbitrators/ conciliators. With the help of the Govt. I.C.A.D.R. has conducted training programme for ladies by Hon'ble Justice Shri N. Santosh Hegde, Judge Supreme Court and for P.W.D. Engineers and transport Department officers, and now we are also starting a course for the training of students and graduates and experts from different departments like P.W.D., Chamber of Commerce & Industry and such other organizations. They can undergo training so that the I.C.A.D.R. can take them into consideration while appointing Arbitrators through Courts or otherwise. We have also requested Government to provide an independent plan so as to have an independent building for the I.C.A.D.R. near Karnataka Judicial Academy which will help in the training programmes and effective implementation of the object of the I.C.A.D.R., which is a global body now. In this way, it will enhance the image of Bangalore to compete with other cities in the country with regard to arbitration in Inter-State and International Disputes. I appreciate and record a sense of gratitude for the pattern, the Chief Justice of India and the Chairman of I.C.A.D.R. Dr. H.R. Bhardwaj, Hon'ble Union Law Minister.

15-A. I also appreciate the service rendered by the past editors and present editor in publishing and releasing Karnataka Series of 'Indian Law Reports' in time. I hope that under the guidance of brother justice S.R. Nayak and other members of the Karnataka Law Reporting Council the good work will be continued.

16. I will be failing in my duty if do not make a mention about the efforts made by my former brother Judges Justice T.S. Thakur, who is now in Delhi, Justice H.Rangavittalchar, and Justice A.V. Srinivasa Reddy, who were the members of the earlier Committee and also brother Judges Sri, N. Kumar and Sri. A.C. Kabbin in getting the High Court library renovated at a huge cost of more than a crore of Rupees. A special mention should be made about Sri. Prakash, Assistant Executive Engineer, in addition to Shri K. Udaya, Chief Architect and Shri Muninarayana-swamy, in-charge Chief Engineer who has taken meticulous care in the renovation work and with the assistance of his colleague, contractor and their team has done wonderful work within a reasonable time.

17. I was a member in the third meeting of the Judicial Group of strengthening Judicial Integrity attended by Chief Justices of different countries during January 2003 at Colombo. I visited Nepal also. By talking to Chief Justice of Supreme Court of both the countries, I tried to secure some reciprocal benefits to the dignitaries from the High Court visiting these countries. It is hoped that they will materialize in the near future. As Chief Justice of this High Court, I had occasions to interact with a number of foreign dignities on being invited by the Excellency the Governor of Karnataka. I am highly grateful to Her Excellency Smt. V.S. Rama Devi and His Excellency Shri T.N. Chaturvedi for the opportunity provided. A number of foreign Judges and eminent jurists like Mrs. Justice Campbell, Federal Court, Canada, Justice Micheal Kirby, Australian Judge, Thailand delegation led by Justice Praphansubsang, Presiding Justice of Thailand Supreme Court, Delegates from Indonesia headed by Hon'ble Mr. Justice Arbijoto, Judge Supreme Court of Indonesia and chinese delegation led by Mr. H.E. Liu Jaichen, Vice-President of Supreme Court People's Court of China and a delegation from Sri Lanka have also visited this Court. They have appreciated our work and returned with sweet memories.

18. As per the resolution passed in the Conference of Chief Justices, held on 10th, 11th, & 12th October, 2003, I was appointed as one of the members of the Committee, along with two other Chief Justices, which are

constituted to examine the recommendations of Arrears Committee Report 1989-1990 (Justice Malimath Committee Report) and First National Judicial Pay Commission (Justice K.Jagannath Shetty Commission) Report, and to submit the report. I appreciate the co-operation extended by the respective High Court Registry and the Chief Justices of different High Courts in sending the necessary information, enabling us to submit the report in time. The report was also considered in Chief Justices' and Chief Ministers' Conference recently held on 18 & 19th September, 2004.

19. It is not out of place to mention that Assistant Registrars (Protocol), Sri. D.R. Balakrishna, Sri. K.S. Raghavendra Rao and Sri Kanakraj and the staff in the Protocol Department, High Court establishment, Accounts and other Judicial and administrative Sections also deserve appreciation and I express my thanks to all of them.

20. I also appreciate the services rendered by Dr. Dixit and Dr. Triveni of High Court Dispensary. I have also visited Lions Eye Hospital and Manipal Hospital. I appreciate Dr. Jyothi Shetty, Eye Specialist, and Dr. Shivashankar, in taking personal care of me. I remember their services with gratitude.

21. I am satisfied with the working of the staff. Apart from regular work, the ministerial staff has been conducting sports competition and celebrating Ganesha festival, Kannada Rajyothsava, and joining Independence and Republic Day Celebrations every year in the High Court. In order to recognize their services and to encourage good employees, we have decided to issue appreciation certificates to the employees recommended by a committee consisting of the four Registrars. I may also mention that on account of their strenuous and sincere hard work in dispensation of justice, I hope the Government will consider their demand for higher pay scales favourably, as recommended by me.

22. As regards my personal staff, I have had a team of willing workers. Sri. Raghavendra Upadya, Smt. S. Bharathi Bai, Sri M. Suresh Kumar, Smt. Noorunnissa Begum, Sri K.M. Somashekar, my Private Secretaries, Smt. D. Shylaja, my P.A. substitute, Ms. K.K Sheela deserve special mention here. All my personal staff remained sincere, trustworthy, devoted, and dedicated throughout and rendered valuable assistance. Hence I wish to express my gratitude to them now.

23. Sri. Dathathreya (Retd.) Sri. Bhujabalainh and Sri. Vijaya Kumar, my Court Officers, and other officials attached to my companion Judge viz.

Smt. Varalakshmi and Ms. Suma as also Smt. Vidya G. Habbu and Smt. Roopa, who had an occasion to attend my Court, and Sr. Kumbhi Narasimhiah, Section Officer, Accountants II, and the Peons and Jamadars, Sri Krishna Murthy, and driver Subramani, all worked hard and assisted me. Personal Staff Sriyths Mnjunatha Naik, Vedram Suraj Pal, attached to me at my house from the beginning, and P.W.D., horticulture and security staff deserve appreciation for their services along with Gunmen Sriyuths Venkoba Rao, Ramesh and Mariyanna Shetty, my Personal Security Officers attached to Pilot Vehicle, and other drivers, all did their duties well to my satisfaction.

24. During my visits to various places in Karnataka, the concerned District Judges and the Judicial Officers and the concerned Deputy Commissioner and Superintendent of Police, officers of other Departments like revenue and Police together with their respective staff have made all efforts to make my stay there comfortable. Similarly, the Resident Commissioner, the other officers and officials at Karnataka Bhavan, New Delhi and in particular Sri, Raja took care of me very well on my visits to Delhi and Jaipur via New Delhi. I am thankful to all of them.

25. During my tenure, there was demise of some of the eminent former Chief Justices and Judges, distinguished senior advocates and judicial officers of Karnataka. I remember their good qualities and the services rendered by them.

26. The High Court has maintained good relationship and co-ordination with the Government throughout my tenure and I appreciate the response and support extended by the Government by issuing various orders pertaining to Judiciary. I will be failing in my duty if I do not mention and appreciate the nice gesture on the part of the government in sanctioning, despite so many constraints, the Regional Centre of the ICADR, Computerisation of the High Court and sub-ordinate judiciary (for subordinate Courts alone a sum of Rs. 16.5 crores has been set apart, a sum of Rs. 90.33 lakhs was released during the year 2004, and Rs. 2 crores have been allotted in the budget for 2004-05 and computerization of City Civil Courts will be undertaken at a total cost of Rs. 2.3 Crores under the Central Scheme). The Judges Library was inaugurated by Justice Y.K. Sabharwal, Judge, Supreme Court of India, on 28.8.2004, thereafter High Court library for advocates was inaugurated by His Excellency Shri T.N. Chaturvedi on 22.9.2004 which is in addition to the Judges wing and will enable about 100 advocates at a time to sit and utilise library. A Guest

House for Judges has been inaugurated in presence of Chief Minister on 20.9.2004. During this period, 16 District Courts, 93 Fast Track Courts, 62 new Courts – 16 District Courts, 20 Civil Judge (Sr. Div.) Courts and 26 Civil Judge (Jr. Div) have been sanctioned of them 33 are working and 29 are in the process of functioning. That apart, we have recommended for establishment of 73 Courts which is pending with Government. The Government has taken note that the Court is not like any other department of the Government but is on a higher pedestal. Government has also permitted the High court to make rules for recruitment of first Division and Second Division assistants required for the judicial department, by the High court instead of Karnataka Public Service Commission. They have also decided to give financial autonomy to the High Court by opening a Pay and Accounts Department, which will help in proper maintenance of accounts with internal audit system and ensure transactions without undue delay. Efforts are being made to set up courts in the Jail premises and also to start a unit of Government Printing Press in the High Court premises in the same way as has been done in Tamil Nadu. That would expedite the disposal of cases. Video conferencing has been introduced in important centers like Bangalore and Mysore to enable the Courts to proceed with matters without necessity of the physical production of under trial prisoners. On 16.9.2004, foundation was laid for five development projects in City Civil Courts precincts at a cost of Rs. 6.75 crores. I am happy to acknowledge with gratitude the decision of the Government to set apart a place for the construction of a building for a regional office of the ICADR near the judicial Academy. I also acknowledge with gratitude Karnataka Government's leading role in issuing necessary Government Orders and in showing the gesture by providing one servant, and telephone and medical facility for the retired Judges to maintain a peaceful life with such status after their retirement from constitutional posts. I am also awaiting some orders/ G.O. for establishing Courts at Double road and allotment of land for construction of residential quarters for High Court Judges.

26-A Regarding establishment of a Bench of the High Court in North Karnataka, I have already expressed my opinion earlier. However, now Government has proposed to set up Circuit Benches. The matter can be considered in accordance with law with the settled norms in the interest of public at large.

27- I am thankful to the Government of Karnataka and in particular to the former Chief Minister Sri S.M. Krishna, the present Chief Minister

Sri Dharam Singh, Deputy Chief Minister Sri Siddaramaih, PWD Minister Sri H.R.Revanna, Sri K.K. Misra, Chief Secretary, Sri K.P. Pandey, Additional Chief Secretary and Principal Finance Secretary, Sri Ajar Gore, Additional Chief Secretary Sri Brahma Dutt, Principal Home Secretary, Sri. S.V. Rangnath, Principal Secretary to the Chief Minister and Director General of Police, former Chief Secretaries and Principal Secretary to Chief Minister and their staff, and appreciate the interest taken by them towards the Judiciary.

28. The former Chief Minister of Karnataka as also the present one suggested me to stay in this city. I sincerely thank them but as you know, one always desires to live in one's native place so that one can do some service to redeem what he has received from the society. I am going back to Jaipur, the Pink City of India after 7 years. I value your good wishes and goodwill as precious assets.

29. My habit of asking questions during the course of arguments was not to hurt anybody's feeling but to understand the point in controversy. Of course, I also faced some resentment from the advocates for not indulging in PILs, for not being lenient in executing the orders of the High court in contempt matters and not posting the cases as per the whims of advocates, which according to me is not possible. I have no regrets. I may add that I was brought up like that in a disciplined manner. We have to remember that justice would be effective, only if the power of the courts and respect to them is guarded. The uprightness and independence of judicial unit of the state has contributed accordingly to maintain the prestige of our country. Attempts to denigrate the judiciary should be avoided and every effort must be made to wipe out such tendency. If our judiciary loses its repute in the country, there will be no hope for rule of Law. I have, in my own humble way tried to live up to the highest traditions of my office and I express my unreserved sense of appreciation for the assistance which all of you rendered to me in the effective discharge of my duties. To discharge duties effectively, one has to be strict and take some strong action. In this regard, I have endeavoured to discharge my duties with a sense of duty and keep in mind that in such endeavour no one can please everybody. Some dissatisfaction is always there. It is important to maintain discipline and values in life. I have enjoyed my tenure as a Judge for 14 years 3 months. About 6 years at Jodhpur, 15 months in Jaipur, about 4 years in Chennai and 3 years in Karnataka. I have been discharging my duties as Chief Justice for the last five years. I have done justice with my

work as per my conscience and with full satisfaction, and therefore, I may mention here that if there were any lapses and shortcomings on my part, I may be excused keeping in mind, to error is human.

30. It is not out of place to make a mention about my parents here. My father late Justice J.P.Jain dies in 1975 and my mother Pushpa Jain died 4 years ago while I was in Chennai. My father and his advice still lives in my heart, makes me remember at all times that "Do not expect anything from anybody. Do not be provoked by anyone. Let your heart be not troubled by anybody". Ever otherwise, I have always been careful to have my steps measured.

31. I sincerely thank the Honourable Chief Justice of India and the Collegiums for giving me this opportunity to serve in this beautiful city with pleasant weather. I am also thankful to Hon'ble Sri M.N. Venkatachalih, former chief Justice of India for the love and affection showered on me. My wife Aruna, a pious and contented lady, has silently helped me in my work. But for her full co-operation, I would not have been able to discharge my arduous functions.

32. I take with me very pleasant memories of my association with you all, having worked for a considerable period in this High Court with full satisfaction and will cherish the said memories. I was fortunate to have the blessings of so many Holy Saints in Karnataka and I seek the blessings of the Almighty for us all.

33. May God be with you. My wife Aruna Jain and other members of my family join me in thanking you all once again for having made our stay at Bangalore happy, comfortable and pleasant. I am parting company with you with happiness and satisfaction. Please accept my warm thanks when I bid you good bye.

34. May the Almighty bring all fortunes on you for ever.

केवल कानून बनाने या उपदेश देने से मानवाधिकारों का संरक्षण नहीं होगा - न्यायमूर्ति नगेन्द्र कुमार जैन

साक्षात्कार - विनोद सुरोलिया



राजस्थान मानवाधिकार आयोग के अध्यक्ष न्यायमूर्ति नगेन्द्र कुमार जैन मद्रास तथा कर्नाटक उच्च न्यायालय में मुख्य न्यायाधीश के पद पर कार्य कर चुके हैं। कानून ज्ञाता होने के साथ-साथ वे स्कूली जीवन से ही अच्छे खिलाड़ी रहे हैं और बैडमिंटन के राष्ट्रीय स्तर के खेलों में राजस्थान का प्रतिनिधित्व कर चुके हैं, मानवाधिकार से ताल्लुक रखने वाले सवालों को लेकर जब उन से बातचीत की गई तो उन्होंने बताया कि मेरे व्यक्तित्व को संवारने में सरिता पत्रिका का बहुत बड़ा योगदान रहा है। पेश है बातचीत के कुछ अंश-

मानवाधिकार क्या है ?

मनुष्य के जन्म के साथ ही मानवाधिकार का जन्म भी हुआ है यही कारण है कि मनुष्य के साथ जुड़े हर कार्य एवं विचारों के साथ मानवाधिकार का प्रश्न भी जुड़ा है। मनुष्य की सभ्यता एवं संस्कृति के विकास का आधार मानवीय मूल्य एवं मानवाधिकार ही है, सभ्यता का मूल भी यही है कि एक मानव दूसरे मानव का हित समझे और स्वार्थ का परित्याग कर दूसरे की भावना का आदर करे। न्यायालय भी उस की मान्यता देता है। इसके अलावा अंतर्राष्ट्रीय समझौते के फलस्वरूप संयुक्त राष्ट्रसंघ की महासभा द्वारा भी मानवाधिकार स्वीकार किए गए हैं। इन अधिकारों में प्रदूषण मुक्त वातावरण में जीने का अधिकार, चिकित्सा सुविधा का अधिकार, महिलाओं के सम्मान जनक व्यवहार का अधिकार, स्त्री पुरुष, बच्चों और वृद्ध लोगों के समान अधिकार प्रमुख हैं, इन अधिकारों का हनन जाति, भाषा, भेद के आधार पर नहीं किया जा सकता है।

आजादी के 6 दशक बाद भी मानवाधिकार अपनी पहचान नहीं बना पाए हैं, इस बारे में क्या मत है ?

यह दुर्भाग्यपूर्ण बात है कि मानवाधिकारों की बात लोगों को तब समझानी पड़ रही है जबकि देश पूरी तरह स्वतंत्र हो चुका है और आजाद हुए आधी सदी बीत चुकी है देश में आज भी गरीबी, बेरोजगारी, अशिक्षा के साथ-साथ सामाजिक कुरीतियां तथा अंधविश्वास प्रचलित हैं। यह एक जटिल समस्या है जिसके कारण हमें मानवाधिकारों के लिए संघर्ष करना पड़ रहा है। केवल कानून या उपदेश देने से मानवाधिकारों का संरक्षण नहीं होगा।

मानवाधिकार आयोग के प्रयासों के बावजूद अधिकारों के प्रति लोगों में जागरूकता क्यों पैदा नहीं हुई है ? इसके पीछे क्या नहीं होगा ?

जागरूकता सिर्फ मानवाधिकार क्या है यह समझाने से नहीं आएगी, उसके लिए हमें मानव के गरिमापूर्ण जीवन की सुनिश्चितता को समझना होगा। इस वर्ग, खासतौर से पीड़ित, दलित, उत्पीड़ित एवं महिलाओं के संरक्षण की बात भी ध्यान में रखनी होगी और अत्यधिक जागरूकता के साथ-साथ हमें संवेदनशील भी बनना होगा, ताकि यदि सड़क पर किसी व्यक्ति के साथ कोई दुर्घटना हो तो वहीं रुक कर उस की मदद करें न कि सीधे आगे चले जाएं और बहाना बनाएं कि कानूनी प्रक्रिया का झंझट है या समय नहीं है। यदि मानवता के लिए

किसी के पास समय नहीं है तो फिर क्या खुद मानव बने रहने का अधिकार उसे होना चाहिए। यह तो आपको स्वयं ही तय करना होगा।

गरीबों, बच्चों, महिलाओं और बुजुर्गों को उसके हक से महरूम किया जाता है। ऐसे में यह सवाल उठाना लाजिमी है कि बच्चों, महिलाओं और बुजुर्गों को उन के हक क्यों नहीं मिल रहे हैं ?

आज मानव का मानव पर से विश्वास उठता जा रहा है। परस्पर सद्भाव और सहिष्णुता समाप्त होती जा रही है, व्यक्तिगत स्वार्थ पूरी तरह से हावी हो गए हैं। हम इसको भूल गए हैं कि मानव को गरिमा से जीने का अधिकार है और उन्हें यह अधिकार जन्मजात मिला है, आज कमजोर तबके के अधिकारों का हनन वही लोग कर रहे हैं, जिन्हें यह बात अच्छी तरह से पता है कि ऐसा करना गलत है। अफसोस तो इस बात का है कि गरीब व असहाय लोगों को उनके हित में बने हुए कानूनों की जानकारी देने वाला कोई नहीं है। यदि कोई जड़ जमाइ हुई अकर्मण्य, व्यवस्था के खिलाफ खड़े होने की कोशिश करता है तो उसे इतने सबूत जुटाने पड़ते हैं कि वह सचाई को कहने का साहस ही नहीं जुटा पाता।

मानवाधिकार हनन की सबसे ज्यादा शिकायतें जेलों से आ रही है। जेलोंको सुधारग्रहका रूप दिया गया है पर उस के आचरण से तो ऐसा महसूस नहीं होता आप की क्या राय है ?

यह भारतीय जेलों की त्रासदी ही मानी जाएगी कि वहां कैदी अमानवीय हालतों में रह रहे हैं। हम ने कभी नहीं सोचा कि कैदी भी समाज का अंग हैं। जेल की दीवारों में बंद हो जाने भर से समाज से वे अलग-थलग पड़ जाते हैं। जेलों में भटके हुए लोगों को इसलिए रखा जाता है कि बाहर निकल कर वे दूसरों के साथ मानवोचित व्यवहार करें। उच्चतम न्यायालय ने अपने फैसले में जेलों की माली हालत को दयनीय बताया है तथा इसमें सुधार के निर्देश दिए हैं जिन्हें लागू करने की आवश्यकता है।

मानवाधिकार आयोग को अपने निर्देशों को लागू करने का अधिकार नहीं है। अतः वह बिना हथियार का पहरेदार बन कर रह गया है, जो सिर्फ आंसू तो बहा सकता है पर पीड़ित को कोई राहत प्रदान नहीं कर सकता, इस पर आपका क्या मत है ?

आयोग इंडिपेंडेंट बॉडी है, जिन्हें सिविल कोर्ट के अधिकार प्राप्त है एवं आयोग स्वयं अपने स्तर पर स्वमोटो प्रसंज्ञान भी ले सकता है तथा उसे अंतरिम मुआवजा दिलाने का हक है। आयोग को हर साल अपनी रिपोर्ट में पेश करनी होती है। जिस पर चर्चा का प्रवधान है। मानवाधिकार आयोग को आज्ञात्मक शक्तियां देने के लिए विधायिका को लिखा जा चुका है। ताकि पीड़ित पक्षकारों की गुहारों की सुनवाई कर उन्हें तत्काल राहत दे सकें।

आप जज रहे हैं उस दौरान कौन से यादगार फैसले दिए हैं कुछ कहना चाहेंगे ?

मेरे लिए तो हर मुकदमा महत्वपूर्ण रहा है। यह जनता तथा मीडिया की सोच रहती है कि कौन सा मुकदमा महत्वपूर्ण है बतौर जज मैंने करीब 1 लाख मुकदमों के फैसले को कभी भी एक सप्ताह से ज्यादा समय के लिए लम्बित नहीं रखा। राजस्थान उच्च न्यायालय के न्यायाधीश तथा मद्रास एवं कर्नाटक के चीफ जस्टिस रहते हुए सोनिया गांधी के विदेशी मूल का केस, उमा भारती का तिरंगा झंडा प्रकरण, राष्ट्रपति चुनाव में आरक्षण का मुद्दा, EVM का उपयोग, सुषमा स्वराज, जयललिता, एस.एम. कृष्णा के मकान में वास्तु का मुद्दा, मार्ग्रेट अल्वा व दयानिधि मारन एवं करुणानिधि से संबंधित मामले की सुनवाई की है। इसके अलावा मशहूर चंदन तस्कर वीरप्पन तथा लिट्टे से संबंधित व तेलुगी का केस के ऑफसूट भी मेरे विचाराधीन आये।

फैसलों का खिलाड़ी-न्यायमूर्ति नगेन्द्र कुमार जैन

साक्षात्कार - मुकेश कुमार शर्मा



पेशे से तो मैं जजरहा लेकिन बचपन से ही मेरे अन्दर एक खिलाड़ी छिपा हुआ था। यही कारण था कि मेरा पढ़ाई की बजाय खेल के प्रति ज्यादा झुकाव रहा है। आज भी किसी बच्चे को फालतू घूमते हुए देखता हूँ तो उसके पैरेन्ट्स को यही सलाह देता हूँ कि वह उसे खिलाड़ी बनायें ताकि उसका व्यक्तित्व निखर कर आये, उसमें टीम भावना, समर्पण, दृढ़ निश्चय और संघर्ष की भावना विकसित हो। खेल में रूचि होने के कारण मैंने 12 वर्ष की आयु में बैडमिन्टन का रैकेट थाम लिया। पढ़ाई में सामान्य स्टूडेंट था, मगर स्पोर्ट्स एक्टिविटी में सबसे आगे। महावीर स्कूल से 10वीं पास करने के बाद महाराजा कॉलेज में बीएससी में प्रवेश लिया, पर बैडमिन्टन के लिए कैम्प में इधर-उधर जाना पड़ता था। इसलिए अटेडेंस शॉर्ट हो गई और मुझे बीए की ओर रुख करना पड़ा। बीए करने के बाद जोधपुर कॉलेज से लॉ किया। चूंकि पापा पहले वकील बाद में हाईकोर्ट में जज थे, इसलिए मैंने वकालत शुरू कर दी। हालांकि पैरेन्ट्स इंजीनियर बनाना चाहते

थे। वकालत में आने के बाद स्पोर्ट्स में ज्यादा एक्टिव तो नहीं रह पाया मगर जहाँ भी पोस्टिंग रही वहाँ हर खेल का अंतरराष्ट्रीय और राष्ट्रीय मैच देखने जरूर जाता था।

चौपाटी पर मस्ती और मूवी

एक बार हम स्पोर्ट्स कैम्प के सिलसिले में मुम्बई गये, वहाँ दिनभर खेल एवं प्रैक्टिस के बाद रात को सभी साथी अप्सरा थिएटर में रोजाना फिल्म के इन्टरवेल के समय जाते। शो से लौटते वक्त चौपाटी पर घूमते और चाट-पकौड़ी खाते। माउन्ट आबू के एक कैम्प के दौरान हम सबने रात को सोये हुए अपने साथी गुप्ता जी को बिस्तर सहित सड़क पर लिटा दिया। सुबह उठने पर वे बहुत नाराज हुए, मगर हमने उन्हें मना लिया। उस समय कोच, छोटे-बड़े खिलाड़ियों में अच्छे सम्बन्ध हुआ करते थे। वे मजाक में आपस का बुरा नहीं मानते थे।

अधिकारों के साथ कर्तव्य भी जानें

अपने अधिकारों के प्रति लोगों में जागरूकता आ रही है। लेकिन सिविक ड्यूटीज के प्रति आज भी लोग अवेयर नहीं हैं। लोगों को अधिकारों के साथ ड्यूटीज पर भी गंभीर होना चाहिए। आखिर आप किसी से अच्छे व्यवहार की उम्मीद करते हैं तो आपको खुद को भी वैसा ही व्यवहार करना चाहिए।

टाई के पैसे देने भूल गए

1961 में हम नेशनल खेलने के लिए अमृतसर गए थे। एक दिन शॉपिंग के दौरान वहाँ टाई टाई कर रहे थे, बातों-बातों में ध्यान नहीं रहा और पैसे दिए बिना टाई पहनकर कैम्प में आ गए। जब कोच को यह जानकारी मिली तो उन्होंने डांटा और पैसे देने गए तो शॉपकीपर इतना इम्प्रेस हुआ कि उसने हमसे उस टाई के पैसे नहीं लिये और हमें अन्य खरीदारी में अच्छा डिस्काउंट भी दिया।

महत्त्वपूर्ण केस

मैंने तमिलनाडू, कर्नाटक एवं राजस्थान में बतौर हाईकोर्ट जज एवं चीफ जस्टिस रहते हुए कई महत्त्वपूर्ण मामलों की सुनवाई की। इनमें कुछ देश के बड़े राजनेताओं से सम्बन्धित थे। जैसे सोनिया गांधी के विदेशी मूल का केस, उमा भारती का तिरंगा झण्डा प्रकरण, राष्ट्रपति चुनाव में आरक्षण का केस और सुषमा स्वराज, जयललिता, मारग्रेट अल्वा एवं दयानिधि मारन से सम्बन्धित केस हैं। इसके अलावा मशहूर चन्दन तस्कर वीरप्पन और लिट्टे से सम्बन्धित बाशा एवं मिर्जा की नाती का एवं कई ऑफसूट मुकदमों में भी उनके विचाराधीन आये। राजस्थान में एसएमएस स्टेडियम में खेल गतिविधियाँ, रामनिवास बाग को खोलना, राजस्थान यूनिवर्सिटी में स्टूडेंट्स की अटेडेंस, श्रीगंगानगर में स्टूडेंट्स के एग्जाम सहित कई महत्त्वपूर्ण मामलों पर सुनवाई की। वैसे जज के लिए सभी केस बराबर होते हैं।

एक लाख केस

बतौर जज मैंने करीब एक लाख मुकदमों पर फैसला सुनाया। किसी केस के फैसले को कभी भी एक सप्ताह से ज्यादा समय के लिए पेडिंग नहीं रखा। जोधपुर में बाग को बतौर आम रास्ते के इस्तेमाल हेतु बन्द करना एवं जोधपुर विश्वविद्यालय के शिक्षकों की पेंशन देने का आदेश सुप्रीम कोर्ट से बहाल होने पर व्यवस्था इनके ही आदेश से शुरू हुई।

मानवता के पुजारी



स्नेहापद जैन – व्यक्ति का अस्तित्व उसके व्यक्तित्व से झलकता है। जन्म व्यक्ति का होता है, किन्तु निर्माण व्यक्तित्व का होता है। व्यक्तित्व में सरलता, सौम्यता व स्नेह त्रिवेणी प्रवाहित होती रहनी चाहिए। ऐसा ही व्यक्ति स्नेहापद का अधिकार प्राप्त कर पाता है। बंधुवर जैन इसी अधिकार के पात्र हैं।

संवेदनशील जैन – मानव या प्राणी की पीड़ा को अंगीकार करना संवेदनशीलता की प्रथम सीढ़ी है। कथित पीड़ा का निराकरण कैसे हो ? इसके लिए क्रियाशील बनना दूसरी सीढ़ी है। अन्त में गन्तव्य को प्राप्त कर लेना ही सीढ़ी है। इतना होने पर ही व्यक्ति पूर्ण संवेदनशीलता का परिचय दे पाता है। शिष्ट, सुविज्ञ व विनम्र जैन साहब संवेदनशील बनकर ही जीवन यात्रा पूर्ण कर पा रहे हैं।

न्यायप्रिय जैन – न्याय-अन्याय में अन्तर कर पाना काफी दुष्कर कार्य है। जस्टिस जैन जब पूर्व में मुख्य न्यायाधिपति के पद पर पक्ष-विपक्ष की जिरह (दलीलें) सुनते थे (मद्रास-कर्नाटक हाईकोर्ट) तो काफी शान्त, संयमित व धैर्यवान बने रहते थे। अधीनस्थ न्यायालयों द्वारा दिये गये फैसलों का पुनरावलोकन करना, समीक्षा करना व कभी-कभी फैसलों को बदल तक देना तब ही सम्भव हो पाता था जब जस्टिस जैन कानून की धाराओं को लबों पर रखते आये हो अर्थात् स्मृति व सन्मति को साथ-साथ लेकर चल पाये हो। वस्तुतः जैन साहब न्यायविद होने के साथ ही स्मृति व सन्मति धारक भी रहे हैं जो आपकी प्रतिभा (टेलेन्ट) को परिलक्षित किये बिना नहीं रहती हैं। व्यक्ति को न्यायप्रिय बनने के लिए साधना, त्याग, स्वाभिमान, धैर्य धारण करना होता है। संघर्ष भी झेलना पड़ता है। ऐसा कुछ प्राप्त करके हमारे जैन साहब न्यायविद होने के साथ-साथ न्यायप्रिय भी सिद्ध कर पाये हैं।

शोषण व उत्पीड़न संहारक – देश के लोकतंत्र (डेमोक्रेसी) का होना वरदान प्राप्त हुआ है। लोकशाही और राज्यशाही में क्या अन्तर रहा है ? किन्तु 15 अगस्त, 1947 में प्राप्त स्वाधीनता के बाद भारत के अधिनियम पुनः लागू होना शुरू हुए। जब देश का स्वयं का संविधान (26 जनवरी, 1950) बनकर तैयार हो गया तो देश की पार्लियामेंट ने नये-नये अधिनियम भी पारित किये और जनता को खोया हुआ स्वाभिमान प्रदान किया। आज भारत में शासक और शासित समान है। जनमत से ही शासक निर्वाचित होते हैं। 63 वर्ष की आजादी के बाद भी जरूरत यह है कि देश शोषण व उत्पीड़न मुक्त हो। देश में समता और समानता तब ही कायम हो पायेगी जब समान नागरिक आचार संहिता का अनुपालन हो पायेगा। जस्टिस जैन ने कार्य व्यवहार व स्वाध्याय से जनता का समभाव से जनशिक्षण कर दिखलाया है। आप देश के सभी समाजों के लिए अनुकरणीय व कल्याणकारी मिसाल बन पाये हैं। आप अणुव्रत (जैन धर्म संहिता) के माध्यम से जनता को आचरणशील व चरित्रशील बनाना चाहते हैं। क्योंकि मुनिराज विद्यानन्द जी महाराज के शब्दों में चरित्र ही ईश्वर है।

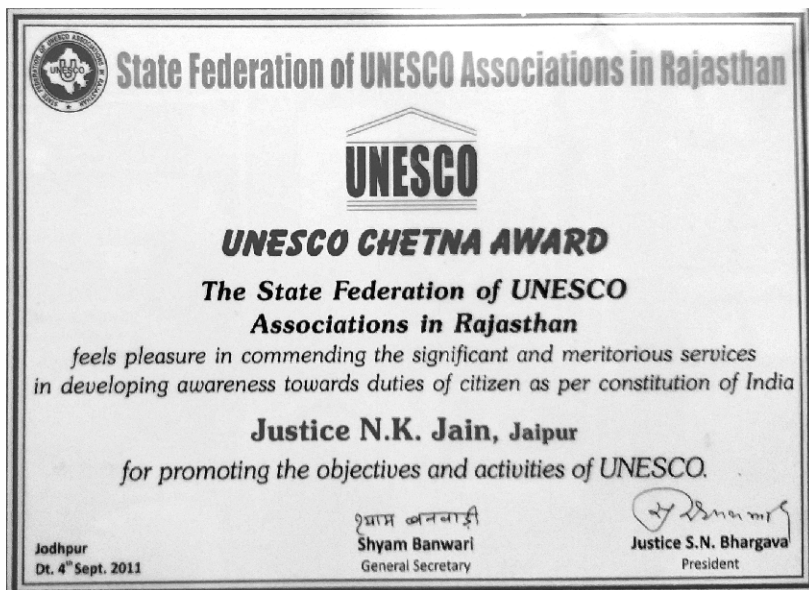

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Ahimsā (Non-Violence) & Human Rights In Indian Culture: With Special Reference To Jainism (1)

Justice N. K. Jain

The rights of all human and living beings get born with the birth on this earth. That is why every activity of a human being is associated with human rights. Basis of the human civilization and culture is the human values and human rights. In the absence of human rights, an individual cannot live with honour.

Indian philosophies are based on contemplation of liberation of the soul and non violence. All religions, philosophies or communities of the world, whether Vedic / Jewish / Christianity / Islām / Pārsi / Sikhism / Buddhism or Jainism, have some form or the other discussions on non violence and accepted its

importance. No religion talks of exploitation of human beings, rather they always talk of human rights along with betterment of human life itself.

Discussions and thoughts on non violence had never been limited to a specified town, state, country, language, community or a philosophical tradition. Neither it is the property of an individual. It is the universal principle and the finest state of humanism.

Non violence is the heart of a culture and foundation of a religion and philosophy. Therefore all noble thinkers have accepted the benefits and essentiality of non violence and discussed its nature as well.

True knowledge is that which enables the human beings in eliminating their pains and sorrows. What is the use of that knowledge which is not capable of doing so? Freedom does not give the right to be selfish.

The focus of Indian culture and religions had been non-violence. It had been accepted that our mother land, i.e. India, had been the holy place to contemplate / analyze and implement non-violence completely. The doctrine of non-violence appears to be the basis of the cultural division of the four time eras / epochs i.e. *Satyug*, *Dwāpar*, *Tretā* and *Kaliyug* sequentially. *Satyug* is considered to be the era of complete non-violence while *Kaliyug* is considered to be the time with maximum violence. Birth of any great saint or God is also considered as the basis to establish the regime of non-violence again by punishing or eliminating the violent or destructive personalities. Even the *bhakti* tradition claims empowerment from devotion to God. In fact there is empowerment from non violence as it is essential to be a non violent individual to qualify as a devotee or one who is dear to God. Paṇḍit Tārā Cand Patni Jyotiṣācārya in his book '*ārye sac ko jāne'*' has given several examples to prove this from the religious texts. Let us look at some of them.

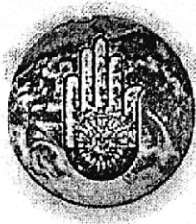

second is a little more difficult, third is got after lot of good deeds are done and the last one is very rarely achieved and a only very auspicious one gets it, but life is fully achieved on death and is an auspicious one. The way one takes a bullet on his chest in the battlefield is known as a martyr, similarly one who leaves the body during auspicious meditation is known as *Samādhimarāṇa*.

Tattvārtha Sūtra mentions that death is also an obligation and it also should be auspicious.

Samādhimarāṇa (Sārīthārā / Sallekhanā)



Sallekhanā, sarīyāsa, samādhi, nirupādhi and viriyamarāṇa are all synonyms of *Sallekhanā*.

According to the religious texts, it is an eternal law that an entity, which is born, will also have to die. One can also die prematurely due to the activation of inauspicious karmas (*pāpa karma*).

One can earn auspicious or meritorious karmas by practicing religious austerities intelligently and die peacefully when one is faced with incurable diseases or old age that makes it clear that the end is approaching fast. If one does not practice religious austerities, then he/she earns inauspicious karmas. In this way death is inevitable in both situations and according to the philosophy of rebirth, he/she will enjoy the fruits accordingly in the next birth/s.

All living beings know that body and soul are different and distinct but from eternity the belief that body and soul are one has taken root. Since one is busy enjoying the subjects of five senses and four passions (anger, deceit, greed and pride) and hence could never understand the real nature of the soul/self. Until one understands the true nature of self i.e. intuition, knowledge and bliss; he will continue to be deluded in attachments and aversions with other living and non-living beings and hence keep on accumulating karmas resulting in the endless cycle of birth and death. Until one experiences the true nature of pure soul, he cannot eliminate the attachment and aversion with other living and non-living beings. By eliminating attachment and aversion, we will have neither enemies nor friends and a state of equanimity will develop. *Equanimity will result* in dissociation of accumulated karmas and further bondage will be stopped. But it is not easy to suppress or destroy desire. Until we acquire complete knowledge about the nature of self, we cannot understand this reality. By taking a vow not to indulge in sinful and ill activities along with repenting upon the wrong deeds done, and contemplating on the nature of the self; developing belief in it (nature of self) and practicing right conduct, one can stop influx and

When Dhyan Chand was Goalkeeper of the Women's Team

He has played friendly games with hockey legend Dhyan Chand and watched track greats Milkha Singh and Makhan Singh sweat it out at a camp at Mount Abu. As a young badminton player, Nagendra Kumar Jain was in close contact with many sporting greats.

“Dhyan Chand was the coach of the men’s team in mid-1950s at Mount Abu, but one day, he decided to be the goalkeeper of the ladies team. And we, badminton players and other youngsters, played against them,” said N.K. Jain, the Former Chief Justice of the Madras and Karnataka High Court, in a chat with The Hindu on the sidelines of the 41st National Masters Badminton Championship here on Friday.

Jain, from Rajasthan, was a good badminton player those days, and in 1955, he was the top seed at the Junior Nationals. Many of the legends of world badminton came down to Jaipur to play tournaments those days.

“We had Denmark’s Erland Kops (the seven-time All England champion) and Rudy Hartono (who broke Kops’ record and won the All England title eight times) playing in Jaipur in many invitation tournaments,” revealed Jain.

“I used to speak to them whenever they came down to Jaipur.

“I used to serve with my right hand and play with my left... that was a unique thing so everybody knew me. Though I was not number one, I was noticed and remembered by world-class players because of this.”

Love for badminton- That love for badminton brought him to the Rajiv Gandhi indoor stadium here to watch the Masters Nationals here.

Jain was recently appointed by the Rajasthan Sports Council to study how the Justice Lodha Committee’s recommendations could be implemented in the various State Sports Associations in Rajasthan.

“All the National and State Sports Associations all over the country should implement the Lodha Committee’s recommendations,” said the 74-year-old who is settled in Jaipur.

“There is money in cricket and officials can misuse things to oblige certain people. At the same time other games should not be ignore.”

Sports persons should be involved in running sports but players’ union should not be running sports federations, felt Jain who had once gone as an observer of the Indian team to the All England Championship.

“We can have one or two athletes in a sports association because players understand players better,” he said.
